ALCOHOL POSSESSION & CONSUMPTION

Alcoholic beverages, other than beer and wine, are not permitted in Boise City Parks. Beer and wine may be possessed or consumed within the Boise City parks except upon any street, parking lot, restroom, pathway, playground, swimming pool, community center, neighborhood center, skate park, archery range, cemetery, BMX facility, youth sports complex, Boise River Greenbelt (including the areas within 250' of the Boise River Greenbelt), C.W. Moore Park, Fairview Park, Julia Davis Park including the Rose Garden and Gene Harris Bandshell, Kathryn Albertson Park, McAuley Park, Memorial Park, Platt Gardens, Riverside Park, and Shoreline Park.

Beer/wine is allowed, in the following restricted areas by permit only, in conjunction with a facility reservation or scheduled Boise Parks & Recreation (BPR) activity. These locations include Ann Morrison Old Timer's Shelter, Borah Shelter (large), Capitol Park, Esther Simplot Central and West Pavilions, Julia Davis Agriculture and Boise Pavilions, Esther Simplot Pavilions and Pier, Marianne Williams Gazebo, Kristin Armstrong Municipal Shelter and Picnic Sites #4 Sweet Gum, #6 Poplar and #7 Ash. Distribution or sale of beer and wine, in Boise City parks, is allowed only as local and state laws and regulations allow. Caterers, serving beer or wine, must secure a Liquor Catering Permit from the Boise City Clerk's Office (208)384.3710.

BEER/WINE PERMITS

A permit is required for the individual possession of more than 7 1/2 gallons of beer and/or wine on park properties or for any quantity at Ann Morrison Shelter, Borah Shelter (large), Esther Simplot Pavilions and Pier, Julia Davis Park (Prohibited at Rose Garden and the Gene Harris Bandshell), Kristin Armstrong Municipal Shelter and picnic sites #4 Sweet Gum, #6 Poplar and #7 Ash, Marianne Williams Gazebo. (Pony keg = 7 3/4 gal., 3 cases = 6 3/4 gal.)

BEER/WINE PERMIT FEE: \$10.00 (Non-refundable, one-time use)

For processing, print the completed application, sign and mail, fax, or scan and email to the address provided above at least one (1) working day prior to the beer and wine function.

This permit is for drop-in use. Park services, facilities and restrooms are not guaranteed. Beer/Wine Permit must be visible while on park property.

BEER/WINE PERMIT POLICIES

1. It is understood that all state, county, and city laws in regard to alcoholic beverages will be obeyed.
2. It is understood those under the age of twenty-one (21) years of age will not be allowed to consume or possess beer and wine.
3. It is understood that beer and wine will not be sold or vended in any fashion, or be the basis to solicit donations, contributions or any form of payment.
4. It is understood those participating in beer and wine functions will remain orderly in accordance with BCC 6-1-10 (Disorderly Conduct)
5. All laws are strictly enforced. All persons attending a beer and wine function are subject to park policies. Offenders are subject to ejection from the park and/or prosecution. Should persons be ejected from the park or otherwise cited for violations of any activity associated with the beer and wine use, the permit may be revoked by the responding officer, the beer and wine confiscated, and/or the group disbanded. In the event the beer and wine use authorized by this permit results in the violation of any of the permit conditions, the individual representative and the group named on this permit will not be granted another permit for a one-year period from the date of the infraction.
6. It is understood that participants in the beer and wine function or gathering will be expected to leave the area clean and without litter. Failure to do so will constitute a misdemeanor.
7. The applicant will be responsible for the actions of the participants and is required to be present with this permit during the entire time of the beer and wine function. Should the applicant leave the area of the beer and wine function, for any purposes, this permit is revoked.
8. This permit provides a means of police enforcement of group activities in Boise City parks. The Boise Parks & Recreation Department and the City of Boise assume no liability for the negligence of any individual which results from alcohol consumption.
9. Permit applications shall be signed by the group representative who will be responsible for the actions of the participants who may be held liable for park damage, restoration, and/or cleanup costs.
10. Permits issued in conjunction with reservations are valid only during the date and time period listed on the reservation permit.

