

The Canadian Junior Football League (CJFL) is proud to announce the All-Canadians for the 2021 season.

In all there are 13 Offensive All-Canadians.

Offensive Line

Mason Ochs – Saskatoon Hilltops (fourth consecutive season);
Nikos Lazarakis – Langley Rams (second consecutive season);
Daniel Townsend – Okanagan Sun (second consecutive season);
Kyle Jennings – St. Clair Fratmen;
Carson Lethbridge – Edmonton Huskies

Receivers

Cody Holmes – St. Clair Fratmen - (second consecutive season) – he led the Ontario Conference with 683 yards on 30 receptions and 10 touchdowns;
Mike O’Shea – Okanagan Sun – he led the BC Conference with 10 touchdowns on 23 receptions and 562 yards;
Rylan Sokul – Regina Thunder – he led the Prairie Conference with 38 receptions and 621 yards and added six touchdowns;
De Shawn Le Jour – Edmonton Huskies – he caught 26 passes for 519 yards and a Prairie Conference high nine touchdowns.

Running Backs

Malcolm Miller – Okanagan Sun – he won the CJFL rushing title with 1360 yards on 160 carries and had a BC Conference high 11 touchdowns;
Jacob Savoni – St. Clair Fratmen – he led with CJFL with 16 rushing touchdowns on 117 carries and 924 yards, averaging 7.9 yards each carry.

Quarterback

Michael Beale – St. Clair Fratmen – he led the CJFL completing 64.7% of his passes and connected on 25 touchdowns. He completed 97 passes for 1762 yards and had a passer efficiency rating of 149.4.

Place Kicker

Eric Maximuik – Regina Thunder – he led the Prairie Conference with 20 made field goals including a game winner from 51 yards away at the final buzzer. He added three singles on 33 kick-offs.

In total there are 13 Defensive All-Canadians and one Return Specialist All-Canadian.

Defensive Line

Jordan Fletcher – London Beefeaters – named the Ontario Conference Defensive Player of the Year, he had 20 tackles, 4 assisted tackles, a Conference high 8 sacks and recovered a fumble;
James Stockwood – Okanagan Sun – he tallied 16 solo tackles, had 1.5 sacks and a knockdown;
Cam Michaud – Calgary Colts – he had 22 solo tackles, 4 assisted tackles, had 1.5 sacks and forced a fumble;

Reece McCormick – Regina Thunder – he was named the Prairie Conference Rookie of the Year with 16 tackles, 4 assisted tackles, and added 3 sacks.

Linebackers

Austin Daisy – Calgary Colts – he led the CJFL with 55 solo tackles, had 14 assisted tackles, 2.5 sacks, had a knockdown, forced a fumble and intercepted a pass returning it 52 yards;

Codey McRoberts – London Beefeaters – he was all over the field with 18 tackles, 5 assist tackles, 2 sacks, 2 interceptions including 1 returned for a touchdown, blocked 3 kicks, had 2 knockdowns, forced a fumble and recovered 2 of them including 1 for a touchdown;

Colten Dejong – Langley Rams – he collected 23 solo tackles, 10 assisted tackles, had an interception returned for a touchdown, and 1 sack.

Defensive Backs

Kyle Clarot – Langley Rams (third consecutive season) – he had 3 interceptions, 23 tackles, 6 assisted tackles, had a knockdown, and a forced fumble;

Cheyvez Campbell – Edmonton Huskies (second consecutive season) – he had 19 tackles, 1 assisted tackle and collected 5 interceptions;

Gevhahn McNally-Hardisty – VI Raiders (second honour) – he had 33 tackles, four interceptions, 2 assisted tackles, four knockdowns, and blocked a kick;

Maurice Dubois – Edmonton Huskies – he collected 32 tackles, 3 assisted tackles, had four knockdowns and recorded 2 interceptions;

Billy Patterson Jr. – St. Clair Fratmen – he intercepted four passes, returning 1 for touchdown, added 10 solo tackles and 2 assisted tackles.

Punter

Joel Pipke – Calgary Colts – he averaged 31 yards on 55 punts and added 3 singles on the season.

Return Specialist

Dante Lewis – St. Clair Fratmen –he returned 20 punts, averaging 20.5 yards, returning 2 of them for a touchdown, added another 100 yard touchdown on a kick-off return. In all he returned 13 kick-offs averaging 26.2 yards.
