- Introduced **700 local elementary school kids** to xc skiing through our School Program, a skiing field trip, where kids are educated on trail development and conservation with the help of Kaniksu Land Trust.
- Introduced **52 adults** to xc skiing through our Learn to Ski Day
- Hosted **45 kids** in our Youth Ski League an after school ski program which includes our Race Team more on that below!
- Built a community of 15 adult & youth ski coaches
- Provided **educational ski clinics** to **50 adults** via our Beginner Skate & Classic Clinic and our Intermediate / Advanced Skate clinic.
- Provided an opportunity to our members to set and reach their ski goals through our Distance Challenge
- Rented skis at sweet SNC rates to **400+ community members** a lower cost alternative to purchasing skis.
- Offered free opportunities including a weekly Headlamp Social Ski and a Full Moon Ski.

The Sandpoint Nordic Race Team season wrapped up in early March. Our racers showed strong this season and had races all over including Libby, WhiteFish, Sun Valley, McCall, Spokane and Minneapolis! Highlights are below for each racer.

Evan Brubaker: Evan took 3rd place at the Missoula Ice Badger Loppet for the U16 Boys 10K skate. He also took 2nd place at the Whitefish Carnival Classic 4K race. Another race highlight for Evan was his 3rd place finish in the Spokane Nordic Cup's classic and skate community race. Nice work, Evan!



Jett Longanecker: At the Skiesta 10k race at Seeley Lake, Jett took home 2nd place with a time of 28:28. He also finished 3rd in the 10k skate at the Nordic Dance Invitational in Lubrecht with a time of 31:55. Jett also placed 14th at the Mt. Spokane Nordic Cup XCX. Good job, Jett!

Isabella Waters: Izzy finished 1st in the U14 female 1.3k classic sprint qualifier in Jackson, WY which allowed her to advance to the final sprint heat in which she again finished 1st. She also competed in the Intermountain Youth Championships (IYC) in McCall, ID and finished 2nd in the Cross Country Cross race. You rock, Izzy!

Callahan Waters: Callahan did so well this season that he made it to Junior Nationals in Minneapolis, MN! His best day at JN's was the 5k classic mass start where he finished 12th out of 76 U16 boys with a time of 15.14. Congrats on a hugely successful season, Callahan!


