Wildcats Storylines ...

PLAYOFF EXCELLENCE: The Saint Ignatius football team has a long history of playoff success under Head Coach Chuck Kyle '69. The Wildcats are making their 28th appearance in the OHSAA Division I Playoffs, including their second in a row and six in seven seasons. Under Kyle, the Wildcats have a 71-16 overall record vs. playoff foes.

WE'RE GOING STREAKING: Following a tough loss to Archbishop Moeller, the Wildcats have been on a hot streak. The Cats handed St. Xavier and St. Edward their only losses of the season before defeating Massillon Perry. The Wildcats have now defeated five of the nine other Top 10 teams in Cleveland.com's local poll. The Wildcats were named the 2017 Division I AP Poll Champions after Week 10.

MORE COWBELL: The Wildcats have established an identity down the stretch this season – a strong defense, a grind-it-out running game, and an opportunistic passing offense. Jahadge "Bo" Floyd has made the offensive success possible, assuming the role of the "bellcow" on offense. Floyd has anchored the offense with his tough running style that earns him extra yards on the inside with his power and on the edges with his speed. Floyd leads the team with 866 rushing yards, averaging 6.1 yards per carry. Also, look out for fellow back Jack Welcsh (55 yards, 1 TD) and quarterback Dan Alexander (237 yards, 7 TD) in the ground game.

MILESTONE WATCH: The Wildcats' playmakers could hit some more milestones on Friday after Alexander surpassed 1,000 passing yards for the season in Friday's win over Perry. Running back Bo Floyd is 134 yards away from 1,000 rushing yards on the season. Wideout Sammy Snyder needs 103 yards to hit 1,000 receiving yards on the season, a feat just four Saint Ignatius receivers have achieved. Snyder currently stands at 8th on the leaderboard for receiving yards in a season. Kicker Matthew Trickett's next made field goal will tie him with Jesse Milligan (15, 1997) for second-most field goals in a season. Tim Shenk leads the way with 20 in 2011. On defense, Logan Joyce is one tackle for loss away from 25 on the year.

BE LIKE EICH: Few defenders inspire fear in ballcarriers like Tommy Eichenberg. The junior linebacker leads the team with 64 tackles and 6 sacks. He also has 15.5 tackles for loss and 6 quarterback hits. Look for Eichenberg to play a key role in limiting Ronald Lee. Also look out for senior 'backers Logan Joyce, Andrew Keirn, and Tommy Grosel.

NO FLY ZONE: The Wildcats' secondary has seen plenty of changes this season, accomodating for injuries, different styles of offenses, and new schemes. Against all types of foes, corner Cam Toppin has led the way with 39 tackles, 6 interceptions, and 8 pass breakups. Matthew Viancourt and Justin Sands have been clutch at safety, while Jett Elad has played well at both corner and free safety. Connor Cmiel, John Wetula, and Daniel Scelza have all helped to limit opponents to 154.6 passing yards per game and 13 TD through 11 games.

ABOUT EUCLID ...

Learning about the Panthers ...

A TEST FOR THE PROGRAM: Head Coach Jeff Rotsky and the Panthers see Friday's game as a large test for the school's growing football program. As Rotsky told reporters last week, "You're not a great program until you beat the Saints." The Panthers will try to do just that, as Euclid looks to avenge a 34-20 loss to Saint Ignatius in Week 3.

FAMILIAR FOES: Saint Ignatius and Euclid have met a number of times in the playoffs. The two teams have met six times in the playoffs, with the Wildcats winning all six contests. Most of the matchups have been fierce. The 1989 Regional Final pitted Robert Smith and Euclid against Joe Pickens and the Wildcats. The Cats escaped with a 31-30 victory in one of the most memorable high school playoff games in Northeast Ohio history. The last playoff encounter between the two teams occurred in 1999, with Saint Ignatius winning, 28-14.

