Our developmental programs are intended for full year participation so signing up for Fall and Spring is encouraged but it is not mandatory. Registration fees are non-refundable and apply whether or not you sign up for one season or both. All teams are open to the public – there are no tryouts or cuts at these ages. If we have room on a roster, you will get a spot. We only evaluate players so that we may form teams with players of similar abilities and place them in the right league divisions.

A 10% discount will be applied if paying in full at registration time. Monthly payment plans available.

Leagues:

Our teams participate in both the Sarpy County Soccer League and the Eastern Nebraska Soccer Association (ENSA). ENSA does not sponsor divisions below the "9U" (9 years old and under) age groups so younger teams will be in the Sarpy County league. Each league will offer about 8 games per season. Sarpy teams will usually get 4 home games at La Vista, and 4 away games at locations such as Bellevue, Gretna, Springfield, and possibly as far away as Syracuse or Nebraska City. ENSA games tend to be more randomly spread around, some home games may be at La Vista, but many may be at neutral sites throughout the Omaha area. Road games might take you as far away as Lincoln or Blair. ENSA is generally considered a more competitive level of league play, but there is overlap, e.g., top Sarpy County divisions have stronger teams than lower ENSA divisions.

Tournaments and Fundraising:

Wolves SC hosts two tournaments, one in October for upper level teams, one in June for more Recreational level teams. Proceeds from these tournaments help cover club overhead costs and keep team fees down. Our objective is that your team fees apply to costs only related to team activities, not other club costs. The tournaments also offer opportunities for parents (and older players) to work, earning money or club credit to help with their soccer expenses. We don't expect everyone to volunteer for these events. Those who work will get paid, rather than us twisting the same arms year in and year out for everyone's benefit regardless of who helps out.

Metro Wolves SC is a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization. Other fundraising opportunities, either club-wide or team by team may be available at times. Parents or Teams wishing to organize fundraising events should contact us, we are glad to coordinate anything needing our non-profit ID.

Fees include:

- Coach pay and expenses
- Outdoor practice field rental, Fall and Spring
 - Once a week, 2011-12 teams
 - Twice a week, 2009-2010 teams
- League registration costs, Fall and Spring
- Indoor / winter practice field rentals for 2009-10 teams, about once a week (skipping holidays)
- Indoor / winter practice for 2011-12 teams will be at the coaches' discretion. They may not be regularly scheduled and may include events for all players at these ages rather than individual team sessions.
- Participation in the Wolves SocctoberFest tournament (or equivalent), 2009-10 teams
- Participation in the Wolves Spring Rec Cup (all 2009-2012 teams)
- Participation in the 2019 Wolves Elite ID Camp (all players – no refund for not attending)
- Practice jerseys are included (but not uniforms). Uniforms are typically used on a two to three-year cycle depending on when the manufacturers discontinue styles, thus they are not included in the annual costs.
