AMENDMENTS TO THE 2010 HANDBOOK

1. Hazing Policy Added

The MMAYHA Association currently defines hazing as "an initiation practice that may humiliate, degrade, demean, or disgrace a person regardless of location or consent of the participant(s)".

A player, team official, executive member, team, association, or any other MMAYHA participant found, by an investigation process, to have condoned, initiated or, to the detriment of another, participated in hazing actions or behaviors shall be subject to discipline up to and including expulsion from MMAYHA registered programs.

Discipline must relate to the degree of severity of the incident(s).

- a) Any party failing to cooperate with the fact finding process with the Rules and Regulations Director may be subject to suspension as determined by the Review Board.
- b) All discipline decisions related to hazing must be approved by the Review board in consultation with the Association Board.

2. Locker room Policy Added

Locker rooms are provided for the use of athletes and other activity groups and individuals authorized by the MMAYHA Association. No one will be permitted to enter the locker room or remain in the locker room to interview or seek information from an individual in the locker room at any time. Such interviews may take place outside of the locker room.

No cameras, video recorders, cell phones, or other devices that can be used to record or transfer images may be used in the locker rooms at any time.

Under no circumstances can a person use a camera, video recorder, cell phone, or other recording device to capture, record, or transfer a representation of a nude or partially nude person in the locker room. Anyone who violates this policy shall be subject to MMAYHA Association disciplinary action and/or penalties under state law or local ordinance. The Coach or designated locker room supervisor, as applicable, shall be responsible for enforcing this policy.

Male and female athletes are not permitted to dress or undress in the same locker room from Pee-Wee age teams through High School age teams

Spouses, parents of a player, or significant others are not permitted to hold positions on the Association Board at the same time.

Reason for changes:

- 5. Change D. Game and Practice Ice time page 7
 - reasonably equal ice time in every regular season game

 excluding their State Tournament, provided effort, attitude, and attendance of the player at practice is satisfactory. Every coach shall have sole discretion with regard to the use of players in penalty killing and power play situations, during which the reasonably equal ice time rule shall not apply. During State tournaments, each player must obtain some ice time in each game, the amount of which is at the discretion of the coaches, based upon the circumstances at the time. Exceptions to these playing time requirements may be made by the coach for disciplinary reasons.

The Head Coach will have to notify the player's parents and the Athletic Director of that team three days prior to a game that the player is anticipated not going to play or not seeing reasonably equal ice time.

- All teams (Mites through High School) shall have a minimum of two
 (2) hours of on-ice practice time per week. Games are to be held as
 set up by the Scheduler following Association guidelines. The
 Association will fund entry fees for a maximum of one away
 tournament for each level team. (This can be a State Tournament).
- 3. Players are to practice with their respective age players unless a double roster or move up request has been granted.

Reason for changes:

- Parents are paying an equal amount throughout the hockey season to go to tournaments, (not
 including a State Tournament), and some players are not playing at all throughout an entire game.
 These parents are spending money on Tournament fees, hotels, and travel to sit and watch their
 child sit the bench.
- If the Head Coach is required to notify the parent due to attitude...... Etc. that their child will not see the ice, it gives the parents the opportunity not to travel and incur costs just to see their child sit the bench. Also there is a record to that specific Athletic Director that everyone was notified in a timely fashion.

 - o Kohlman Cup had 1 team/region; Region 4 won
 - o Number of girls teams was down for state tournaments in 2017
 - o Girls only TRY HOCKEY in Onalaska had 160 participants. Presentation at annual meeting. Every participant received a free jersey and stick. Had an informational meeting for parents while the girls were on the ice. Participants who registered received loaner gear for the 1st season at no charge. WAHA Age Classification Proposal – March 15th, 2017

In Wisconsin, we live in a community based sports culture (hockey included). The core of community based sports is growing up playing alongside peers whom you go to school with. This culminates in high school athletics when you play for a high school team in front of your community. There are alternatives to this in the sport of hockey (ex. AAA and juniors), but the core is still a community based model.

Currently, WAHA follows USA Hockey's age classifications (by birth year). An alternative age classification system would be by school age or grade. For example, Minnesota Hockey uses a July 1st to June 30th (6 months older than USAH) 12 month window to classify their teams. The reason for July 1st instead of a later "school age" date (ex. September 1st) is to accommodate kids who enter Kindergarten later. Keep in mind that MN's system allows for kids to "play up" when they enter K "on time" and have a July/August birthday (similar to our current "play up" procedures). In recent years MN Hockey has dealt with proposals to change from the July 1st deadline to a June 1st deadline to accommodate even more kids who enter Kindergarten later (email attachment). They did not adopt it, but it's worthy to note that they considered going 7 months older than the USAH age classification system instead of just 6 months older.

There are some concerning inconsistencies between the High School/WIAA Hockey system and the USA/WAHA hockey system. A few examples are age classifications, number of games played, season length, practice/game ratio, number of division levels, and number of state tournaments available. A logical step towards bridging the gap would be an adoption of the MN Hockey age classification system (July 1st to June 30th) by WAHA.

Vice-Presidents:
