PROMISING SCHOLARSHIPS FOR THE FUTURE THROUGH THE TILLER LEGACY CAMPAIGN

Greetings from West Lafayette! If you remember Joe Tiller and this is one of your first messages from us, please allow for an explanation and peruse the attached newsletter.

The National Football Foundation's Joe Tiller Chapter of Northwest Indiana asks you to help make Joe's legacy meaningful and everlasting by endowing scholarships into perpetuity and honoring Joe's dedication to recognizing the accomplishments of young scholar athletes.

The chapter's Board of Directors launched "2025 Drive" in 2017 hoping to raise at least \$500,000 for a scholarship endowment in order to use the annual interest to cover the chapter's scholarship commitments far into the future. Can you help us financially or by making phone calls or serving on a fund-raising committee as we continue the renamed "Tiller Legacy Campaign" and complete our goal within a few years?

This 501 c-3 foundation was renamed the Joe Tiller Chapter of Northwest Indiana in 2007 in honor of Joe becoming Purdue's winningest football coach ever. After receiving its charter in 2004, the chapter (which is NOT part of Purdue University) has become the largest chapter in Indiana and, at one point, was the second largest in the nation. It now ranks seventh among the NFF's 120 chapters.

In partnership with local media outlets, this chapter offers recognition for male and female scholar-athletes (nominated by their schools) after graduation from 75+ high schools in Northwest Indiana. In its first 21 years, this chapter has recognized 581 student athletes, awarding scholarships to many of them following high school for use during their second semester of college. The chapter has distributed more than \$315,000 in scholarship funds and honored nearly 120 individuals for their community and area accomplishments during our annual NFF Honors Dinners or Brunches. The chapter has also raised nearly \$110,000 for charities, mostly for Purdue's Institute for Cancer Research in the

WILL YOU HELP SECURE THE TILLER LEGACY?

Thanks to Arnette Tiller's generous gift of Joe's Rose Bowl ring, watch and other wonderful memorabilia items from 25 years ago and the response from several loyal Purdue fans, the Tiller Chapter now has an opportunity to secure Coach Tiller's legacy in Lafayette and State of Indiana.

In conjunction with the Rose Bowl Reunion last fall, Coach Tiller's wife donated about 30 of Joe's Rose Bowl memorabilia items to the Tiller Chapter for sales or auctions to benefit the Tiller Scholarship Endowment, which the chapter established at Joe's permission shortly before his passing. So far, those sales (plus the sales of previous items donated by Arnette eight years ago) have netted more than \$41,000 and allowed the chapter to reach to \$275,000 mark in its goal of raising \$500,000 for the endowment to forever fund the scholarship program and the existence of the chapter named in Joe's honor.

The chapter received more than \$304,000 in donations for scholarships and endowments over the eight years since creating the "Drive 2025" campaign, but we failed to meet the original goal. ... So, the chapter's new "Tiller Legacy Campaign" aims to reach the \$500,000 goal in time for the chapter's 25th anniversary in 2029.

name of Tyler Trent.

Also, each dues-paying NFF member receives a ballot in the selection process for the College Football Hall of Fame, a feature that helped elect six former Purdue All-Americans and two coaches to the HOF in the last 20 years. In addition, this chapter has successfully inducted 21 former Boilermakers and several area high school coaches and players into the Indiana FB Hall of Fame since 2012.

Fundraising to support these efforts is generated through sales of tickets, memorabilia, advertising, sponsorship and donations, but those sources have diminished due to changes in our economy and in IRS rules.

Other NFF chapters (like the Moose Krause Chapter near Notre Dame) have successfully established endowments to support future commitments. We are confident you will help us do the same for the Tiller Chapter. Thanks largely to the

HOW ABOUT ENDOWING A NAMED SCHOLARSHIP?

To reach our goal of a \$500,000 endowment, we are offering named scholarships for donors, businesses and groups of supporters during this "Tiller Legacy Campaign" at two levels.

With a commitment of \$50,000, you or your group can get an individual name, family name, your business or your group on an endowed scholarship worth \$1,500 awarded each year to a different high school scholar-athlete for his or her second semester of college.

A \$30,000 commitment allows for a scholarship worth \$750 to be "named" after a group, like Tiller's Walk-ons or Tiller's Defensive Ends or Tiller's Assistants or Tiller's Knuckleheads or Tiller's _____ (you fill in the blank).

