## Homecoming for Alums Is Nostalgia, Reminiscing of the "Good Old Days"

John McCallum, sports journalist, historian, raconteur, wit, and PLU sports buff, infatuated with the exploits of his boyhood Parkland heroes, has put on the shelf such works as "A Tiger Wore Spikes", the award winning biography of baseball immortal Ty Cobb, and "College Football, U.S.A.", the official publication of the Football Hall of Fame, to chronicle "The Gladiators".

The ebullient wordsmith is the feature speaker at tonight's Alumni Banquet scheduled in Chris Knutzen at 6:30 p.m. Don't miss it, please!

McCallum will dazzle you with his rhetoric and his power of recollection. He talks to fire hydrants (structural look-a-likes) and anyone who will bend an ear about the Golden Era of PLU football (which he experienced first-hand) and, lest the 1938-41 period seems like ancient history, he effusively articulates the saga of the PLU crew, a modern narrative.

Homecoming for alums is nostalgia, an opportunity to rub shoulders with old friends and reminisce about the good old days. McCallum will establish the mood.

The book, "The Gladiators", is alive with history and anecdotes although its namesake, the pugnacious, helmeted Roman, who brightened the school colors during the PLC era, was sacked in 1960 in favor of a Knight (the only time you'll see that word printed in this corner).

What role Whitman has played in the Luteville saga may be hidden in the agate type of John's statistical section, since the rivalry goes back no further in football than 1966.

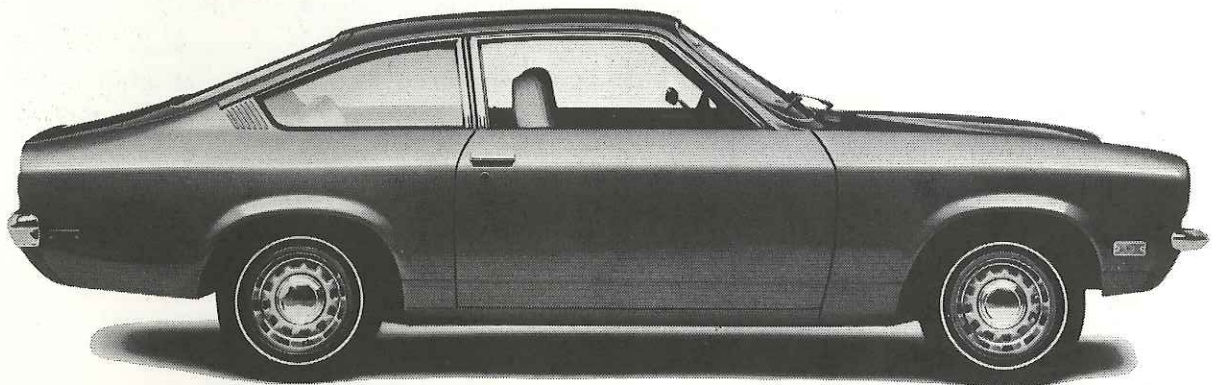
Strange things seem to happen when PLU and the Missionaries collide. The Lutes, who lead in this series, 4-2, were on top by a comfortable 23-10 margin midway through the 1969 game, only to have Whitman score five touchdowns in the next fifteen minutes to run away with a 45-23 verdict!

The Lutes had a chance to break Whitman's momentum, but halfback Hans Lindstrom got lost in the fog (honest!) and threw the ball on the ground at the four yard line during an apparent unmolested 40 touchdown scamper.

Last years' contest was rather routine also, a 50-42 Lutecrous win, with the record book coming unstapled throughout the game. Unconfirmed reports had both defensive units calling signals in absentia.

Whitman — 1972, is in a rebuilding year and finds itself 0-2 coming into today's game. Coach Roy Thompson's eleven dropped a 27-14 tilt to Linfield last Saturday. The Lutes, 2-1 overall, rest along side the Missionaries in the loop basement with an 0-1 mark.

