### MATCH PREVIEW

After a brief midweek diversion from Central Division play, Indy Eleven gets back to divisional action Sunday evening against Sporting KC II at Children's Mercy Park, the site of Eleven Interim Head Coach Max Rogers' win on his debut as the sideline boss back on June 20.

Rogers has plenty to sort out with his squad leading up to Sunday's tilt, coming off a disappointing 1-4 defeat at Loudoun United on Wednesday evening. In that match, the same starting XI that was very much on the same page throughout Indy's 2-1 win over OKC Energy FC last weekend got another run out, but the continuity Rogers' was looking for disappeared after the opening 15 minutes, and a pair of concessions at the close of the first half put the Boys in Blue in a hole they couldn't dig out from.

Heading into that 2-1 triumph for the Eleven in late June, Sporting KC II had been showing signs of competing in a stacked Central by garnering at least a point from five of its first nine matches. However, it's been a summer of struggle ever since, with SKC II going IW-9L-ID since the June 20 meeting: that includes a current five-game overall losing streak and a five-game losing streak at Children Mercy Park, during which they've been outscored by visitors 14-6.

After allowing four goals in each of its last three contests, SKC might find some small solace in the fact that those matches came against the Central's top three teams. With further mining, another "glass half full" approach can be presented by the fact that Sporting has indeed hit the back of the net in each of the five losses in its current streak, three of which ended on 2-1 scorelines.

With six different SKC II players scoring as many goals in those last five games, that leaves Indy's lineup needing to ensure its focus on individuals is not outsized. However, that may only help an Eleven side that needs to collectively dial it up a notch in an attempt to once again overcome a touch of adversity during the long Championship campaign.

Indy Eleven heads to the Kansas side of the Kansas City Metro this weekend looking to stay perfect against Sporting KC II on the season and all-time on the road. Indy collected a 3-1 win against then Swope Park Rangers in April 2019 to start the two sides' all-time series on a winning note, and, after contesting all four games in their 2020 series at Lucas Oil Stadium, renewed acquaintances in Kansas earlier this season with a 2-1 triumph on June 20 that marked the debut of Interim Head Coach Max Rogers.

In all, Indy Eleven has dominated the series with SKC II, collecting a 6W-2L-OD mark and 14-8 advantage in goals scored. After Sunday's meeting, the squads will end their season series at Carroll Stadium - where Indy began this year's series with a 2-0 win on May 22 - on Sept. 11.

### INDY ELEVEN FALLS 4-1 AT LOUDOUN UNITED FC

A late finish by defender Karl Ouimette could only salvage a scratching of the scoreboard for Indy Eleven, which fell on the road 4-l in an inter-division affair at Loudoun United FC Wednesday evening.

The result kept Indiana's Team in fourth-place in the crowded middle of the Central Division standings, still even with FC Tulsa and OKC Energy FC on 22 points and three points behind third-place Atlanta United 2.

### INDY ELEVEN BREAKS HOME WINLESS SPELL IN 2-1 VICTORY OVER OKC ENERGY FC

Indy Eleven got its mojo back at home last Saturday, using connections between forwards Nicky Law in the first half and Manuel Arteaga in the second to post a 2-1 win over OKC Energy FC in front of an appreciative crowd at IUPUI Carroll Stadium.

The much-needed three points not only bumped Indiana's Team off a six-game winless spell at "The Mike," it also bumped the Eleven up the Central Division standings. The Boys in Blue now sit on 22 points, even with Energy FC and FC Tulsa in a crowded middle of the Central table, with Tulsa currently holding the tiebreaker on wins

### NICKY LAW NAMED TO USL CHAMPIONSHIP TEAM OF THE WEEK FOR WEEK 17

Veteran midfielder Nicky Law is the fourth member of Indiana's Team to be named to the USL Championship Team of the Week presented by Cleer Audio this season, earning the honor for his impressive display in Indy Eleven's 2-1 home win against OKC Energy FC last Saturday.

Law is the first member of the Boys in Blue to be selected to the league's Best XI since Week 10, when defender Neveal Hackshaw earned his first nod of the year for a goal and assist in Indy's 3-3 stunner at Louisville City FC. Forwards Jordan Hamilton and Gordon Wild were the first two members of Indiana's Team to make TOTW appearances this season with back-to-back placements in Weeks 5 and 6, while goal-keeper Bobby Edwards and defender A.J. Cochran earned "honorable mentions" in Week 9 and Week 2, respectively.

