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A Message From The President

This 1964-65 season was our greatest since Les Nassoii, our present Commissioner, started the league in 1960. Games were played on natural ice only and four teams were involved.

In 1961-62, under the leadership of our past president Ray Hewlett, and then vice-president Hal Johnson, we joined the Amateur Hockey Association of the United States.

Our Midget division was formed during the '62-'63 season when Hal Johnson became President.

1963-64 we stood pat with our Junior and Midget divisions, but we decided to procure paid-professional referees.

This year we formed our Bantam division and were gratified with the enthusiasm shown by the young boys and their parents. With the addition of this division we can develop better hockey players with which to perpetuate our Midgets and, subsequently, our Juniors.

Our plans for the future include forming an Intermediate division to which our Juniors can advance, and a Pee-Wee division to feed our Bantams. This is all dependant on availability of ice-time and procurement of additional sponsors.

The City of Niagara Falls gives us ice time hours at the 91st Street Rink free of charge. The time allotted us, although generous, is not enough for all our league games as we now have 13 teams registered and playing. This is a total of 220 boys. To make up for this deficit in ice hours, we rent ice time in the Canadian arenas, whenever it is available. These arenas are at Stamford, Fort Erie and Niagara Falls, Ontario.

All time put in by the officers, managers, and coaches is voluntary. However, to provide for the best possible officiating, linesmen and referees are paid.

We are a non-profit organization. In fact, we run on very little capital. We have 12 sponsors for our teams. (One short this year, we still need a sponsor.) These 12 businessmen sponsors pay the entrance fee for the team and provide the sweaters and socks for the boys. All other expenses must be paid by the boys and their families. These expenses include the above mentioned ice time and referee and linesmen fees. Ice skates, pads, gloves, helmets (where required), sticks, etc., must be purchased by the parents. Hockey is an expensive sport — albeit a great sport.

The officers and coaches are gratified by the caliber of play in our League and by the fact that Scouts are interested in a few of our boys for Scholarships. John Virtuoso, a forward for the DeFazio Rangers, was contacted by Providence College. Gary Palumbo, goaltender for the Moose Lodge, had a try-out with the Stamford Bruins, a Junior "B" Club. Dennis Ondak, forward, and Gary Hayes, defense for Pat Dillons VW, had a three game try-out with the Niagara Falls, N.Y. Senior team.

Improvement of play in our League continues on all levels.

The directors of the League thank all the boosters, ad purchasers, trophy donors and all who have given to the league in any manner; be it time, money, or both. With their continued support we will be able to expand, thereby helping more youngsters to learn good sportsmanship and teamwork. We feel Amateur Hockey helps to combat Juvenile Delinquency.