THE NEXT ROBERT SMITH: Last Friday, one of the most venerated records in Euclid football fell. Ronald Lee replaced Robert Smith as the single-season rushing leader, notching 221 yards and 3 touchdowns against Massillon Jackson to propel himself above Smith's previous mark of 2,042 yards in 1989. Smith now has an incredible 2,202 rushing yards this season. Lee notched 103 yards on 19 carries in the Week 3 against the Wildcats. Lee also might get some catches out of the backfield from talented quarterback Aubrey Shabazz.

REGULAR SEASON RECAP: The Wildcats and Panthers have already met this season, facing off in Week 3. (For a full box score and recap, see p. 13). Euclid began with an early mistake, as Jett Elad took a pick-six to the end zone for the early lead. Euclid managed two first-half touchdowns, but the Panthers slowed down in the second half. The Wildcats notched 114 rushing yards on offense, while holding Euclid to 38 rushing yards in the second half. Euclid's key to victory on Friday is a full 48 minutes of football.

SPEED IN THE SECONDARY: Jeff Rotsky's defense is known for its speed. The Panthers have a host of athletes in the secondary, foremost among them Arquon Bush. The University of Cincinnati recruit will figure highly into limiting Dan Alexander and the Wildcats' passing game. Rotsky and his secondary will utilize plenty of man coverage, looking to limit the Wildcats' shifty receivers, but will switch it up with zone coverage, too.

STRONG UP FRONT: The Euclid defense has a strong and attacking front can surprise you. The Panthers typically utilize a six-man front, or a version of the 4-2-5 defense, occasionally rotating between three and four down linemen. Euclid averages 29.5 points allowed on defense, but if its linemen can limit Bo Floyd on the ground, the Panthers will be in business.

RB JACK WELCSH '20



This running back is one of many sophomores who have stepped up this season. Welcsh has become the change-of-pace back in recent weeks, serving often as a third down back. Welcsh has blocked well and provided solid yardage when carrying the ball. Look for Welcsh to play a critical role for the Wildcats against a skilled Euclid defense.

S MATTHEW VIANCOURT '18



It's no secret that Euclid has one of the best offenses in Northeast Ohio. The Wildcats' playmaking safety will have to play a big part in stopping a Panthers offense averaging 41.5 points per game. Viancourt notched 3.5 tackles and 1 tackle for loss vs. Euclid early this season. He'll likely look for an interception this time around after Elad and Sands picked off Euclid in September.

EDDIE DWYER'S PREVIEW

OHIO CITY - The last time the storied football programs from Saint Ignatius and Euclid met twice in the same season was the fall of 1996.

Coach Chuck Kyle's Wildcats won their 1996 season opener over the Panthers, 41-7, and, before finishing as the Division I State Runner-Up to Lima Senior, also defeated Euclid in the first round of the '96 OHSAA playoffs, 23-2.

In Saint Ignatius' first State Championship season of 1988, the 'Cats defeated Euclid, 21-12, in Week 2 of the regular season and 17-0 in the first round of the playoffs.

The Wildcats' State and National Championship season of 1989 saw the 'Cats dominate Euclid, 55-26, during Week 2 at legendary Lakewood Stadium in what was the first regular season high school football game to be televised live to a national audience. SportsChannel America did the honors.

In what was a much different game, to say the least, the '89 Wildcats rode an 85-yard kickoff return for a touchdown by running back/linebacker Tim Kennedy, a remarkable 30-vard reception by tight end John Jaeckin, a 7-vard touchdown run by Hall of Fame tailback Pete Fitzpatrick and a game-sealing interception by safety/ wide receiver Patrick Friend with 42 seconds remaining to an amazing comeback versus the Robert Smith-led Panthers, 31-30, in the second round of the playoffs. The game was played in Baldwin Wallace University's Finnie Stadium, then known as Baldwin-Wallace College.