GENERAL PARK POLICIES

Park policies are posted at restrooms and shelters and are strictly enforced according to Articles & Chapter 13-03 of the Boise City Code. For a complete list of the Boise City Code visit www.cityofboise.org. For more parks related information visit <http://parks.cityofboise.org/>.

CANOPY, TENT OR KIOSK

Placement requires approval from BPR prior to event. All canopies will be weighted instead of staked to avoid damage to electrical, irrigation and water lines. Contact Boise Fire Department, Fire Code Enforcement at (208) 570-6572 to obtain a permit for tents, canopies, and awnings over 200 square ft. per structure. U.F.C. Article 32, B.F.D. Tent Permit.

CLEANLINESS

Cleanliness is the responsibility of all park users. Deposit trash in the receptacles provided. If trash receptacles are full, trash is to be removed from the park by the user.

- Cooking grease must be caught and properly disposed.
- Dispose of used briquettes in fire rings or fireplaces.
- Confetti, bird seed, popcorn, rice, etc. is prohibited. Bubbles are acceptable.
- Decorations may be attached only by tying to metal, wooden, or stone structures or must be self-supporting. All decorations must be removed at the end of the event.

DOGS

Dogs are not permitted in Kristin Armstrong Municipal Park, Marianne Williams Park, Platt Garden, Boise Depot Plaza and all areas by the "Big Mike" train/display, Simplot Sports Complex, during softball games at Willow Lane, or at Optimist Youth Sports Complex and Charles F. McDevitt Youth Sports Complex during posted seasons. Dogs are banned from Kathryn Albertson Park from March 1 through June 30. Dogs must be leashed (maximum of 8 feet in length) at all other sites. Dog owners are required to clean up after their pets. Do not allow pets to harass, stalk or chase waterfowl or other animals.

ELECTRICAL POWER

Electrical power is available with a reservation at all reserved sites except C.W. Moore Park, Esther Simplot Friendship Is. And Pier, Julia Davis Rose Garden, Kathryn Albertson Park and Marianne Williams Gazebo. Please use only one appliance per outlet. Groups overloading circuits resulting in an on-site visit to reset circuits will be charged a fee of \$35.00.

GLASS BEVERAGE CONTAINERS

Glass beverage containers are prohibited.

PARK HOURS

Parks are open from sunrise to sunset except Julia Davis.

PARKING

Parking is limited to designated areas and is available on a first-come, first-served basis. Vehicles parked in NO PARKING areas or left in the park after sunset will be towed at owners' risk and expense. Contact: Boise Valley Towing (208) 389-9707. **NO VEHICLES ON THE TURF!**

SALES

A license from the city of Boise and a permit from the BPR are required to sell or rent products or services in Boise City parks.

SMOKING

Smoking is prohibited in Boise City parks, facilities and within 20 yards of the Greenbelt per City Code. Exceptions include designated smoking areas in Ann Morrison and Julia Davis Park and Warm Springs Golf Course

SOUND AMPLIFICATION

Sound must not exceed 62 decibels at a distance of 20 ft. except as authorized by written permit.

SPEED

The speed limit within parks is 15 mph, unless otherwise posted.

TREES

It is unlawful for any person to cut, injure, deface or damage any tree on park property. No signs or related hardware (ropes, wires, nails, etc.) are to be attached to any tree. Animals or bicycles shall not be attached or tied/locked to trees. No chemicals, cleaners, pesticides, or other liquids are to be deposited near trees. BBQ's, portable gas grills, heat generating equipment, or materials shall not be placed near any tree trunks or under the branches of any tree.

KRISTIN ARMSTRONG MUNICIPAL PARK

500 S Walnut St

(15 Acre Special Use)

Kristine Armstrong Municipal Park is located on the Boise River just southeast of downtown; south of Warm Springs Road and east of Park Boulevard, next to Idaho Fish & Game. (East on Warm Springs Ave., Right on Walnut St., park is on the left side of the street).

