Head Table and Presenters

Jim Dotseth, Master of Ceremonies, Secretary-Treasurer of MFCA

Jim was Inducted into the MFCA HOF in 2010; Chair of the Awards Committee and serves on the Executive Committee and Mr. Football Committee; MC of the Hall of Fame Banquet since 2010.

Dave Fritze, All-Star Game Director, Assistant Coach at East Ridge High School

Dave is a 2014 HOF inductee. Serves on the All-Star Committee, Executive Committee and Awards Committee. Dave has been All-Star Game Director since 2000. He has been the point man working with the MN Vikings to move the All-Star game to US Bank Stadium following the high school season.

Scott Gonnermann

Scott began his 27th year of teaching and coaching football in Benson this past fall, the last 18 as head coach of the Benson Braves. Scott is very active in the MFCA, serving on numerous committees. He is a representative for MFCA Tackle Cancer, Class AA Academic All-State Team, Mr. Football Committee and the Mid-State subdivision. He will be the MFCA President in 2018-19.

Scott played high school football at Clara City '84, Midwest Minnesota (Clara City and Maynard) '85-'86 and Atwater-Grove City '87. He went on to play college football at the U of M-Morris '88-'91. In addition to teaching grade 6 and coaching football, Scott has been the assistant boys basketball coach for 27 years. He has also coached baseball and JV boys/girls golf.

Scott and his wife Maureen have 3 children: Presley, a sophomore at MSUM, Hunter, a senior and Toby, a freshman at Benson High School.

Beau LaBore

Beau will serve as Vice President of the MFCA this year. He also serves as Chair of the Community Service Award Committee and on the Tackle Cancer Board, Awards Committee, and Executive Director's Committee. Beau has been a head coach for 14 years, including the last eight at Stillwater Area High School.

Paul Lemke, Co-Chair of the Hall of Fame Committee, Glencoe-Silver Lake Assistant Coach

Co-Chair of the Hall of Fame Committee; he is a member of the Executive Committee and HOF Committee. Paul is a 2009 Butch Nash Award recipient and was selected as the 2018 Assistant Coach of the Year.

Dwight Lundeen, Becker High School

2014 MFCA Coach of the Year. He serves on the Mr. Football Committee, Awards Committee, and is MFCA liaison with the MN Vikings. Becker won the 3A Prep Bowl in 2005; 4A Prep Bowl in 2014 and 2015. Dwight has 359 wins, which is 3rd most in Minnesota football history. He was inducted into the HOF in 2009. Lundeen has been the head coach at Becker for 49 years. He started the program in 1970 and continues to coach today.

Head Table and Presenters

Dave Nelson, Minnetonka Head Football Coach, Chairman of MFCA Hall of Fame Banquet

Dave has coached at both Blaine and Minnetonka and his teams have made several state playoff appearances. Blaine won the 1988 Prep Bowl; in 2004 Minnetonka was 5A Prep Bowl champion and Dave was named State COY, 2014 MFCA Clinic Man of the Year and 2014 HOF inductee.

The Tackle Cancer program was his brain child. Over the past seven years, \$1,715,000 has been raised for the Randy Shaver Cancer Research and Community Fund. He served as MFCA President in 2002. He's a member of the Executive Committee, Awards Committee and the Tackle Cancer Committee.

Ron Stolski, Brainerd High School Head Coach & Executive Director MFCA

1983 MFCA President; 2006 American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) national Power of Influence recipient; 2008 Hall of Fame inductee. The 2018 season was his 57th as head coach and he is currently ranks 2nd in wins among all Minnesota coaches with 386; he is on several MFCA committees and is chair of the very successful MFC Clinic that was held this weekend here at the Doubletree. In 2010 he was named MFCA Coach of the Year.

Bubba Sullivan, Northfield Head Coach

Bubba has brought several Northfield teams to the state tournament. They were 1997 4A State Champion and Bubba was named State Coach of the Year. He is Chair of the Jerry Kill Power of Influence Committee; member of the Hall of Fame Committee and the Academic All-State Selection Committee.

Scott Tschimperle, Co-Chair of the Hall of Fame Committee, Glencoe-Silver Lake Head Coach

2015-2016 MFCA President; Glencoe-Silver Lake was Prep Bowl Class 3A champion in 2008 and runner-up in 2009. Scott is a member of the Hall of Fame Committee, the Academic All-State Selection Committee and the Executive Committee.



MFCA Code of Ethics

PREAMBLE

One of the distinguishing characteristics of a profession in education may be that its members are cognizant of, and perhaps dedicated to, rendering a service to humanity. As educators who choose to coach football, we must understand that the justification for football is that it provides educational and physical values for those who play the game, and the game essentially belongs to the players who choose to play it. The welfare of the game depends on how coaches live up to the spirit and letter of ethical conduct, and how coaches, as educators, model ethical conduct, and remain mindful of the trust and confidence placed in them by colleagues, players, and the public.

PURPOSE

This code of ethics has been developed to protect, promote, and preserve the best interests of the game and the coaching profession. Its primary purpose is to clarify and distinguish ethical and professional practices from those which are detrimental. Its secondary purpose is to emphasize the value of football as an experience that contributes to the overall education of the student-athlete and to stress proper functions in relation to schools, players, and the public.