The scholarships will be awarded every year by the Tiller Scholarship Fund and announced in the chapter newsletter, on our website and at the NFF Honors Brunch or some other public event.

Payments into the fund could be spread out over several years ... or could become part of the donors will.

Also, part of the earned interest each year will be used to increase the value of the endowment to compensate for inflation and increase the scholarship payment incrementally into the future.

WANT TO DOUBLE THE IMPACT OF YOUR DONATION?

With permission from key memorabilia buyers, the Tiller Chapter has added the \$41,000+ netted from Arnette's donations to the previous \$100,000 given by an anonymous football player to increase our matching-gift program to \$141,000. Those funds will be used to encourage former Boilermaker players, coaches and athletic department staff members to "double their impact" as they endow scholarships within the Tiller Scholarship Endowment at the Community Foundation of Greater Lafayette.

Starting with a minimum gift of \$500, you can take advantage of this matching-gift program. A donation of \$500 will count as \$1,000 toward an endowment; a gift of \$5,000 will count as \$10,000; a commitment of \$10,000 will count as \$20,000; and so on until the \$141,000+ is fully exhausted ... or until we receive additional funds earmarked for the matching-gift program.

If you are interested in taking advantage of this offer with a timely donation, please use the form on the next column to commit to a plan and timetable, hopefully to be completed by 2029.

This offer is primarily available to former players, coaches and athletic staff members but, at some point in 2027, could be extended to chapter members, fans, businesses and members of the community.

WANT TO MAXIMIZE YOUR IMPACT VIA YOUR RMD?

As you have conversations with your tax advisor – and if you have reached age 73 – you might want to consider that the easiest and most sensible ways to donate is through sharing part of your RMD (Required Minimum Distribution) and avoiding some taxes.

This is a powerful giving strategy that can help you support the "Tiller Legacy Campaign" of this National Football Foundation chapter while also optimizing your tax situation.

If you've reached that magical age of 73 (or older) and are taking Required Minimum Distributions (RMDs) from your IRA, you may want to consider making a **Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD)** directly from your IRA to the Tiller Endowment at the Community Foundation. A QCD allows you to transfer up to **\$111,000 per year (per individual)** directly to a qualified charity without recognizing the amount as taxable income.

Reasons to consider a QCD:

- **Reduce taxable income:** A QCD is excluded from your adjusted gross income (AGI), so it won't increase your taxable income the way a standard RMD would.
- **Potentially lower Medicare premiums:** Lower AGI may help you avoid higher Medicare Part B and D premiums that are tied to income thresholds.
- **Reduce taxes on Social Security benefits:** A lower AGI can also reduce the portion of your Social Security benefits that is subject to tax.
- **Satisfy your RMD requirement:** A QCD can count toward all or part of your RMD for the year, helping you meet IRS requirements in a tax-efficient way.

This strategy is especially helpful for donors who take the standard deduction and might otherwise see little benefit from itemizing charitable gifts.

DATES SET FOR 2026 HONORS BRUNCH AND TYLER TRENT GOLF OUTING

The 22nd annual NFF Honors Brunch "Celebrating Our Legends" will be held on Sunday, June 14, at the Purdue Memorial Union Ballrooms, featuring scholar-athletes and community high-achievers from throughout Northwest Indiana.

This event usually draws a crowd of between 350 and 450 people and is co-hosted with the Lafayette Journal & Courier. Student honorees are nominated by the 75-plus high schools in the 20 counties between Montgomery County and Lake Michigan. Community awards nominations are submitted by members of the Tiller Chapter and the communities throughout Northwest Indiana. Readers of this newsletter are also encouraged to nominate candidates for the various awards shown on pages 4-6 of this publication. Panels of judges decide the winners. Tickets will go on sale in late March.

Also on the schedule is the 6th annual Tyler Trent Golf Outing, slated this year for Friday, Sept. 4, at Coyote Crossing Golf Club. This event usually draws between 60 and 85 golfers with proceeds going to the Purdue Institute for Cancer Research in honor of Tyler Trent, a Purdue student who died in 2019 following a valiant battle with cancer. Registrations will be accepted starting in July.