Jaeckin's diving catch, which came off a third-and-19 from deep in Saint Ignatius territory, saw John haul in a pass from All-American quarterback Joe Pickens that deflected off the hands of one defender and bounced off the helmet and pads of another Panther.

from a four-point halftime deficit and defeated Euclid, 34-20, in the Week 3 Home Opener on September 9th. The game was played at Byers Field in Parma's Robert M. Boulton Stadium. It marked the first meeting on the gridiron between Saint Ignatius and Euclid since the Wildcats' 28-14, first-round playoff victory in 1999, when most of the current 'Cats were not even born or a few were maybe just infants.

With that Week 3 victory, Saint Ignatius currently leads its all-time gridiron series with Euclid, 12-1, including playoff victories in 1988, 1989, 1992, 1993, 1996 and 1999. The Panthers' only triumph came in Week 2 of 1987, 30-7.

Friday night at 7:30 on Stewart Field in Bedford High School's atmosphererich and newly turfed Bearcat Stadium, the 10-1 and top-seeded Wildcats and the 9-2 fourth-seeded Panthers will meet for a second time this season in what will be an OHSAA Region 1 Semifinal. If you can't make it out to the game, Saint Ignatius' Broadcast Network will bring it to you live from Northfield Road.

Eleven-time State Champion and three-time National Champion Saint Ignatius enters Friday's game as the top-ranked team in the final Associated Press Division I State Poll for 2017, the No. 1 team in Cleveland.com's final seven-county area Top 25 poll and the fourth-ranked program in the Midwest this week by USA Today. Coach Kyle's Wildcats are making their 28th OHSAA playoff appearance.

The Wildcats have a past and very recent playoff history in Bedford's Bearcat Stadium, as in 2003 Josiah "Juice" Kedzior, John Haneline, Brian Hoyer, Mike Massey, Brian Parris and Tom Fritsch, to name just a few, helped Saint Ignatius to a 24-21, first-round playoff victory over the Ted Ginn Jr.-led Glenville Tarblooders in Bearcat Stadium.

Kedzior, labeled as the 'Cats' "Difference Maker" by The Plain Dealer High School Staff, hauled in a strong and on the money throw from Hoyer for a touchdown that Nov. 1st, 2003 night in Bearcat Stadium and "Juice" also kicked a field goal and three extra points. Haneline, Massey and Parris helped make a case for the defense against quarterback at Villa Angela-St. Joseph. Shabazz substantiated what Coach Kyle one of the most talent-laden offenses in the state, and Fritsch provided some pow erful efforts on the ground, among other things.

Haneline, an All-Ohio linebacker, had a monster game versus the Tarblooders, including a key scoop and score off a fumble recovery. A graduate of Bowling Green State University in sociology, Haneline played linebacker for the Falcons from 2004-08. He was a starter in his final three seasons and helped lead BG to the 2007 MAC East Co-Championship and the 2004 GMAC Bowl title. John is an assistant football coach for Mississippi State University as a Defensive Quality Control Specialist.

Last season, Coach Kyle led his Wildcats back to Bearcat Stadium for an OHSAA Regional Final matchup with rival St. Edward. After defeating the Eagles three weeks earlier, 34-7, in the regular season finale at the Browns' FirstEnergy Stadium, Saint Ignatius had to survive an overtime thriller, 38-31.

THE 2017 PANTHERS ARE LEE- FUELED: Senior tailback Ronald Lee, the Northeast Lakes District's Division I Offensive Player of the Year, broke the single-season rushing record at Euclid during last weekend's 49-29 Regional Quarterfinal victory over fifth-seeded Massillon Jackson.

The 5-foot-7, 170-pound Lee enters Friday night's game versus the Wildcats with 2,202 yards on the ground this season, the key factor in the Panthers' ability to drive for what is their 17th OHSAA playoff appearance. Euclid legend Robert Smith, a former Ohio State standout in football and track, and an All-Pro tailback for the Minnesota Vikings, ran for 2,042 yards as a senior at Euclid in 1989. Robert, a two-time Ohio Mr. Football, finished his high school career with 5,038 yards and 67 touchdowns on 548 carries. He is currently an outstanding College Football Analyst for the Big Ten Network and Fox Sports.

