Talking Points

USA VS CZECH REPUBLIC HISTORY

The U.S. and the Czech Republic have met eight previous times at the World Under-17 Hockey Challenge. Team USA is 6-1-0-1 (W-OTW-OTL-L) all-time, and has outscored the Czech Republic 32-19 in those meetings. The two countries most recently clashed in the opening game of last year's preliminary round, where the U.S. won 3-2 in overtime. **Bode Wilde** (Birmingham, Mich.) and **Patrick Giles** (Chevy Chase Md.), both currently with the U.S. National Under-18 Team, netted goals in regulation while **Joel Farabee** (Cicero, N.Y.) had the overtime-winner.

USA VS CANADA RED EXHIBITION RECAP

The U.S. defeated Canada Red, 9-1 Thursday night in its exhibition game. **Matthew Boldy** (Millis, Mass.), **Judd Caulfield** (Grand Forks, N.D.) and **Cole Caufield** (Stevens Point, Wis.) all netted two goals in the win. **Jack Hughes** (Orlando, Fla.) led Team USA with five points (1-4).

Spencer Knight (Darien, Conn.) and **Cameron Rowe** (Wilmette, III.) split time in net combining for 23 saves.

WORLD U17 CHALLENGE HISTORY

Team USA has competed at the World U17 Hockey Challenge on 24 previous occasions, including the Quebec Cup in 1990 and the Quebec Esso Cup in 1986. Combined, the U.S. has a 83-75-34-7 (W-OTW-OTL-L-T) record, good for first in the all-time event standings. Team USA has finished in the top three 14 times; first place in January 2014, 2010, 2002 and 2001; second place in November 2014, 2012, 2011, 2008, 2006, 1998 and 1996. Last year the U.S. finished in fifth place.

The U.S. Under-17 Team (2001 birth year) enters the 2017 World Under-17

Challenge with an 8-1-0-0 overall record. In last year's tournament the 2000s went 2-1-0-3 during its 2016 run in Sault Ste. Marie, Ontario. The U17s finished fifth while earning victories over the Czech Republic, Canada White and Canada Red. Joel Farabee (Cicero, N.Y.) and Bode Wilde (Birmingham, Mich.) led the U17s offensively as Farabee collected four goals, two assists and six points in five games and Wilde recorded two goals, four assists and six points in five games. Keegan Karki (Sartell, Minn./ Muskegon Lumberiacks) was between the pipes for all five games for the U17s collecting a 2.28 goals-against-average and a .894 save-percentage with a 3-2-0 record. The U17s have won the World Under-17 Challenge four times since 2001, last winning victory coming in 2014. During that tournament, the U.S. Under-17 Team went 6-0-0-0 in Cape Breton, Nova Scotia. The U17s overall record when competing in British Columbia is 8-0-2-1.

COACHING STAFF AT THE CHALLENGE

John Wroblewski (Neenah, Wis.) wil lead the U.S. in the event for the first time. Joining Wroblewski will be assistant coach **Greg Moore** (Lisbon, Maine), goaltending coach **Thomas Speer** (Janesville, Wis.) and intern assistant coach **Kevin Lind** (Homer Glen, III.). Moore was a member of the 2001 U.S. Under-17 World Hockey Challenge team that took first place.

INTERNATIONAL EXPERIENCE

This tournament will be all 22-members' first international experience. The Under-17 Team will also compete in the Under-17 Four Nations tournament in Velikey Novgorod, Russia and the Under-17 Five Nations Tournament in Finland in February.

ABOUT THE NTDP

The pinnacle of amateur player development in the U.S., the NTDP scouts and selects the top 23 players in two age groups (Under-17 and Under-18) to train and develop in a

highly competitive two-year program.

The teams (Under-17 and Under-18) face a rigorous domestic schedule includingcompetition against older, more developed players.

The U17s play a majority of a 60-game junior schedule in the USHL, while the U18s face USHL, NCAA Division I and III opponents. Both squads also compete in several international events each season.

Additionally, the players face a daily routine of off-ice development that includes strength training, cross-training, cognitive skill testing and academics.

USHL COMPETITION

The NTDP plays a full United States Hockey League season, split between the U.S. National Under-17 and Under-18 Teams. The records for both teams are combined into one in USHL standings. At this point, the U17s are 3-1-0 in the USHL regular season while the U18s are 2-0-0, putting Team USA at third in the Eastern Conference.

RACKING UP POINTS

Cole Caufield (Stevens Point, Wis.) and **Jack Hughes** (Orlando, Fla.) both currently sit in the top ten in points in the USHL. Both are members of the Under-17 Team.

