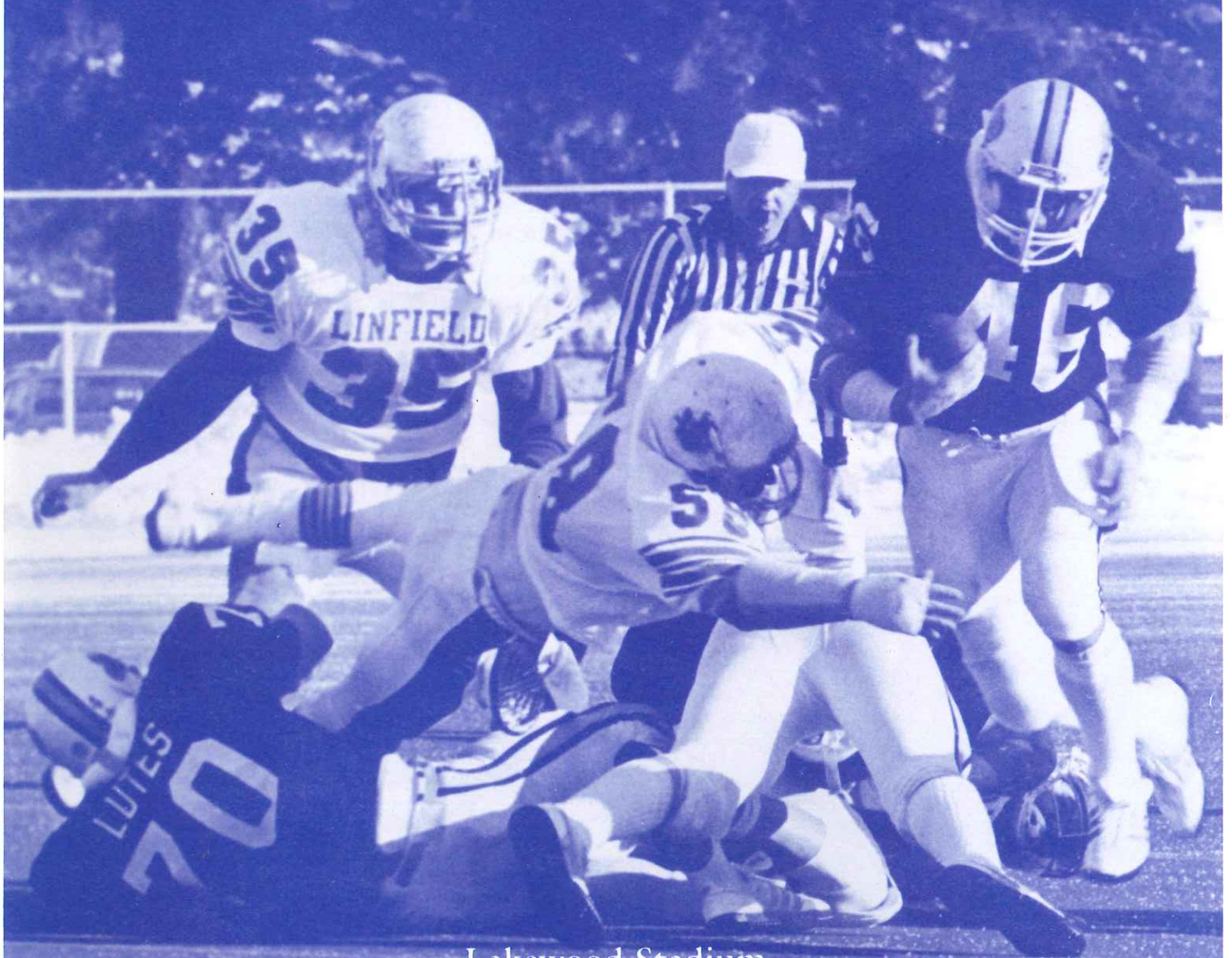

NAIAC provides coaches in all sports with a strong voice in establishing rules and standards in each sport. The All-America Awards program is the responsibility of the Awards Committee, which is represented by the officers of the NAIAC.



