• TODAY'S GAME

The U.S. Men's National Team faces Italy tonight (live on NBCSN in U.S.) in its fourth preliminary round game of the 2017 International Ice Hockey Federation Men's World Championship at LANXESS Arena in Cologne, Germany.

• STARTING IN GOAL

Jimmy Howard is the likely starter in goal today vs. Italy. He made 39 saves in a 4-3 win over Sweden on Monday night. Howard also played in Team USA's opening game of the tournament against Germany on Friday (May 5) and stopped 25-of-27 shots. Howard is making his second appearance in the IIHF Men's World Championship. In 2012, he went 5-2 with a 2.42 goals against average and .911 save percentage and was named one of Team USA's best three players of the tournament. Howard led the U.S. to a gold medal at the 2002 IIHF U18 Men's World Championship and a fourth place finish in the 2003 IIHF World Junior Championship.

• ALL-TIME vs. ITALY

The United States and Italy meet for just the 8th time in the world championship here today. The last meeting between the two teams was in Cologne in 2010 in the relegation round with the U.S. claiming a 3-2 shootout victory. **T.J. Oshie** scored twice in the shootout, including the decisive goal in the seventh round (see boxscore below). The two teams met just more than a week ago in an exhibition game in Milan with Team USA earning a 5-2 victory (see boxscore later in these game notes).

BITS AND PIECES

Team USA is the home team in today's game and will wear its blue uniforms ... **Clayton Keller** has four goals in three games to lead the U.S. He enters play today second in the tournament in goals ... **Johnny Gaudreau** got his nickname from the Boston College student section which chanted Johnny Hockey when he scored goals. Gaudreau is tied for second on Team USA in points with 3-1--4 through three games and is tied for second in shots on goal with 15 ... **Dylan Larkin**, who has 0-5--5 through three games, is the only U.S. player with at least one point in all three games in the world championship to date. Larkin has assisted on the game-winning goal in both of Team USA's wins ... **Jack Eichel** has 18 shots on goal, the most of any player on the U.S. roster ... **Nick Schmaltz**, who was knocked out of Monday's game vs. Sweden less than a minute into the game on a blindside hit by Sweden's Gabriel Landeskog, is day-to-day and will not play this afternoon ... **Bob Webster** is in his fifth decade of service to U.S. national teams. This year marks his 13th straight as team leader for the U.S. Men's National Team. Webster has also served as Team USA's equipment manager for 15 previous world championships (1979, 82, 86, 87, 89-96, 2002-04) ... The players and training staff enjoyed dinner together last night at a local steakhouse, followed by a team meeting ... Many guests of Team USA players and staff arrived today and will be here for the duration of the championship.

Italy's goal at 14:00 of the second period ended a stretch of 156:02 in which the U.S. did not yield a goal in the World Championship. Scott Clemmensen, Dubinsky and Matt Greene were named Team USA's three best players of the tournament.

• KELLER HAT TRICK

Clayton Keller, the youngest player in the world championship, had a hat trick in helping the U.S. to a 7-2 win over Denmark on Sunday (May 7). Keller was Team USA's top point getter (3-8--11) and second in the tournament as the U.S. won the gold medal in the 2017 IIHF World Junior Championship in Montreal and Toronto. Below is a look at the most recent hat tricks for U.S. players in the men's world championship.

• MANAGEMENT TEAM

The 2017 U.S. Men's National Team is under the direction of the U.S. Men's National Team Advisory Group, including NHL general managers **Stan Bowman** (Chicago), **David Poile** (Nashville), **Ray Shero** (New Jersey) and **Dale Tallon** (Florida). Also involved are **Dean Lombardi** (USA Hockey) and **Don Waddell**, president of Gale Force Sports & Entertainment. The group is led by **Jim Johannson**, USA Hockey's assistant executive director of hockey operations. **Chris Drury**, assistant general manager for the New York Rangers, and **Bill Guerin**, assistant general manager for the Pittsburgh Penguins, are also part of the management group for the 2017 U.S. Men's National Team.

• JUNIOR CONNECTION

Nineteen members of the 2017 U.S. Men's National Team are alums of either the United States Hockey League or the North American Hockey League, the only Tier I and Tier II junior hockey leagues in the U.S., respectively.

