## Who?

United States Power Soccer Association (USPSA) is the US Soccer affiliate responsible to provide persons with physical disabilities using power chairs the opportunity to play, learn, and compete in the sport of Power Soccer. USPSA is responsible for promoting the sport on a national and international level through tournament play, referee certification, training and continued growth. The participants include people with quadriplegia, multiple sclerosis, muscular dystrophy, cerebral palsy, head trauma, stroke, spinal cord injury and other disabilities. Currently, there are over 150 teams that are organized throughout the US. 60 teams compete on a regular basis. To give perspective, there are over 400,000 people in the US that use a power wheelchair for their daily mobility. We've only reached 1%. ## What is Power Soccer?

Power Soccer is the fastest growing sport for power wheelchair users. It combines the skill of the person with the speed and power of the chair to create a fun, competitive and accessible opportunity to play the most popular sport in the world. Modifications include playing in a gym on a regulation basketball court. Two teams of four athletes in power wheelchairs attack, defend and spin-kick a 13" soccer ball in an attempt to score goals.