**Dr. Wayne Dannehl**, Director of Athletics at the University of Wisconsin-Parkside, Kenosha, is representing the NAIA National Executive Committee for the Division II football championship series.

Dannehl is serving as fourth vice-president of the NAIA for the 1985-86 academic year.

All NAIA championship meets, games and tournaments are under the direct supervision and control of the NAIA National Executive Committee.

The 10-person National Executive Committee is the governing body elected by the membership of the NAIA at the Annual Meeting of the organization. The National Committee hires the Executive Director, who conducts the business of the organization from national headquarters in Kansas City, Missouri.

The National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) is a completely autonomous association, currently administering programs of intercollegiate athletics to over 500 fully-accredited colleges and universities of moderate enrollment. The fundamental tenet of the NAIA is that intercollegiate athletics is an integral part of the total educational program of the institution. This belief is strongly reflected in the governing documents, activities and organizational structure of the Association.

### HISTORY AND PURPOSE

Established in 1940 as the National Association of Intercollegiate Basketball (NAIB), the NAIA emanated from a "National Small College Basketball Tournament" inaugurated in 1937 in Kansas City, Missouri. The conversion of the NAIB to the NAIA came in 1952 when the organization expanded beyond basketball and added national championship events in golf, outdoor track and field and tennis. Football, cross country, baseball and swimming were added to the championship event calendar in 1956, and wrestling (1958), soccer (1959), bowling (1962-78), gymnastics (1964), indoor track and field (1966), ice hockey (1968-84) and volleyball (1969- 80) were later additions.

Of major significance to the NAIA, was the establishment of the women's division within the Association on August 1, 1980. The NAIA decision to offer competitive opportunities and championships in women's athletics was passed by the membership following two years of study and proposals by an ad hoc committee on the implementation of a women's division in the NAIA. Currently, the Association conducts ten championship event programs for women in the sports of basketball, cross country, gymnastics, indoor track and field, outdoor track and field, softball (fast pitch), soccer, swimming, tennis and volleyball.

The initial purpose of the NAIA — to provide national championship athletic opportunities to institutions below the so-called "major" level — has indeed been well served. The Association clearly outlines its own responsibilities and those of its members: a sound athletics program, administered and controlled by those responsible for the administration of the institution. This means direct supervision in caliber of competition, financing of the program and taking steps to assure that financial assistance is made available only through the institution and under the same general policies as aid to all students. In short, the basic premise is that the athletics program is a basic component of the overall educational process and not an entity apart.

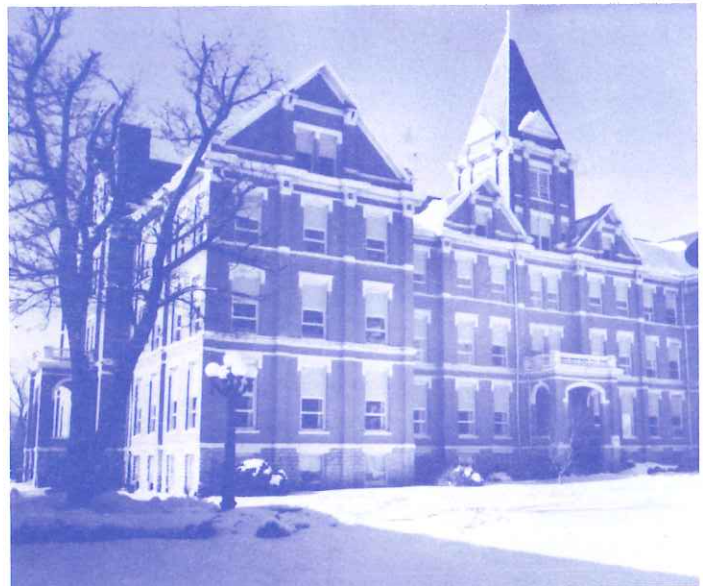

# FINDLAY COLLEGE



**KENNETH E. ZIRKLE**  
*PRESIDENT*

Dr. Kenneth E. Zirkle believes that one of the best ways to prepare for the "real world" is participation in intercollegiate athletics. He cites the hard work, careful and comprehensive planning, mental and physical conditioning, self-discipline and teamwork demanded by an athletic program as important factors in total individual development.