NO DOGS ALLOWED IN KRISTIN ARMSTRONG MUNICIPAL PARK

RESERVABLE: One shelter and ten (10) open shaded picnic areas. (Private Rentals)

CAPACITY: 150 per site/2000 for entire park/seating capacity 50-75 per site

PICNIC FACILITIES: **Tables, BBQ, Water**
Shelter - Two (2)-18' and two (2)-20' seating tables, one (1)-12' kids seating and one (1)-9' serving - all are permanent, in concrete slabs. (Seating for approx. 75.) 4' grill. Hose Bib not available to public. Drinking fountain in vicinity.
***BEER/WINE and/or AMPLIFIED SOUND PERMITTED WITH RESERVATION AND PERMIT ONLY.**
Silver Maple #1 - Three (3)-27' seating and one (1)-12' serving in concrete slab. (Seating for approx. 60). Stone fireplace available for cooking.
Chestnut #2 - Three (3)-20' seating (seating for approx. 60 per site) and one (1)-10' serving; concrete slabs. Stone fireplace and BBQ.
Willow #3 - Three (3)-20' seating (seating for approx. 60) and one (1)-12' serving, in concrete slab. Fireplace with grill insert for cooking.
Sweet Gum #4 - Three (3)-20' seating (seating for approx. 60) and one (1)-12' serving, in concrete slab. Double BBQ grill for cooking. (approx. 6'long x 2'wide).
*** BEER/WINE PERMITTED WITH RESERVATION AND PERMIT ONLY.**
Sugar Maple #5 - Ten (10)-6' seating (seating for approx. 60 per site) and stone fireplace with grill insert for cooking. (No concrete slabs.) Drinking fountain
Poplar #6 - Three (3)-20' seating (seating for approx. 60 per site) and one (1)-10' serving; concrete slabs. Stone fireplace with grill insert.
*** BEER/WINE PERMITTED WITH RESERVATION AND PERMIT ONLY.**
Ash #7 - Three (3)-20' seating (seating for approx. 60 per site) and one (1)-10' serving; concrete slabs. Stone fireplace and BBQ.
*** BEER/WINE PERMITTED WITH RESERVATION AND PERMIT ONLY.**
Burr Oak #8 - Three (3)-20' seating (seating for approx. 60 per site) and one (1)-10' serving; concrete slabs. Stone fireplace with grill insert. Drinking fountain
Pin Oak #9 - Nine (9) pedestal tables, (3'x3' in dimension) in concrete slabs. (Seating for approx. 50 per site) Double BBQ grills. (approx. 6'long x 2'wide).
Linden #10 - Eight (8) pedestal tables, (3'x3' in dimension) in concrete slabs. (Seating for approx. 50 per site) Double BBQ grills. (approx. 6'long x 2'wide).
Power: All sites have four (4)-110v outlets with 20 amp breakers at each site, *except* site #7, which has two (2)-110v outlets. Located just northeast of the shelter are the amplified sound barrier walls. These are equipped with two (2) - 110v outlets with 20 amp breakers. Shelter has automatic lights.

OTHER FACILITIES/AMENITIES **Drinking Fountains:** Five (5) drinking fountains are located throughout the park. All fountains have hose bibs except the one located at the shelter. Hose bibs are not for public use.
Playground: Combo playground located between ball field and shelter/parking lot, appropriate for ages 2-12.
Recreation: One (1) softball diamond (available on first-come, first-serve basis), Boise River and Greenbelt, and MK Nature Center. Two (2) bocce courts are available by reservation or on a first come, first served basis.
Tables: Portable tables are also scattered throughout the park for drop in use.

RESTROOMS: **Shelter:** Three (3) stalls for women and three (3) stalls for men. Operated on photo cell, open year-round.
Playground: Three (3) stalls for women and three (3) stalls for men. Operated on photo cell, open mid-April to mid-October.

