USA HOCKEY COACH SELECTION PROCEDURES 2018 PARALYMPIC WINTER GAMES PARA ICE HOCKEY 7/6/2017

These procedures provide for selection of USA Hockey Coach(es) for the 2018 Paralympic Winter Games. However, accreditation allocation is not guaranteed and the number of Coach Positions will be based on final USOC credential allocation and overall team size.

1. What are USA Hockey's criteria for Coach Positions (attach a job description, if any)?

Coaches must:

- 1.1. Successfully pass the National Center for Safety Initiatives' (NCSI) background screen in accordance with the current USOC Games Background Check Policy prior to nomination.
 - 1.1.1. Should a nominee experience any event between the time the background check is conducted and the relevant Games that may change his/her background check status, the nominee must inform the NGB/PSO/HPMO and/or USOC.
- 1.2. Possess a valid passport that does not expire until at least six months after the conclusion of the Games.
- 1.3. Be available for entire duration of the Games.
- 1.4. Be in good health and able to withstand the physical rigors of traveling with and working with the Team.
- 1.5. High level, specific technical and tactical knowledge of the sport.
- 1.6. Thorough knowledge and understanding of the IPC rules and regulations.
- 1.7. Previous experience and proven ability coaching teams at the highest level in USA Hockey and professional, college or junior hockey head coaching experience.
- 1.8. Proven ability to establish harmonious relationships with athletes and other personnel.
- 2. Describe the process that candidates should follow to express interest in being considered for a Coach position:

USA Hockey will not publicize or post the Head Coach or Assistant Coaches positions and will not undergo an application process as there are already individuals, based on the criteria described in Section 1, who meet the criteria and who have been identified for these positions.

3. Describe the intended method of identifying the pool and selecting the candidates to be considered for Coach position(s):

Candidates have been identified through their past role as National Team staff at international competitions that USA Hockey has attended along with current performance in various leagues.

4. Describe the removal of a Coach:

An individual who is to be nominated as a Coach by USA Hockey may be removed as a nominee for any of the following reasons, as determined by USA Hockey:

- 4.1. Voluntary withdrawal. Coach nominee must submit a written letter to USA Hockey's Executive Director/CEO/President.
- 4.2. Injury or illness as certified by a physician (or medical staff) approved by USA Hockey. If the individual refuses verification of his/her illness or injury by a physician (or medical staff) approved by USA Hockey, his/her injury will be assumed to be disabling and he/she may be removed.
- 4.3. Inability to perform the duties required.
- 4.4. Violation of USA Hockey's Code of Conduct (Attachment A)

Once a Coach nomination is accepted by the USOC, the USOC has jurisdiction over the Coach, at which time, in addition to any applicable USA Hockey's Code of Conduct, the USOC's Code of Conduct and Grievance Procedures apply. 5. Describe the replacement of a Coach:

In the event that a Nominated Coach is unable to perform the duties of Coach due to injury, illness, Code of Conduct violation or any other unforeseen circumstances that would result in the need to replace him/her, the replacement candidate must meet all of the criteria listed in #1 above and, if applicable, come from the pool of candidates described in #3 above.

6. Which group/committee will make the final approval for the Coaches?

7. Conflict of Interest:

Any individual who is being considered for a Coach position or has any other conflict of interest and is involved in the selection process must disclose this information, recuse him or herself and not influence others regarding the discussions, meetings or decisions involving selection of the Coach.

8. Date of Nomination:

The Games Staff Nomination Form with the nominated Coach's name, including the name of a replacement (if applicable), will be submitted to the USOC on or before: July 18, 2017

The Games Staff Nomination Form with the nominated Assistant Coach(es) name(s), including names of any replacements (if applicable), will be submitted to the USOC on or before: July 18, 2017

9. Publicity/Distribution of Procedures:

The USOC approved selection procedures (complete and unaltered) will be posted/published by USA Hockey in the following locations:

These procedures will be posted as soon as possible, but not more than five days following notice of approval by the USOC.



Attachment A

Code of Conduct

COACH PLEDGE

I pledge to uphold the spirit of the USA Hockey Code of Conduct (the "Code"), which offers a guide to my conduct as a staff member of the USA National Team (the "Team"). I acknowledge that I have a right to a hearing if my opportunity to compete is denied or if I am charged with a violation of this Code.

I have familiarized myself with the Code and understand that acceptance of its provisions is a condition of my selection to the Team.

As a Staff Member of the Team, I hereby promise and agree that I:

- will abide by all published rules related to the Team selection procedures as approved by USA Hockey;
- have acted and will act in a sportsmanlike manner consistent with the spirit of fair play and responsible conduct;
- will not engage in any conduct that is criminal under any laws applicable to me, including, but not limited to laws governing the possession and use of drugs and alcohol and providing of drugs to any person and of alcohol to minors;
- will not participate or assist in any gambling or betting activities associated with any event related to my sport or my participation;
- am eligible to coach under the rules of IIHF;
- should I be chosen for an international team that requires a passport, I am in possession of a valid USA passport, that will not expire prior to six months following the conclusion of the international competition;
- will refrain from conduct detracting from my ability or that of the team to attain peak performance;
- will respect the property of others whether personal or public;
- will respect members of my Team, other teams, spectators and officials, and engage in no form of discriminatory behavior or verbal, physical or sexual harassment or abuse;

- will follow my Team's written rules, including by way of example, written rules regarding curfew, required attendance at team meetings and prohibitions on the release of confidential team information;
- am aware that USA Hockey sponsors, suppliers and licensees provide critical support for the Team and, in recognition of this fact, I will wear designated USA Hockey apparel at all official Team functions and events;
- will abide by the rules of the IIHF concerning allowable trademark identification on clothing and equipment worn or used in competition or on visible body tattoos.
- agree to be filmed and photographed by the official photographer(s) and network(s) of USA Hockey under conditions authorized by USA Hockey and give event organizers and USA Hockey the right to use my name, picture, likeness, and biographical information before, during and after the period of my participation in these activities to promote the activity in which I participate or to promote the success of the team on which I compete; in no event may USA Hockey or the event organizers use or authorize the use of my name, picture, likeness, voice and biographical information for the purpose of trade, including any use in a manner that would imply an endorsement of any company, product, or service, without my written permission;
- will not use or authorize the use of photographs, films or videos of myself in my USA Hockey apparel or equipment or the use of the USA Hockey logo for the purpose of trade, without the prior written consent of USA Hockey;
- understand that if I require legal representation because of I am accused of criminal misconduct, or if for any other reasons I require the services of an attorney, I will be personally responsible for payment of such legal fees and expenses;
- will act in a way that will bring respect and honor to myself, my team, USA Hockey and the United States; and
- will remember that at all times I am an ambassador for my sport, my country and the Olympic Movement.