Prior to coming to Findlay College, President Zirkle was vice president for student affairs at the State University of New York (SUNY) College at Cortland, New York. He was responsible for administering student services and was on the president's cabinet. While at Cortland he was president of the Council of Chief Student Affairs Administrators of SUNY and of the SUNY Student Life Committee.

He has a doctorate in counselor education and college student personnel from The Pennsylvania State University, a master's degree in counselor education from Rutgers University and a bachelor's degree from Edinboro State College. He has also done graduate work in educational administration at Syracuse University.



**JAMES D. HOUESHELL**  
*ATHLETIC DIRECTOR*

Dr. James D. Houdeshell has been Athletic Director at Findlay for 30 years. He has also served as baseball, basketball, and football coach while at the College, recording a 24-17-2 record on the gridiron from 1955-59.

In 1984, Coach Houdeshell led the Oiler basketball team to a tie for the Hoosier-Buckeye league championship. He ended his 30-year tenure as head basketball coach with a 430-312 record and a .581 winning percentage. He had teams in the NAIA finals three times, including 1971-72 when the Oilers defeated arch rivals Defiance College in the District 22 playoffs.

In 1975 Dr. Houdeshell was inducted into the Findlay College Hall of Fame, which honors outstanding coaches and athletes from Findlay College. The Findlay College graduate has also been named HBCC Coach of the Year, Mid-Ohio Conference Coach of the Year, as well as NAIA District 22 Coach of the Year. Houdeshell was a letter-winner in football, basketball, and baseball while attending Findlay.

Dr. Houdeshell, who is currently chairperson of the Division of Teacher Education, earned his master of education degree from Bowling Green State University and his doctor of physical education from Indiana University in 1968.

Last year Dr. Houdeshell began a three-year term on the NAIA Executive Committee. He was chairman of NAIA District 22 for many years, and in 1981 was inducted into the NAIA Coaches Hall of Fame in recognition of his 25 years as basketball coach at Findlay as well as for his service to the NAIA District 22.



**RICHARD M. STRAHM**  
*HEAD COACH*

Richard M. Strahm, a native of Toledo and former high school grid mentor, has been head football coach at Findlay since 1975.

Coach Strahm graduated from Toledo Libbey High School in 1953 and from the University of Toledo in 1957 with a bachelor's degree in education. He received his master's degree in 1966 from Toledo in the area of education.

Strahm spent two years as assistant football coach at Libbey High School. Following a year in the Air Force, he became head football coach at Lakota. Several league championships were won there, and at Bryan and Warren Western Reserve as Strahm compiled a 70-19-1 career high school record. Next came the position of defensive coordinator at the University of Toledo where the Rockets compiled a 35-0 mark and the number one national rating for defense twice in the three years that Strahm coached. Strahm then moved to Kansas State University of the Big Eight Conference where he was defensive backfield coach.

Since coming to Findlay, Strahm has led the Oilers to Hoosier-Buckeye titles in seven of the past nine years. After an initial 2-8 season, the team posted a 6-3 mark in 1976, followed by a 6-2 record in 1977, 11-1 in 1978, 10-1-1 in 1979, 5-4 in 1980, and 8-1 in 1981, 82, 83. The '83 team played in the national quarter-finals as did last year's squad. The 1978 team was NAIA Division II runner-up, while the 1979 Oilers won the National Championship. In 1979 Strahm was voted "Coach of the Year" in the HBCC, District 22, and NAIA Division II. Coach Strahm's record at Findlay stands at 80-26-2.

Coach Strahm is also an instructor in the Division of Teacher Education at the College as well as a member of the Office of Institutional Advancement.

Dick and his wife Ginger have three children: Douglas and Gina, students at Findlay, and ten-year-old Steve.
