Pastor's Message

The deacon's role beyond Mass involves consoling the sick and those who are grieving and assisting people on their faith journey, especially those who are struggling with their faith or issues with the Church.

The Catholic deacon is so much more than an assistant at the altar. Deacon Gerry celebrates the majority of Baptisms in our parishes. He not only assists at funerals, but preaches at half of them, provides the rites at burials / internments, and officiates at weddings that do not include the Eucharist.

Cullen Gallagher will be ordained on Saturday, May 24, at the Cathedral as a transitional deacon (meaning that he will be ordained a priest in about one year) and shares in Deacon Gerry's mission of service. The Catechism of the Catholic Church (1570) states, "The sacrament of Holy Orders marks them with an imprint ('character') which cannot be removed and which configures them to Christ, who made himself the 'deacon' or servant of all."

He was known for his love of the poor and supplying them miraculously with food. Isidore is the patron of farmers and rural communities, and his feast is celebrated on May 15.