Lee finished his night against the Jackson Polar Bears with 221 yards and three touchdowns on just 15 carries, including 159 yards and two touchdowns on seven first-half carries. Panthers veteran Head Coach Jeff Rotsky told the media shortly after the Jackson game that Ronald is "a total back" with great humility.

THE COMPLEMENTARY PARTS: Along with Lee, the Panthers' mainstays are offensive lineman Ashawn Berry (6-2, 245); defensive lineman Larenz Wright (5-10, 250); defensive back Arquon Bush (6-1, 170); linebacker Sean Jackson (5-11, 190); wide receiver Dre' Von Lindsay (6-1, 173); offensive lineman Darrius Johnson (6-4, 315) and defensive back Job Rand (5-9, 165). All of these young men garnered All-District recognition.

LOOKING BACK AT WEEK 3: After the Wildcats outscored the Panthers, 24-6, in the second half and went on to their 34-20 victory, Saint Ignatius' standout senior offensive guard /Captain Jack Jamieson said all of the conditioning and all of the reps during the summer and into the regular reason came to the fore in that second half when the Wildcats' offensive and defensive lines took control up front and helped show the way.

THE COMEBACK BEGINS: After Saint Ignatius senior Matthew Trickett, one of the premier kickers/punters in the Midwest, connected on a 36-yard field goal in the final minute of the first half, the Wildcats, trailing 14-10 at halftime, began to play like they are capable of.

"They appeared to be a little gassed in the second half," said Jamieson of the Panthers. "It's hard to get tired when you love the guy playing next to you," Jamieson continued in referencing to the fellowship and respect the linemen have for one another, and the conditioning the O-Line receives from outstanding Assistant Coaches Adam Rini '99 and Paul Yappel, and one of the top Directors of Strength and Conditioning in the nation, Anthony Rubino.

The second half definitely belonged to Coach Kyle's Wildcats, who played with pride and passion over the final two quarters.

With senior tailback/Captain Mark Bobinski, whose heart is bigger than Robert That little walk down memory lane now leads us to the 2017 Wildcats, who rallied M. Boulton Stadium, running with powerful authority and balance, Saint Ignatius put together a five-play, 75-yard march that was capped by Bobinski's 10-yard touchdown run and the ensuing extra point by Trickett.

Playing with the same fire the offense brought to the table in the second half, the 'Cats' defense began to harass and disrupt the Panthers' offensive flow.

Sparked by two money receptions by one of the most underrated receivers in Northeast Ohio, senior Sammy Snyder, and more tough yards from Bobinski, the gridiron rich Wildcats covered 54 yards in seven plays. The drive, which pushed Saint Ignatius' lead to 24-14 with 6:21 to go in the third quarter, featured a 17-yard touchdown reception by one of the top pass catchers the area has to offer, senior Michael Drobnick, and another high and true extra point by Trickett.

Trickett was the ticket once again, as Matthew ripped a 42-yard field goal through a brisk late night in Parma that started with blue skies and sunshine. The Wildcats then closed out their scoring on a 9-yard TD run by Bobinski (PAT Trickett) that was set up when relentless senior nose tackle Aidan Gill ripped the ball loose and ever-present senior linebacker Logan Joyce fought for the fumble recovery. Bobinski totaled 143 yards on 32 carries and Snyder had six receptions for 73 yards

Euclid would score off a late touchdown reception by Dre'Von Lindsay, who finished with 7 receptions for 151 yards.

COACH KYLE ON FRIDAY'S SECOND ENCOUNTER WITH THE GIFTED PAN-THERS: "Now that he is getting all of the reps, he's getting better each week," said Coach Kyle of Aubrey Shabazz, who took over for Panthers starting quarterback Cee Jay Hale after Hale suffered an injury in a Week 7 victory over Solon. Shabazz had also been part of Euclid's receiving corps and defensive unit

"He is tough to bring down and along with the slants and hitches, he has been hitting the long ones," Coach Kyle continued in reference to Shabazz, a former said in the Panthers' 61-59, down to the final minute loss to Mentor by firing five touchdown passes past the Cardinals' secondary. "He seems to have fallen into the flow of what is needed out of quarterback in their offense. A lot of credit to him."

