BITS AND PIECES

Team USA is the home team in tonight's game and will wear its white uniforms ... Dylan Larkin won 13-of-17 faceoffs yesterday against Denmark, while Andrew Copp won 7-of-10 draws. Overall, the U.S. won 33-of-63 faceoffs in the contest ... Connor Murphy led Team USA in ice time at 20:57 yesterday vs. Denmark ... The U.S. is the by far the youngest team in the tournament with an average age of 22.6. Next youngest is Canada and Russia (average age 25) ... Dale Tallon, a member of the U.S. Men's National Team Advisory Group, arrived in Cologne yesterday (May 7) and is here for the next week. Tallon is the general manager of the NHL's Florida Panthers ... Lou Vairo, director of special projects for USA Hockey, is here for tonight's game. Vairo's sister Kathy is nextdoor neighbors with Team USA defenseman Charlie McAvoy's family in Long Beach, N.Y. Vairo has coached more teams at various levels in international competition than any coach in U.S. history, including the '84 Olympic team ... Oddly, the U.S. is the home team in its first four games of the preliminary round and the visiting team the last three games ... The last concert Jack Eichel attended was Maroon 5 in Buffalo this past March ... Clayton Keller entered play today tied for the tournament lead in goals with three ... Andrew Copp is fourth in the world championship in faceoff percentage at .722, while Dylan Larkin is eighth (.636) and Nick Bjugstad 10th (.615).

TONIGHT'S GAME

The U.S. Men's National Team faces Sweden tonight (live on NHL Network in U.S.) in the third preliminary round game for both teams of the 2017 International Ice Hockey Federation Men's World Championship at LANXESS Arena in Cologne, Germany.

STARTING IN GOAL

Jimmy Howard is back in the net tonight for the U.S. Howard played the opening game of the tournament against Germany on Friday (May 5) and stopped 25-of-27 shots. Howard is making his second appearance in the IIHF Men's World Championship. In 2012, he went 5-2 with a 2.42 goals against average and .911 save percentage and was named one of Team USA's best three players of the tournament. Howard led the U.S. to a gold medal at the 2002 IIHF U18 Men's World Championship and a fourth place finish in the 2003 IIHF World Junior Championship.

· ALL-TIME vs. SWEDEN

The United States and Sweden meet for the 53rd time in World Championship history. Sweden leads the series by a 36-1-0-10-5 (W-OTW-OTL-L-T) count. The last time the two teams met was in the 2011 world championship where Sweden gained a 6-2 win in the preliminary round. Team USA's last win over the Swedes came on May 8, 2005, by a 5-1 count in the qualification round. The U.S. looks to end a four-game series losing streak against Sweden here tonight. A look at the all-time series between the two teams is later in these notes.

· KELLER HAT TRICK

Clayton Keller, the youngest player in the world championship, had a hat trick yesterday in helping the U.S. to a 7-2 win over Denmark. Keller was Team USA's top point getter (3-8--11) and second in the tournament as the U.S. won the gold medal in the 2017 IIHF World Junior Championship in Montreal and Toronto. Below is a look at the most recent hat tricks for U.S. players in the men's world championship.

Defenseman **Connor Murphy** is the captain of Team USA. Murphy is playing in the world championship for the fourth straight season. Forwards **Brock Nelson** (4th straight world championship) and **Dylan Larkin** (3rd straight world championship) are the team's alternate captains.

Thirteen players have experience playing in the IIHF Men's World Championship. The group includes five players that competed a year ago (JT Compher, Noah Hanifin, Dylan Larkin, Brock Nelson, Connor Murphy).

· TEAM USA COACHING STAFF

Jeff Blashill is serving as head coach of the U.S. Men's National Team for the first time. Blashill, who recently completed his second season as head coach of the Detroit Red Wings, previously served as goaltending coach for the 2009 U.S. National Junior Team, as well as an assistant coach for the 2009 U.S. Junior Select Team and 2006 U.S. Under-18 Select Team. Jack Capuano, Rand Pecknold and Seth Appert are serving as assistant coaches of the 2017 U.S. Men's National Team.

MANAGEMENT TEAM

The 2017 U.S. Men's National Team is under the direction of the U.S. Men's National Team Advisory Group, including NHL general managers **Stan Bowman** (Chicago), **David Poile** (Nashville), **Ray Shero** (New Jersey) and **Dale Tallon** (Florida). Also involved are **Dean Lombardi** (USA Hockey) and **Don Waddell**, president of Gale Force Sports & Entertainment. The group is led by **Jim Johannson**, USA Hockey's assistant executive director of hockey operations. **Chris Drury**, assistant general manager for the New York Rangers, and **Bill Guerin**, assistant general manager for the Pittsburgh Penguins, are also part of the management group for the 2017 U.S. Men's National Team.

JUNIOR CONNECTION

Nineteen members of the 2017 U.S. Men's National Team are alums of either the United States Hockey League or the North American Hockey League, the only Tier I and Tier II junior hockey leagues in the U.S., respectively.

USA HOCKEY'S NTDP ROOTS

Thirteen members of the 2017 U.S. Men's National Team were members of USA Hockey's National Team Development Program. The NTDP is an elite development program created by USA Hockey in 1996 currently housed in the Detroit suburb of Plymouth, Michigan.

BITS AND PIECES FROM PREVIOUS GAME NOTES

U.S. captain Connor Murphy and alternate captain Brock Nelson are playing in their fourth straight world championship. The last U.S. player to play in four straight world championships was Nashville Predators forward Craig Smith, who did so from 2011-14. Murphy is one of only nine players in U.S. history to play in four or more straight world championships. The others are Eric Weinrich (6 straight; 1997-2002); Darby Hendrickson (6 straight, 1996-2001); Adam Hall (5 straight; 2003-07); Steve Jensen (4 straight, 1975-78), Jack Johnson (4 straight, 2009-12), Mark Johnson (4 straight, 1978-82), and Buzz Schneider (4 straight, 1974-77) ... Forwards Anders Lee and Brock Nelson, both who play for the New York Islanders, are roommates here at the world championship. During the 2016-17 season, their lockers were next to each other with the Islanders and here at the world championship their lockers are also side-by-side ... Bernie Haake is Team USA's host for the world championship. His interaction with USA Hockey dates back to 1982 when he was the U.S. host for a exhibition game between Germany and the U.S. Haake, the head men's ice hockey coach of the Lithuanian national team, was also Team USA's host for the 2010 IIHF Men's World Championship here in Cologne ... The U.S. played Italy in an exhibition game on Tuesday (May 2) in Milan and skated to a 5-2 victory. Thirteen different players contributed points.

THEY'VE PLAYED THE MOST

Eric Weinrich has played in nine IIHF Men's World Championships, the most of any U.S. player in history. Mark Johnson, from the famous "Miracle on Ice" team and the current women's ice hockey coach at the University of Wisconsin, is second with eight appearances. Tim Thomas has played in seven men's world championships, while Derek Plante, Darby Hendrickson, Phil Housley, and Joe Sacco have all played in six.
