Competitive Level

At the scheduling meeting, each 10U Major and Minor teams will schedule 2 Half ice games in September, October, November, December and 1 Half ice game January, and February for a total of ten (10) games. Major/Minor teams can play each other for credit for up to 5 of the 10 games.

Comp council VP will review and confirm all teams are following the Guidelines. Associations who do not follow these guidelines will be considered not in good standing. (Not be eligible for State Tournament)

Each week 10U teams will have a station based practices.

State will host ½ Ice Hockey Weekend(s) with all 10U Comp Teams.

10U Minor ½ Ice Weekend.

10U Major ½ Ice Weekend.

During each State run ½ Ice weekend - Coaches will also host one station based practice with all players and coaches from entire division. Ice will be booked and paid for by ASHA. Each association will provide 2 volunteers to work the weekend, unless an association volunteers to host it.

State tournament will be full ice for both divisions. (Sometime in March)

8U players playing up to a 10U age level is strongly discouraged by ASHA, but occasionally there are compelling reasons to do so. Each association, at their discretion, may allow up to two (2) 8U age level players per season to play up at the 10U age level division. 6U age level players are prohibited from playing up to the 10U age level and above.

10U players playing up to a 12U age level is strongly discouraged by ASHA, but occasionally there are compelling reasons to do so. Each association, at their discretion, may allow up to two (2) 10U age level players per season to play up at the 12U age level division. 8U age level players are prohibited from playing up to the 12U age level and above.

Additional players playing up may be considered with an exception request to the ASHA ADM Coordinator in agreement with the VP of Comp. & VP of Rec. Council, who will only consider the request if it's due to association needs. i.e. (having to merge age divisions in order to have a functional program, small communities).

Recreation Level

Each 10U A and B team will play 2 Half ice games the month of October, November, December, January and February for a total of ten (10) games. A and B teams may schedule with each other for credit.

Teams will submit their Half ice game schedules to the VP of House Council. No later than November 1st. House Council VP will confirm all teams are following the guidelines. Associations that do not follow the guidelines will not be considered not in good Standing. (Not be eligible for State Tournament)

Each week 10U teams will have station based practices.

A 10U Region Jamboree will be held by the State of Alaska. The State would be divided into Fairbanks, the Anchorage Bowl, Mat Su and Kenai. The host Association would rotate year to year and cost for this Jamboree would be covered by the State of Alaska.