The Tiller Chapter is also trying to schedule an event locally with Drew Brees to celebrate his induction into the Pro Football Hall of Fame and the Indiana Football Hall of Fame. Drew lives in Southern California but makes occasional trips to Indiana for business purposes so we are hoping to get an event scheduled in the Lafayette area soon. Drew's commitments to coaching his four active children in their various sports keeps him very busy, but hopefully he'll find time to commit to a day or evening in the spring, summer or fall when we could stage an event for our members and the community in general. Greater Lafayette Commerce has expressed interest in helping us host that event. More details to come.

BREES CHOSEN FOR INDUCTION INTO PRO FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME; CHAPTER PLANS SPECIAL EVENT IN WEST LAFAYETTE TO HONOR DREW

Drew Brees, a Purdue Boilermaker and one of the greatest quarterbacks of all-time, has been announced as an inductee for the Pro Football Hall of Fame. A first-ballot Hall of Famer, Brees joins Roger Craig, Larry Fitzgerald, Luke Kuechly and Adam Vinatieri in the class of 2026. The announcement was made at NFL Honors, the league's primetime end-of-season awards show, Feb. 5 in San Francisco.

Brees will become the fifth Boilermaker to be enshrined in the Pro Football Hall of Fame alongside Len Dawson (1987), Bob Griese (1990), Hank Stram (2003) and Rod Woodson (2009). The 2026 Pro Football Hall of Fame induction ceremony will take place in Canton, Ohio, in August.

John Purdue Club and President's Council Lifetime members will receive priority access to VIP Enshrinement offerings, including official ticket purchasing opportunities, exclusive Purdue events celebrating Brees, and local hotel accommodations from Aug. 7-9. More details to come soon to those who qualify.

In addition, Brees has been selected for induction into the Indiana Football Hall of Fame, presented by the Indiana Football Coaches Association. That induction will occur during an event planned by the Joe Tiller Chapter of the National Football Foundation. The chapter is in conversation with Brees to find a time to honor him for both awards in the West Lafayette area within the next half year or so, depending on his busy schedule. NFF chapter members and sponsors will receive first priority to participate in that event. Stay tuned.

A Super Bowl MVP and Walter Payton NFL Man of the Year, Brees retired in 2020, which made the class of 2026 his first year of eligibility for the Pro Football Hall of Fame. He set five NFL records throughout his career: completions (7,142), 5,000-yard passing seasons (5), consecutive games with a touchdown pass (54), most touchdown passes in a game (7) and the highest single-season completion percentage (74.4). He also still ranks second in NFL history in passing touchdowns (571) and passing yards (80,358), while ranking third in completion percentage (67.7) and fourth in wins (172).

Brees was drafted by the San Diego Chargers in 2001, spending five seasons with the team before joining the New Orleans Saints. While in New Orleans, Brees broke nearly all of the organization's statistical passing records, and he led the Saints to victory in Super Bowl XLIV (2009). As a Saint, he was a two-time NFL Offensive Player of the Year, five-time All-Pro and 13-time Pro Bowler. Before his incredible NFL career, Brees rewrote the record books at Purdue. He

Selection process: Nominations are accepted in early winter from high school coaches and/or administrators in the counties covered by this NFF chapter. Nominations are evaluated by the Scholar-Athlete Committee, which recommends at least one recipient per year. This recommendation must be ratified by the Board of Directors and the presentation should be made at the annual Honors Dinner. Other nominees will also be recognized at the Honors Dinner, Reception or Brunch..

arrived in West Lafayette as a little-known quarterback and left as one of the most-decorated players in school history, setting two NCAA records, 13 Big Ten Conference records and 19 Purdue records. On the Big Ten career lists, he still ranks first in completions (1,026) and passing yards (11,792) and second in passing attempts (1,678), passing touchdowns (90) and total offense (12,692).

The Boilermaker QB was a two-time Heisman Trophy finalist, two-time Big Ten Offensive Player of the Year and two-time first team all-conference selection. Brees also won the 2000 Maxwell Award as the nation’s outstanding player, the 1999 Socrates Award as the nation’s top scholar-athlete and the “Chicago Tribune” Silver Football as the Big Ten Most Valuable Player. That same year, he broke his own total offense record with 4,189 yards to lead the Boilermakers to a Big Ten title and Rose Bowl appearance.