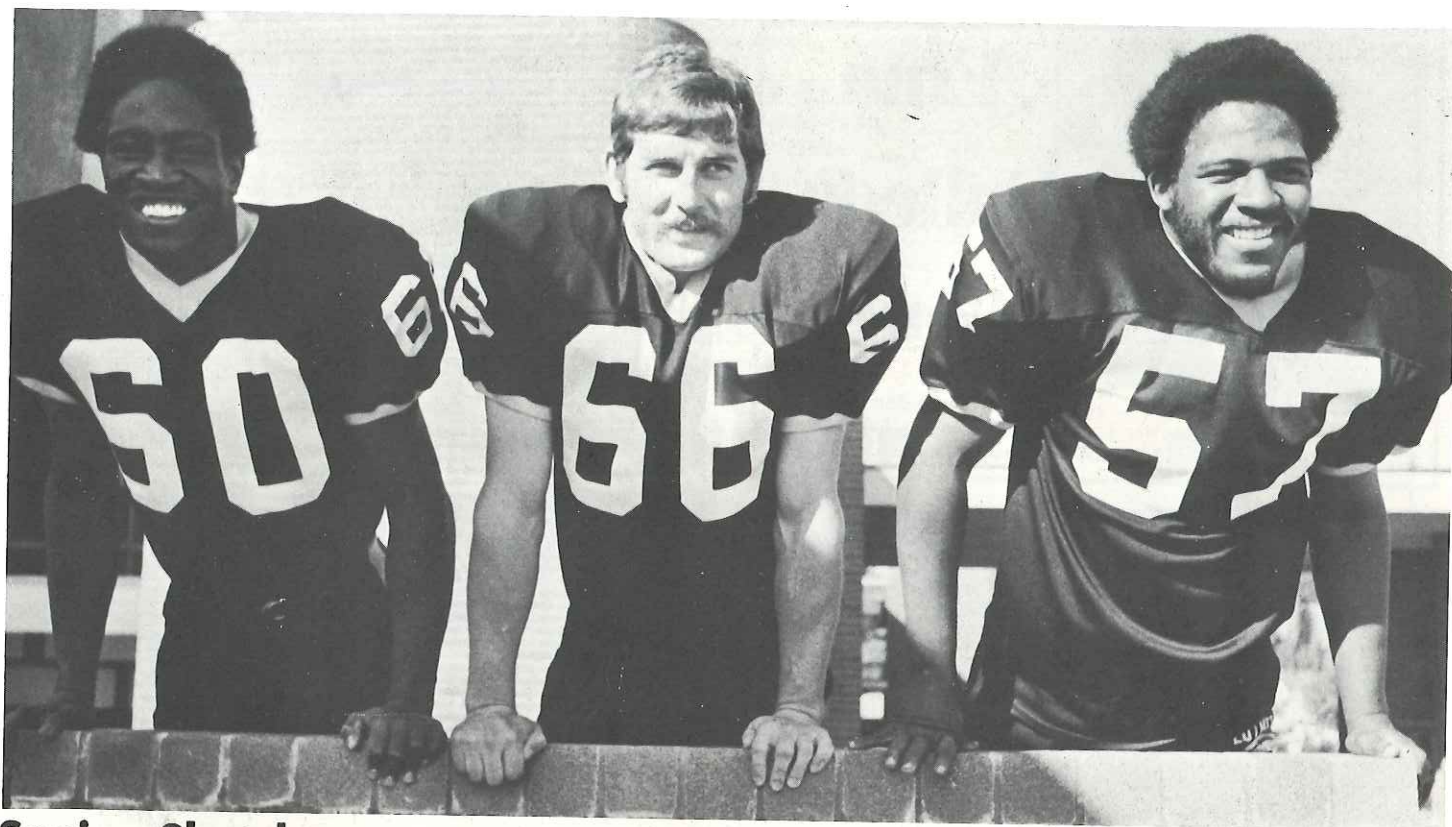

## Senior Sketches . . . BRICK WALL LINEBACKERS: Evans, Brehmer, and Davis

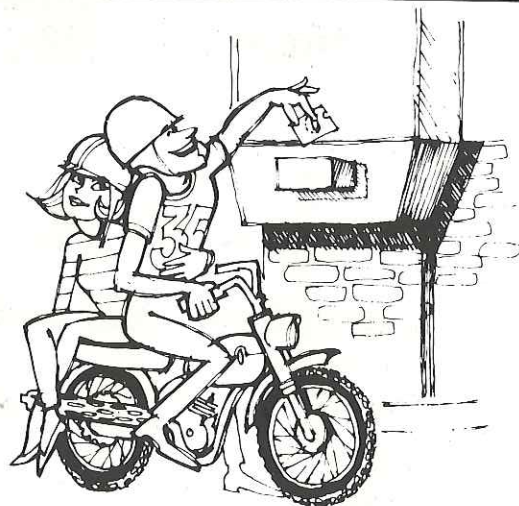

Pictured here is the veteran Lute linebacker crew, Charlie Evans, Jim Brehmer, and Glenn Davis.