ARTICLE ONE | Responsibility To Players

1. Coaches shall be aware of the tremendous influence they have on the education of the student-athlete; therefore, they shall never place the value of winning above the value of instilling the highest ideals of character and integrity.
2. Coaches shall follow or create and enforce a set of training rules for players that reflect the positive values of abstaining from drugs, alcohol, and tobacco.
3. Coaches shall never place the value of winning over the safety and welfare of players.
4. Coaches shall not exert pressure on faculty members to give players special consideration.
5. Coaches shall show respect to all players by treating them with integrity and honesty in both verbal and nonverbal behavior, regardless of their role or contribution to the team.
6. Coaches are responsible for their players' actions on the field and must not permit them to perform with the intent of causing injury to opposing players.
7. Coaches shall not seek unfair advantage by teaching deliberate unsportsmanlike behavior to players; they shall instruct players to play within the written rules and within the spirit of the game at all times.

ARTICLE TWO | Professional Behavior

1. Coaches shall exemplify the highest moral character, behavior, and leadership.
2. Coaches shall display modesty in victory and be gracious in defeat.
3. Coaches shall promote ethical relationships among fellow coaches.
4. Prior to, and following contests, coaches for the competing teams should meet and exchange cordial greetings to set the correct tone for the event.

ARTICLE THREE | Sportsmanship

1. Coaches shall exhibit, model, and teach good sportsmanship.
2. Coaches shall exert their influence to enhance sportsmanship by spectators, both directly and by working closely with cheerleaders, pep clubs, booster groups, parents, and administrators.

ARTICLE FOUR | Scouting

It is considered ethical to scout opponents only during games and agreed upon scrimmages, and within the designated rules of the conference or section by-laws. The head coach is responsible for the actions of his scouts.

ARTICLE FIVE | Relationships With Game Officials

Coaches shall respect the integrity and judgment of the game official. Coaches shall not indulge in conduct which would incite players or spectators against officials. Public criticism of officials is considered unethical.

Hall of Fame nomination forms are submitted to the Football Coaches Association Officers and Hall of Fame Committee members. The selection committee meets each winter to review the Hall of Fame nominees and make selections.

The Hall of Fame inducts members into one of three divisions:

- 1 The Citation Division** honors support to the promotion of high school football over a long period of time.
- 2 The College Division** honors college football coaches, players, and support personnel who have achieved a standard of excellence over many years.
- 3 The High School Division** honors our football coaching colleagues who have spent the majority of their professional years serving the high school student athletes of Minnesota.

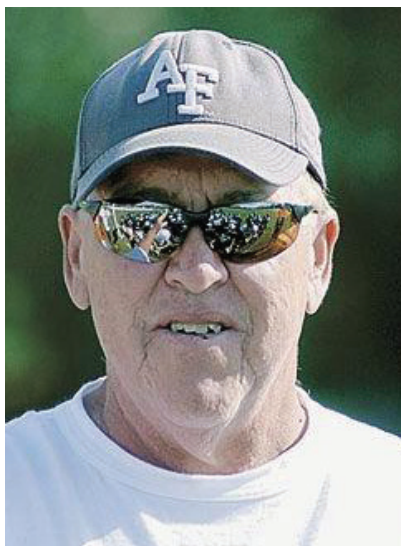

Bob Jackson

**Spring Lake Park & White Bear Lake

(posthumously)

Bob was a 1972 graduate of Winnebago High School in Winnebago, Minn. where he lettered in football and baseball. He then attended Mankato State University and earned his degree in Education. After graduation, he accepted his first high school teaching and head football coach positions in Belcourt, ND.

Bob then went on to coach and teach in Mabel, MN from 1978-1982, 1984, where his Mabel-Canton Cougars were the Conference Champions and made a State Tournament Appearance (Quarters) in 1981.

Bob was a Graduate Assistant at UW-River Falls in the Fall of 1983 and the University of Colorado in the Spring of 1984.

In 1985, he taught and coached the Spring Lake Park Panthers until 1993, earning a Conference Championship in 1988 and making State Appearances in 1991 (Class A State Champions) and 1992.

His last 19 years of his career were spent in White Bear Lake, where he was the athletic director and head football coach. While coaching the WBL Bears, Bob earned conference championships in 2000 and 2004. His team made State Tournament Appearances in 1997, 1998, 1999 and 2002. He left White Bear Lake as the winningest coach in school history with 123 wins and was inducted into the WBL Athletic Hall of Fame. Bob was a master of rebuilding struggling programs by putting emphasis on weight room and work ethic. He ended his head coaching career with 214 wins.

After retiring, Bob helped as an assistant coach at North Branch, Spring Lake Park and Wayzata.

Bob passed away at the age of 64 on March 31st, 2018. He is survived by his daughter, Lisa, his sister and 5 nieces and nephews.

Bob Jackson was a true leader of young men and women and instilled life skills of character, discipline and work ethic in each student who had the pleasure of interacting with him. If he wasn't working tirelessly to make sure the facilities were in pristine condition, he was covering the banquet costs for athletes who couldn't afford to attend. His teams were a reflection of his blue collar approach and demeanor. A humble man, he led by example, never drawing attention to himself, but leaving his mark on the lives of those he touched.