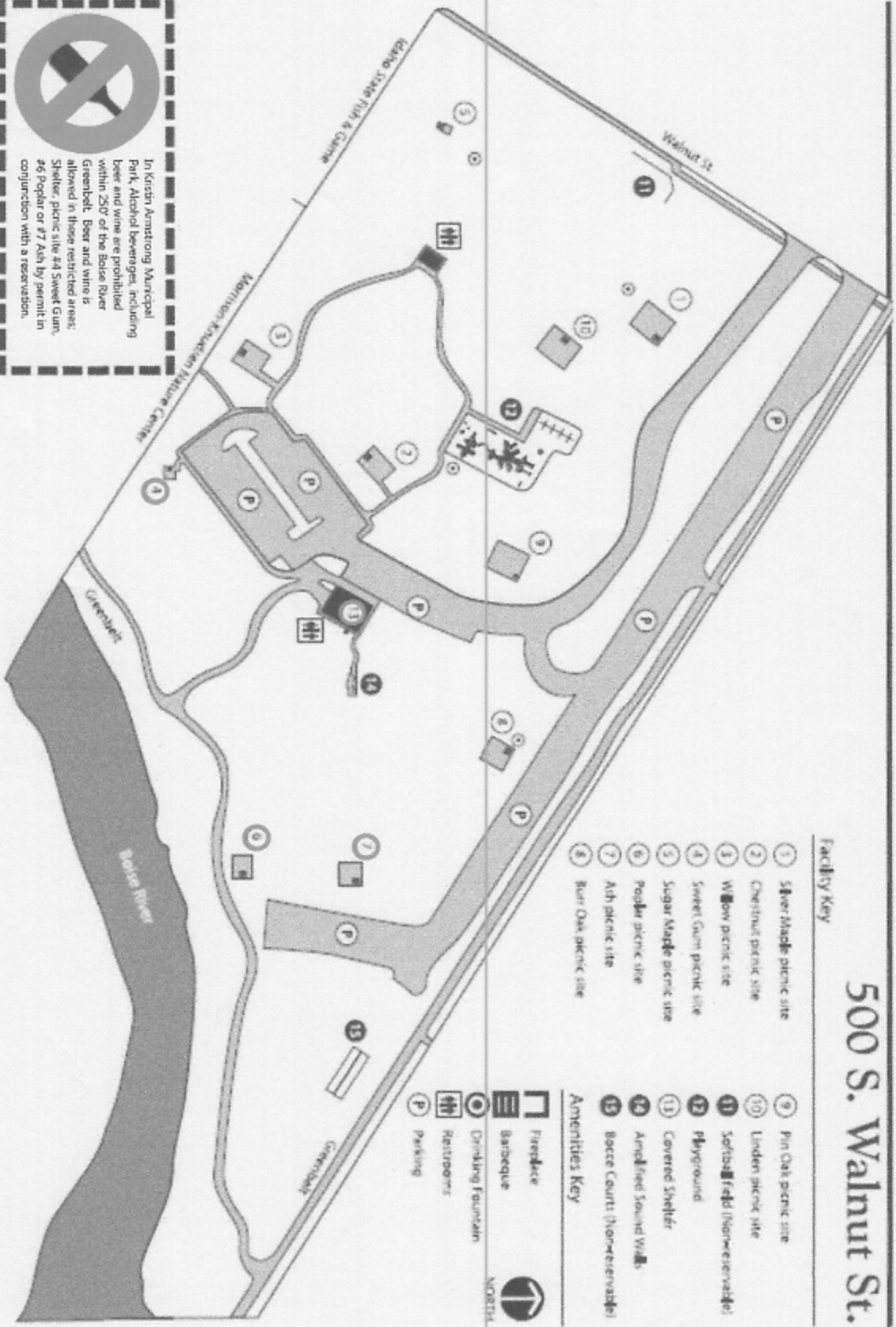
PARKING: Approximately 296 spaces. Seventy-one (71) designated regular parking, five (5) are ADA accessible and two hundred twenty (220) spaces are on the roadway throughout the park. Parking is limited to designated areas and is available on a first come first serve basis. **Vehicles parked in NO PARK areas will be towed at owners risk and expense. Boise Valley Towing**

PUBLIC PHONE: MK-Nature Center.

***Accessible Areas:** Shelter - Drinking fountain at the shelter - (sinks and counters at shelter rest rooms.) - Access to Greenbelt - parking and access to shelter; shelter restrooms; Parking lot; Pathway from parking lot to playground. Sites #1, #2, #3, #4, #6, #7, #8 and the shelter all have wheel chair accessible tables.

In Kristin Armstrong Municipal Park, Alcohol beverages, including beer and wine are prohibited within 250' of the Boise River Greenbelt. Beer and wine is allowed in those restricted areas: Shelter, picnic site #4 Sweet Gum, #6 Poplar or #7 Ash by permit in conjunction with a reservation.