Coach Kyle pointed out that the Wildcats' defense made the multi-skilled Ronald Lee earn his yards during the 'Cats' Week 3 victory.

"But he got yardage," said Coach Kyle. "He's very explosive with good vision. He'll bounce and take off. I thought we did a pretty good job at the point of attack, but he created and ended up getting a nice gain. You jut have to tip your hat to him, because he saw it and reacted. He's been on a tear."

Defensively, Coach Kyle said Euclid works out of a four-man front, but with a 6-1 and a blitz from the outside with six coming after you.

"They are working some zone and man (in the secondary)," Coach Kyle said. "I think we'll see some man situations, where they will try to lock on and create some pressure. I think we'll see more pressure than we did the last time. Certainly against Massillon Jackson they were bringing pressure. Their basic philosophy is still the same, they're just getting better at it."

Coach Kyle emphasized that all anyone has to do is look at the four exceptional teams left in Region 1 heading into the semifinals to appreciate how strong the region is. The Wildcats-Panthers winner will face the winner of Friday night's other Regional Semifinal between second-seeded St. Edward (10-1) and third-seeded Mentor (10-1), which will kick off at 7:30 on Byers Field in Parma's Robert M. Boulton Stadium. Like Euclid, the Eagles and the Cardinals were defeated by Saint Ignatius during the regular season. The Wildcats' only setback occurred in Week 8 to Archbishop Moeller at Otterbein University.

"You have to play four great quarters and that is something I have talked to the kids about," said the man who carries a 71-16 record in OHSAA postseason play. "When I look back on the season, a lot of times we've had a quarter that wasn't very good. We're at that time of the year when that's not going to fly. We have to have four good quarters. That's playoff caliber football. This week is all focused on four great guarters."

PERRY RECAP

PARMA - The now 10-1 Wildcats of Hall of Fame Head Coach Chuck Kyle '69 found themselves trailing Perry, 7-0, with 11:56 remaining in the first half and 7-3 at halftime before adjusting to Coach Keith Wakefield's vaunted Wing-T offense and controlling the final 24 minutes.

Top-seeded Saint Ignatius, making its 28th OHSAA postseason appearance since its remarkable playoff run began in 1988, advances to next Friday's 7:30 pm Region 1 Semifinal matchup with fourth-seeded Euclid at a site to be determined by the OHSAA on Sunday. Wildcats outstanding Athletic Director Rory Fitzpatrick '88 said Lakewood Stadium and Bedford Bearcat Stadium could be among the OHSAA's considerations.

The Euclid Panthers of Head Coach Jeff Rotsky improved to 9-2 by dominating fifth-seeded Massillon Jackson, 49-21, in a Regional Quarterfinal at Euclid Friday night. Euclid standout Ronald Lee broke the Panthers' single-season rushing record that was set 28 years ago by former two-time Ohio Mr. Football, the legendary Robert Smith.

Saint Ignatius, in its Week 3 home opener this season, rallied from a four-point halftime deficit and defeated Euclid, 34-20, on Byers Field. The Wildcats lead their all-time series with Euclid, 12-1, including playoff victories in 1988, 1989, 1992, 1993, 1996, and 1999.

This seasoned playoff observer will preview the 14th meeting between Saint Ignatius and Euclid early this coming week.

HERE IS A CORNER'S VIEW OF FRIDAY NIGHT'S HARD-EARNED TRIUMPH OVER MASSILLON PERRY, WHICH WAS FACING THE WILD-CATS FOR THE FIRST TIME ON THE GRIDIRON.