Charlie Evans is a 6'-2" 195 lb. product of Chicago. He transferred to PLU in 1970 from the U of W after seeing Pac-8 action for the Huskies. After playing middle-linebacker much of last season, Charlie is back at his more familiar post as outside-linebacker. Quick as a cat and very smart, Charlie was an honorable mention pick on the NAIA District I all-star team last fall. Charlie's game is strengthened by his good mental attitude and overall approach to the game. He is a business administration major.

Jim Brehmer, considered the Lutes' quickest linebacker last year, was injured late last season and underwent knee surgery. Somewhat of a question mark as this season began, Brehmer has come back with a well-healed limb and an enthusiastic attitude to contribute much to the defensive effort. This 6'-2" 195 pounder from Port Orchard came to PLU from Olympic C.C. and is not only a fine linebacker but has handled the Lute place-kicking chores since he arrived. Last season he was 10 for 12 on points after touchdown, with four field goals. Jim almost single-handedly outscored Cal Lutheran as he hit 4 for 4 PAT kicks and connected on a 32-yard field goal effort. Brehmer is a pre-law student.

Glenn Davis holds down the key middle-linebacking spot for the Lutes' defensive wrecking crew. The 6'-2", 205 lb. Davis is originally from Chicago, but arrived in Luteville after a distinguished football career at Columba Basin College. Glenn is the acknowledged leader, most consistent PLU linebacker and also calls the defensive signals. Davis' presence has definitely been known and felt by opposing teams and ball-carriers, as he was chosen to the Little All-Northwest first team in the 1971 football season. Glenn is a member of the Lute wrestling squad in the winter and is graduating in business administration.

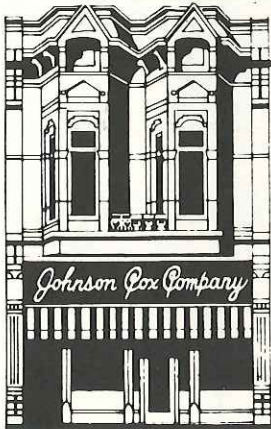

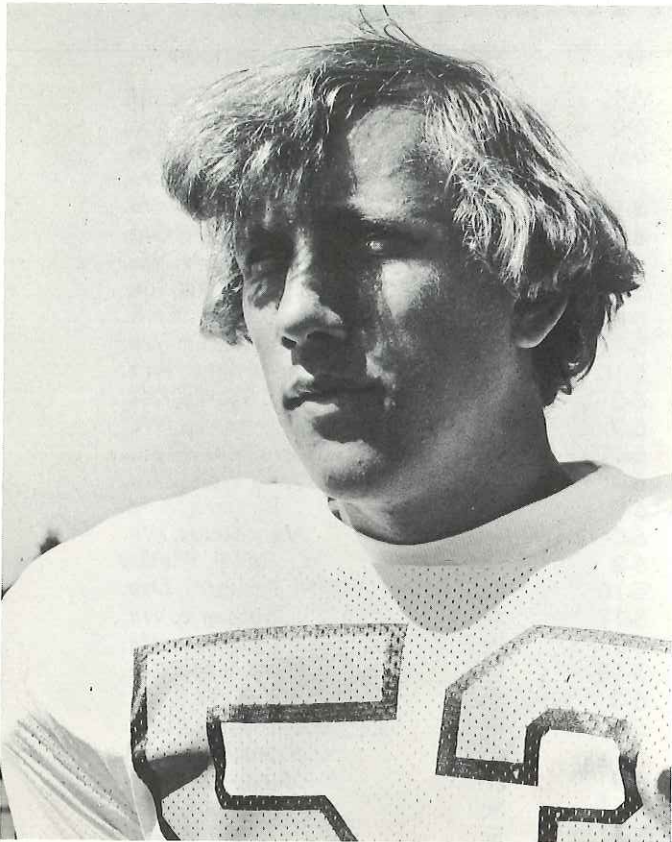

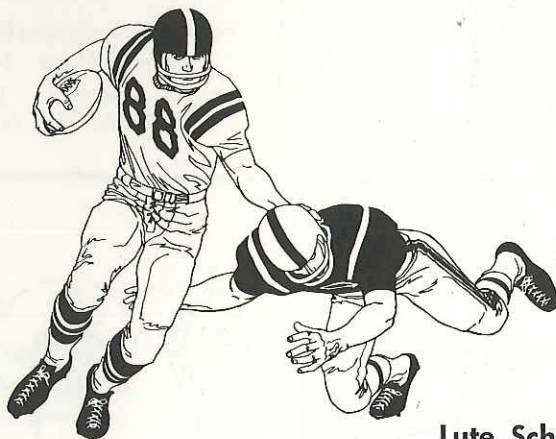
