Hello BVBIA Colorado Families!

Welcome to another Fall season – we're so excited to have you here. It is already looking to be another amazing season of youth soccer!

In August, we held a pre-season camp led by BVBIA Colorado coaching staff and guest Coach David Flavius, who is a former Saint Lucian National Team player and current Director of Coaching for BVBIA Pittsburgh. The Club had teams compete in two pre-season tournaments: Pride of the Rockies in Colorado Springs and the Broomfield Shootout in Broomfield, Colorado.

Over the summer, the Club had some staffing changes. Nathan Walker joined the BVBIA Colorado Family as the new Executive Director. Our Club's founding Director of Coaching, Nancy Sibley, stepped down after three years of dedicated service, and Coach Kirstin Gungler was selected as her replacement. Pueblo continues to be led by Director of Coaching Drew Irwin. We also welcomed our new Registrar, Madeline Case, to the family.

We would like to take a moment and remind parents and families of some important information:

Severe weather: Severe weather is always a risk, and we here in Colorado are no strangers to it. The safety of our players, staff, and families are one of the top concerns, which is why we adhere to the Club's Severe Weather Policy. While lightning is a fading concern later in the season, we follow the 10-mile rule – if lightning is detected or reported within 10 miles, all players, staff, and families must seek shelter in their vehicles or an enclosed building and remain there until no lightning has been detected for 30 minutes. Keep an eye on social media, your email, and SportsEngine for messages from your coaches or other club staff concerning severe weather and any schedule changes.

Remember the 24-hour rule: BVBIA Colorado asks that parents who have concerns or issues they would like to raise with their player's coach wait at least 24 hours before reaching out to your player's coach – in the heat of the moment, regretful words could be exchanged, but waiting 24 hours allows cooler heads to prevail.

Zero tolerance for disrespectful behavior: BVBIA Colorado has no tolerance for any Club player, staff member, coach, or family member being disrespectful towards any coach, referee, player, parent, spectator, or staff member. Repeated offenses of this policy can result in suspension or dismissal from the Club, and potentially even sanctions from the Colorado Soccer Association.

In April 2023, BVBIA Colorado held a School of Excellence ID camp, looking for the best talent in the Club to represent Colorado at the BVB International Academy Western Region ID event. From the 35 players who tried out, 19 were selected to join the BVBIA Colorado Elite Academy.

12 of these players travelled to Seattle, Washington, in June 2023 to attend the BVBIA Western Region ID event. While there, our players competed in personal and team skills against more than 70 BVBIA players from El Paso, Texas (BVBIA El Paso/Borderland), Tucson, Arizona (BVBIA Arizona), and Seattle, Washington (BVBIA Washington).

Players at the BVBIA Western Region event were either selected to join the BVBIA Western Region Tournament team (Regional Pool – RP) or were offered the opportunity to compete again at the BVBIA National Event Pool (NEP) in Dallas, TX, in December 2023.

The BVBIA School of Excellence program was started in 2019 and is an integral part of the real and authentic professional player pathway that BVB International Academy provides for players from all of the BVBIA clubs across the US and Canada.