"I knew this would be a tough game, I just knew it," said Coach Kyle while walking off Byers Field after his Wildcats, behind an impressive second half, ended Perry's season at 9-2. Coach Wakefield's eighth-seeded Panthers were the Division II State Runner-Up in both 2015 and 2016 before moving up to Division I this season under the OHSAA's new competitive balance system.

"That offense (the Wing-T), it caused us problems," Coach Kyle continued. "A great job by Ryan (Ryan Franzinger '02, Saint Ignatius' Defensive Coordinator), Dave (Wildcats' outstanding Defensive Line Coach Dave Cicetti) and Kevin ('Cats Defensive Secondary Coach Kevin Johnson '10) at halftime.

"The way they (Perry) were down blocking and kicking out, there was just this little seam, a seam gap area just a little bit, and they have some good backs. Boy, they came through there. We had to blow that up a little better. We started moving the line a little bit with their cadence and I think that helped a bit, too, so they didn't have a clear shot of where we were at. That helped.

"They had a little drive (at the start of the second half) and we stopped them," said the man who has now guided his storied football program at Cleveland's Jesuit Preparatory School to a playoff mark of 71-16. "The offense then started to take it down field methodically and we came up with a big turnover when the defense was just charging and caused a fumble that we got down there on their 3. That was huge. And our last drive allowed the defense to rest and get organized.

"They are good at what they do, there is no doubt about it," Coach Kyle said in reference to the Perry Panthers.

Perry, a winner of 18 Federal League Championships, took a sixgame winning streak into Friday's game, which was the Stark County school's ninth OHSAA football playoff appearance.

Led by the fab five that key its Wing-T - quarterback Max Baker and running backs Tyler Cowan, Jarin Curtis, Richard Coleman and Sha'VeA (correct) Lightner, Coach Wakefield's Panthers put together a 9-play, 80-yard drive that was capped off by Baker's second-effort, 9-yard scoring run and the ensuing extra-point kick by Caden Basham with less than a minute gone in the second quarter.

Perry outrushed the Wildcats, 187-64, in the first half and for the game that Panthers had a net 304 yards on the ground off 52 rushes. Saint Ignatius totaled a net 149 yards rushing on 38 carries.

The 'Cats, who finished the regular season as the top-ranked Division I team in the Associated Press State Poll and the No. 1 team in Cleveland.com's Top 25 seven-county area poll, closed to 7-3 by halftime on a 38-yard field goal by gifted senior kicker Matt Trickett.

The second half belonged to the three-time national champs (1989,

1993 and 1995), as Coach Kyle watched his senior quarterback Danny Alexander hook up with multi-skilled junior tailback Jahadge "Bo" Floyd on a 32-yard, in-stride touchdown pass down the home sideline that highlighted a nine-play, 88-yard drive. Trickett's PAT made it a 10-7 game with 2:56 left in the third quarter.

After the key fumble recovery at the Perry 3-yard line that Coach Kyle referred to above, a savvy and strong recovery by tough and talented senior nose tackle/fullback Aidan Gill, oh so promising sophomore running back/defensive back Jack Welcsh scored off a third-and-goal at the 1 for his first touchdown on the Varsity level. Another Trickett extra point gave Saint Ignatius some breathing room at 17-7 with 2:03 to go in the third quarter.

With Coach Franzinger's defense continuing to make the adjustments, a 5-yard scoring run by Alexander and Trickett's third PAT put the 'Cats in control at 24-7 with 8 minutes and 46 seconds remaining to be played. Danny's savvy read resulted in his seventh rushing touchdown on the season.

Alexander was also 11-of-19 passing for 154 yards, a touchdown and no interceptions, giving Danny's arm 1,101 yards and 11 TDs for the season. Perry managed just a net 4 yards through the air.

Helping key Danny's strong night was junior wide receiver Nigel Drummond II with 64 yards off four receptions.

Floyd led the ground game for Running Backs Coach Terry Fergus '72, as "Bo" added to his TD reception by picking up 114 yards on 20 carries. Welcsh finished with 25 yards and a TD on seven carries. "Bo" now has 866 yards rushing off 137 carries.