#### INDY ELEVEN SIGNS QUARTET TO USL ACADEMY CONTRACTS

Indy Eleven added four new players to its roster via USL Academy contracts, including the youngest such signing in USL Championship history on Monday, August 9. The four new Boys in Blue are midfielders Diego Sanchez, Alann Torres, and Aiden Benitez and defender Ecris Revolorio, with Benitez taking the title of youngest player in USL Championship history at 14 years, three months and 26 days of age.

All four of Indy Eleven's new academy signings are local products, with each calling Westfield-based Indiana Fire Juniors Academy their home on the club side. Three of the four - Torres (Elkhart, Ind.), Sanchez (Indianapolis, Ind.) and Revolorio (Evansville, Ind.; IUPUI commit for 2022) - have already represented Indiana's Team in USL Academy League play, just part of the groundwork that was laid in working towards signing with the first team.

### OH CAPTAINS, OUR CAPTAINS

Speaking of Ayoze and Karl Ouimette, the veteran duo were named this week as the team's Captain and Vice-Captain, respectively, for the 2021 season. Ayoze has more than earned the right to wear the captain's armband, the 35-year-old Spaniard serving as the elder-statesman of the squad and the heart of the soul of the team's on-field pulse. Backing him up will be the 28-year-old Quebec native Ouimette, who is taking the field for his tenth professional campaign in 2021. With Ayoze sitting out the season opener in Birmingham, it was Ouimette who was the first to don the armband for the Boys in Blue in 2021. Ayoze made his first appearance as captain after returning to the Starting XI on May 22 vs. Sporting Kansas City II.

#### WHO WHO WHO'S ... HOOSIERS

This year's squad has plenty of Hoosier State representation, with four players coming "Back Home Again" to Indiana (if you will). The three native Hoosiers new to the team are Auburn's own Rece Buckmaster, Bloomington native Jeremiah Gutjahr, and the pride of "The Region" in Crown Point's Alex Svetanoff. ### STEP (BACK) UP TO "THE MIKE"

The May 8 home opener vs. Tulsa marked Indy Eleven's official return home to IUPUI's Michael A. Carroll Stadium, which Indiana's Team called home for its first four seasons of existence from 2014-17 (marking the squad's entire "NASL era"). In all, more than 620,000 fans and supporters filed into Carroll Stadium for a combined 70 regular season, postseason, Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup, and exhibition contests between 2014-2019, adding a new and electric atmosphere to Indianapolis' thriving sports scene along the way. Though the match was team's official return to "The Mike", it was not its first USL Championship games in the venue, as Indy Eleven hosted a pair of Eastern Conference Playoffs contests at Carroll Stadium in 2019.

#### **CENTRAL FOCUS**

After competing against a necessarily condensed slate of competition in 2020, Indy Eleven will expand its opposition horizons this year as a member of the eight-team Central Division, highlighted by the presence of archrival Louisville City FC. The new grouping also includes Atlanta United 2, Birmingham Legion FC, Memphis 901 FC, OKC Energy FC, FC Tulsa, and Sporting Kansas City. Indy Eleven will face each division foe four times throughout the 32-game season.

The squad's four match-ups against out-of-division opposition include several marquee matchups, featuring games against 2019 USL Championship title winner Real Monarchs SLC, two-time defending Western Conference runner-up El Paso Locomotive FC, perennial Eastern Conference contender Pittsburgh Riverhounds SC, and Eastern up-and-comer Loudoun United FC.

#### NEW YEAR. NEW GEAR

Not only is the bulk of the roster new for 2021, but so are the kits Indiana's Team will suit up in after the organization made the jump to global sports apparel giant and USL Championship partner PUMA in February. The squad debuted their new secondary white kits on May I in Birmingham and lived up to their "Boys in Blue" moniker for the first time this season at home vs. FC Tulsa on May 8.

The season opener at Birmingham on Saturday, May 1 marked 210 days between regular season games for Indiana's Team - nearly SEVEN MONTHS since last year's regular season finale at Saint Louis FC on October 3, marking the longest break ever between games in the Eleven's now eight-season history.