• USA HOCKEY'S NTDP ROOTS

Thirteen members of the 2017 U.S. Men's National Team were members of USA Hockey's National Team Development Program. The NTDP is an elite development program created by USA Hockey in 1996 currently housed in the Detroit suburb of Plymouth, Michigan.

• THEY'VE PLAYED THE MOST

Eric Weinrich has played in nine IIHF Men's World Championships, the most of any U.S. player in history. **Mark Johnson**, from the famous "Miracle on Ice" team and the current women's ice hockey coach at the University of Wisconsin, is second with eight appearances. **Tim Thomas** has played in seven men's world championships, while **Derek Plante**, **Darby Hendrickson**, **Phil Housley**, and **Joe Sacco** have all played in six.

• BITS AND PIECES FROM PREVIOUS GAME NOTES

Oddly, the U.S. is the home team in its first four games of the preliminary round and the visiting team the last three games ... The last concert **Jack Eichel** attended was Maroon 5 in Buffalo this past March ... U.S. captain **Connor Murphy** and alternate captain **Brock Nelson** are playing in their fourth straight world championship. The last U.S. player to play in four straight world championships was Nashville Predators forward **Craig Smith**, who did so from 2011-14. Murphy and Nelson are among nine players in U.S. history to play in four or more straight world championships. The others are **Eric Weinrich** (6 straight; 1997-2002); **Darby Hendrickson** (6 straight, 1996-2001); **Adam Hall** (5 straight; 2003-07); **Steve Jensen** (4 straight, 1975-78), **Jack Johnson** (4 straight, 2009-12), **Mark Johnson** (4 straight, 1978-82), and **Buzz Schneider** (4 straight, 1974-77) ... Forwards **Anders Lee** and **Brock Nelson**, both who play for the New York Islanders, are roommates here at the world championship. During the 2016-17 season, their lockers were next to each other with the Islanders and here at the world championship their lockers are also side-by-side ... **Bernie Haake** is Team USA's host for the world championship. His interaction with USA Hockey dates back to 1982 when he was the U.S. host for a exhibition game between Germany and the U.S. Haake, the head men's ice hockey coach of the Lithuanian national team, was also Team USA's host for the 2010 IIHF Men's World Championship here in Cologne ... The U.S. is the by far the youngest team in the tournament with an average age of 22.6. Next youngest is Canada and Russia (average age 25).

• WOMEN'S NATIONAL TEAM ANNOUNCED

USA Hockey unveiled the 23 players that will makeup the 2017-18 U.S. Women's National Team last Friday (May 5). The team will live and train together in the Tampa, Florida, area beginning in September for the five-month period in advance of the 2018 Olympic Winter Games. Florida Hospital Ice Center in the Tampa suburb of Wesley Chapel is the host rink for Team USA.

Record Success For USA in 2016-17 in IIHF World Championship Play

In 2016-17, the U.S. has become the first country to win gold at the first four top-level IIHF World Championships. In January, the U.S. National Junior Team won gold at the 2017 IIHF World Junior Championship with a thrilling 5-4 shootout victory over Canada in Montreal. Just over a week later, the U.S. Women's National Under-18 Team scored a late go-ahead goal to earn a 3-1 victory over Canada in the gold-medal game at the IIHF Under-18 Women's World Championship. Last month, the U.S. Women's National Team became the first to win a gold medal on home ice with a 3-2 overtime win over Canada in the IIHF Women's World Championship gold-medal game at USA Hockey Arena in Plymouth, Michigan. Later in April, the U.S. Men's National Under-18 Team went a perfect 7-0 en route to its record 10th gold medal at the IIHF Under-18 Men's World Championship.

2016 Men's World Championship A Look Back

The 2016 U.S. Men's National Team finished fourth among 16 teams at the IIHF Men's World Championship in Moscow and St. Petersburg, Russia. Team USA (3-1-1-5, W-OTW-OTL-L) fell to Russia, 7-2, in the bronze-medal game. The U.S. has finished in the top four of the world championship in three of the last four years, a stretch that has only been equaled once in American history (1931-34). **Dylan Larkin** and **Auston Matthews** led all U.S. skaters with nine points.

Lou Vairo, who was the head coach of the 1984 U.S. Olympic Hockey Team and coached professional hockey in Milan, dropped the ceremonial puck prior to the game.