Perry spread its wealth in the rushing department. Baker had 78 yards off 13 carries, Cowan totaled 72 yards off eight carries, Lightner also had eight carries that produced 65 yards, and Curtis carried 17 times for 54 yards.

STAT OF THE NIGHT: Perry ran 57 plays for 308 yards and Saint Ignatius ran 57 plays for 303 yards.

THE MEN UP FRONT: Saint Ignatius' defensive line played a huge role in Saint Ignatius' second-half adjustments, as Gill, fellow senior Bradley Andrich, junior Zach McMahan and junior Aidan Wells, among others, made their presence known, as did outstanding junior linebacker Tommy Eichenberg.

AND THE MEN IN THE SECONDARY: This corner tips his cap to savvy cornerbacks Cam Toppin and Jett Elad, and safeties Danny Scelza, Matt Viancourt and John Wetula for their efforts under the Friday night lights of Byers Field.

FROM AIDAN GILL, THE PRIDE OF OUR LADY OF ANGELS: "Obviously they were running the ball very effectively. So the main thing we had to focus on was working together. We worked on it all week (the Wing-T), but they came out pounding the ball. As a defensive line, we were trying to free up the linebackers."

FROM ZACH MCMAHAN: "In the first half we were missing a few of our keys. I feel that in the second half we really tightened it up. When we started the season, we really weren't sure who was going to play on the defensive line. But we've stepped up. We try to make it possible for our linebackers to make plays. Our linebackers are great, all of them. They play off of us. We work inside the defense."

AIDAN ON HIS FUMBLE RECOVERY: "The big running back was in a pile and we had stood him up a little bit. I saw him holding the ball, so I literally just took it out of his hands. I thought I was running free, I was really excited. But the running back came up and tackled me from behind. It was really fun. I haven't done that since grade school. So it was a little rush. All credit to Perry, though, they're very good."

Gill and McMahan share a true motto for a defensive lineman - "No glory, no stats. Just working in the trenches so guys can make some plays." And they love it.

FROM JACK WELCSH: "We knew we had to come back or this season was done," Jack said. "Honestly, when Danny saw "Bo" running down the sideline and hit him with that pass it changed everything. We started going after that.

"For my place, I just give "Bo" breathers. It is sort of my role right now. I love it." $\ensuremath{\text{I}}$

And this old-timer loves the privilege to cover and report on such talented, yet humble young men. Coach Kyle's 'Cats are truly "Men for Others."

In 1994, Bedford High School christened Bedford Bearcat Stadium and several other facilities on campus, including a baseball diamond, football/soccer practice fields, improved tennis courts, and an auxiliary gym. The improvements were made possible by a 1.48-mill bond issue.

Bedford Bearcat Stadium is a great all-around facility. The stadium features seating for 5,000 fans, a well-sized press box, an all-weather 8-lane track, along with a connected building. This facility hosts locker rooms, a concessions area, restrooms, a weight room, and coaches' and team meeting rooms.

The press box can host a large number of media with a two-tiered indoor booth. The press box features hardline Internet connections and ample space for media to work.

The stadium is the home stadium of the Bedford High School Bearcats. Bedford High School was founded in 1954, with several renovations to the school since then. The stadium also serves as the host for several other area high school football teams, including the Benedictine Bengals.

Entering Friday's game vs. Euclid, the Wildcats have a 4-0 all-time record at Bedford Bearcat Stadium.

Wildcats storm to 24 unanswered second half points to beat Euclid

PARMA - The Wildcats' offensive and defensive lines took control up front and led the way to a 34-20 victory over Euclid. Trailing by four points at halftime, the Wildcats outscored the Panthers, 24-6, in the second half.