With the exhibition win on Thursday, Caufield currently leads the U17s with 15 goals in 10 games this season. Caufield has scored two goals in six of 10 games. He is also second on the team with 18 points and tied for first in shots (31). Hughes is leading the U17s with 21 points in 10 games played and is averaging 2.50 points-per-game in four USHL games this season. His ten USHL points have him tied for first overall in the league. Hughes has two goals and six assists in the last three games played after recording 5 points (1-4) in Team USA's win against Canada Red.

YOUNG GUNS

The U.S. National Under-17 Team currently has five of the top ten rookies points leaders in the USHL. Hughes leads rookies with his 10 points (3-7-10) followed by Caufield with nine (7-2-9). Also on the list with five points through four games are: **Michael Gildon** (Plano, Texas) (4-1-5), **Alex Turcotte** (Island Lake, III.) (2-3-5), and **Matthew Boldy** (Millis, Mass.) (1-4-5).

LAST WEEKEND REVIEW

The U17s are coming into the tournament off its first loss of the season. They fell Saturday night (Oct. 28) in USHL play, 4-3 against the Cedar Rapids Roughriders at USA Hockey Arena in Plymouth, Michigan. The U17 s are now 3-1-0 in the USHL and 8-1-0 overall. Caufield netted two goals and added an assist in the loss. Hughes netted a goal of his own and added two helpers. Boldy aslo had a three point night with three assists.

ALUMNI NHL UPDATE

Clayton Keller (2014-16) is paving the way for NTDP alumni NHL rookies in his first season with the Arizona Coyotes. He currently leads all rookies in points with 15 (9-6-15) in 14 games. Keller was named NHL Rookie of the Month for October.

Fellow NTDP alum **Will Butcher** (2011-13) is close behind with 12 points (0-12-12) in 12 games with the New Jersey Devils.

Auston Matthews (2013-15/ Toronto Maple Leafs) is currently third in overall points leaders with 18 (10-8-18)in 14 games played and is tied for third place overall in goals with Alex Ovechkin with 10. He sits at number one overally in plus/ minus with +14.

ALUMNI NCAA UP

Max Gildon (2015-17/University of New Hampshire) named Hockey East Rookie of the Week. **Grant Mismash** (2015-17/ University of North Dakota) earned his second NCHC Rookie of the Week honor. **Louie Belpedio** (2012-14/Miami University) earned the NCHC Defenseman of the week honor. **Troy Terry** (2014-15/ University of Denver) earned NCAA Player of the week.

USA HOCKEY INTERNATIONAL BREAK

The U.S. National Under-18 Team is gearing up for its first international competition of 2017-18, the Under-18 Five Nations Tournament in Hameenlinna, Finland. The U.S. will face teams from Switzerland, Sweden, Finland, and the Czech Republic.

The U.S. Women's National Team is currently in Florida preparing for the upcoming Four Nations Cup. Team USA is readying to face Finland (Nov. 7), Canada (Nov. 8) and Sweden (Nov. 10) for the Cup. On the men's side, the team is preparing for the Deutschland Cup in Augsburg, Germany. The men will face Slovakia (Nov. 10), Russia (Nov. 11), and Germany (Nov. 12). The tournament will serve as a precursor in determining the 2018 U.S. Olympic hockey roster. Six players on threroster are NTDP alumni, including **Robbie Earl** (2001-03/ EHC Biel- Bienne), **Chad Kolarik** (2002-04/Adler Mannheim), **Brandon Maxwell** (2007-09/BK Mlada Boleslav), **Drew Shore** (2007-09/ZSC Lions), **Ryan Stoa** (2003-05/Spartak Moskva) and **Mark Stuart** (2000-02/Adler Mannheim).

COLLEGE BOUND

Twenty of the 23 players on the Under-17 Team are currently committed to NCAA Division i college hockey programs. Thirteen of the 20 committed will be making their way to Boston after they gradute from the NTDP. Boston College leads the way with seven commitments followed by Boston University with three and Harvard University also with three commitments. The University of Wisconsin has two recruits while Quinnipiac University, University of Michigan, University of Nebraska-Omaha, University of North Dakota, and University of Notre Dame each with one recruit apiece.

NTDP ALUMNI ON NHL OPENING NIGHT ROSTERS: In the 100th

opening night for the National Hockey League, USA Hockey's National Team Development Program will have a total of 62 players on NHL rosters. The Columbus Blue Jackets led the way with six alumni while the Boston Bruins and Chicago Blackhawks have five. Read the full story at USAHockeyNTDP.com