Running Joe Tiller’s offense (which became known as “basketball on grass”) to a perfection, Brees completed 309-of-512 passes for 3,668 yards with 26 touchdowns, while rushing for 521 yards on 95 carries (5.5 average) with five touchdowns enroute to leading the nation in total offense (358.1 yards per game). As a star in the classroom, he was the 2000 Academic All-American of the Year, covering all sports, men and women.

Brees is no stranger to halls of fame. He was inducted into the Leroy Keyes Purdue Athletics Hall of Fame in 2009 and the Academic All-America Hall of Fame in 2016. In January, Brees became the fourth Boilermaker to earn the NCAA Silver Anniversary Award, marking 25 years since the conclusion of his college career and honoring his accomplishments “off” the field as well as “on.” He is the lone football player recognized in 2026 for his continued excellence.

During his 20-year NFL career and beyond, Drew and his wife Brittany donated more than \$50 million through their Brees Dream Foundation to champion causes for children, families and cancer patients. His enduring legacy includes philanthropic impact, military support through USO tours and rebuilding efforts in New Orleans following Hurricane Katrina, as well as making transformative contributions to Purdue.

CHAPTER MOURNS PASSING OF YOUNG PURDUE GREAT - RONDALE MOORE

The Joe Tiller Chapter of the NFF joins with all Purdue football fans, former players and teammates in mourning the death in late February of former Boilermaker receiver Rondale Moore in his hometown of New Albany, Ind. He was 25-years-old.

An All-American with an infectious smile, Rondale was a joy on and off the field. Someone who left this world too soon, Rondale will be remembered as a legendary Boilermaker. Our thoughts and prayers are with Rondale’s family and loved ones during this difficult time.

Moore electrified college football during his first season with the Boilermakers in 2018 when he became the first Big Ten true freshman to earn consensus All-America honors, while winning the Paul Hornung Award as the nation’s most versatile player. He was named the 2018 Big Ten Freshman and Wide Receiver of the Year after catching 114 passes for 1,258 yards and 12 touchdowns. Moore also broke the school’s single season record with 2,215 all-purpose yards. He led Purdue to one of the biggest wins in program history, a 49-20 win over No. 2 Ohio State (Oct. 20, 2018), recording 12 catches for 170 yards and two touchdowns.

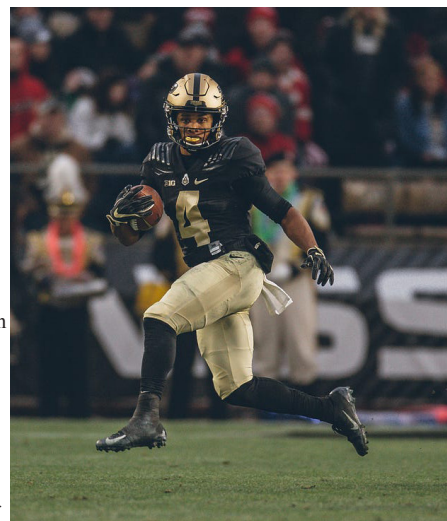
Although injuries limited Moore to seven games over the 2019 and 2020 seasons and 20 combined through three years, he still etched his name in the program record book for career receptions (9th-178) and receiving yards (14th-1,915).

Following his Boilermaker career, Moore was selected by the Arizona Cardinals with the 49th overall pick in the second round of the 2021 National Football League Draft. Throughout three seasons in Arizona, Moore hauled in 135 receptions for 1,201 yards and three touchdowns, while adding 52 carries for 249 yards and one touchdown on the ground. He joined the Atlanta Falcons in 2024 but missed the season due to injury.

In 2025, he signed with the Minnesota Vikings but missed the entire season with injuries. He was found with a self-inflicted gunshot wound in the garage of his home in Floyd County.

Jeff Brohm, current head coach at University of Louisville, was Rondale’s head coach at Purdue. He had this to say about the former All-American who he recruited from New Albany:

“Rondale Moore was a complete joy to coach. The ultimate competitor that wouldn’t back down from any challenge. Rondale had a work ethic unmatched by anyone. A great teammate that would come through in any situation. We all loved Rondale, we loved his smile and competitive edge that always wanted to please everyone he came in contact with. We offer all our thoughts and prayers to Rondale and his family, we love him very much.”