AS ADVERTISED: That was certainly the case in the first half, as Coach Jeff Rotsky's Panthers, unleashed some of their impressive offensive weapons. Saint Ignatius' Jett Elad come up with an interception return for a touchdown of 26 yards on the game's first play. Euclid settled down and started to show their offensive prowess. Sparked by a second- and third-effort run by tailback Ronald Lee and the passing combination of quarterback Cee Jay Hale to wide receiver Dre'Von Lindsay, the Panthers drove from their 20-yard line to the Saint Ignatius 25. Faced with a fourth down-and-4 from the Wildcats' 19, Hale found Lindsay on a slant route that saw Lindsay catch the ball in stride, make a cut up the middle and outrun the pursuit into the end zone. Vincent Jackson's extra-point kick snuck its way over the crossbar and the score was tied at 7 with 6 minutes and 26 seconds remaining in the first quarter. Taking advantage of a Saint Ignatius fumble at the Wildcats' 22-yard line, Euclid took the lead off a little razzle-dazzle that saw slot back Aubrey Shabazz take a pitch out from Hale, fake as though he was running a reverse and then drop back and connect with Hale, who swung out of the backfield. Hale caught the ball in stride down the sideline and rambled into the end zone. Jackson's PAT was good and the Panthers led, 14-7, with 10:03 left in the first half.

THE COMEBACK BEGINS: After Saint Ignatius Matthew Trickett connected on a 36-yard field goal in the final minute of the first half, the Wildcats, trailing 14-10 at half-time, began to take over the line of scrimmage.

The second half belonged to Coach Kyle's Wildcats. With tailback/Captain Mark Bobinski running, Saint Ignatius put together a five-play, 75-yard march that was capped by Bobinski's 10-yard touchdown run and the extra point by Trickett. The 'Cats' defense began to harass and disrupt the Panthers' offensive flow. Sparked by two receptions by Sammy Snyder, and more tough yards from Bobinski, the Wildcats covered 54 yards in seven plays. The drive pushed Saint Ignatius' lead to 24-14 with 6:21 to go in the third quarter, featured a 17-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Kyle Hall to wide receiver Michael Drobnick, and another extra point by Trickett. Trickett ripped a 42yard field goal. The Wildcats then closed out their scoring on a 9-yard TD run by Bobinski (PAT Trickett) that was set up when nose tackle Aidan Gill ripped the ball loose and linebacker Logan Joyce fought for the fumble recovery. Bobinski totaled 143 yards on 32 carries and Snyder had six catches for 73 yards. Euclid would score off a late touch-

#58MILESTOCANTON



On September 17, 1920, seven men, including the legendary Jim Thorpe met in Canton, Ohio to form the American Professional Football Association (APFA), a precursor to today's National Football League.

An early hotbed of football, Canton was selected as the site of the Pro Football Hall of Fame, which opened its doors on September 7, 1963.

Before the Hall of Fame came into existence, Fawcett Stadium was erected in 1938. The facility housed the successful McKinley Bulldogs.

After the Hall of Fame was built in Fawcett's backyard, the stadium hosted the Hall of Fame Game beginning in 1962. The first two Hall of Fame enshrinements took place in Fawcett Stadium, too.

For a period of time in the 1990's and 2000's, Fawcett Stadium hosted the OHSAA's Division I State Championship games. Saint Ignatius football fans became well-acquainted during this time, as the Wildcats played six state title games at Fawcett Stadium.

The Wildcats' third state title in 1991 was played at Fawcett, as the Football Cats defeated Centerville,



24-21. The Wildcats also won titles in 1992, 1999, 2001, 2008, and 2011 in front of adoring Wildcats fans in the historical stadium.

During years in which the Wildcats played at Fawcett, the football program adopted the phrase 58 Miles to Fawcett. The team's 2017 hashtag plays off that theme.

The stadium was renamed Tom Benson Hall of Fame Stadium after its most recent renovation, completed in August 2017. So, the Wildcats retired the phrase 58 Miles to Fawcett.

With the return of the OHSAA State Championship to Canton, the theme #58MilesToCanton has been adopted. The theme will be used on social media, apparel, and other items. After falling short of a state title in 2016, the Wildcats will look to retun to Canton in 2017 and claim the program's state record 12th state title.
