Important Information

The Northern Plains, Pacific, and Rocky Mountain Districts of USA Hockey are pleased to announce its 2026 Western Regional High Performance Girls Camp for 2012 birth-year players. Our expectation is all players will bring a high compete level and desire to learn. Our Camp is focused on development as players at this Camp do not advance to any USA Hockey National Camp. Below is some important information to answer any questions you may have. As a reminder, all participants must be US citizens and registered with USA Hockey for the current season.

Flight Information & Ground Transportation

Players should arrive at Las Vegas International Airport (LAS) on Thursday, June 25, 2026, no later than 1:00pm PDT so they can arrive timely for registration at 4:00pm at America First Center. Players are **100%** responsible for all their ground transportation during the camp. The camp ends by 12:00pm Sunday June 28, so players can schedule ground transportation and flights home accordingly.

We would prefer all players input their flight itineraries or ground transportation notification and time of arrival into their Rocky Mountain Register account prior to May 1, 2026. While players are 100% responsible for their own transportation, this gives us a reference point on player arrivals in Las Vegas. Players must allow sufficient time to travel to/from America First Center so they are timely for all events throughout the weekend while keeping continuity with their warm-up and routines and being a cordial and present teammate.

Registration:

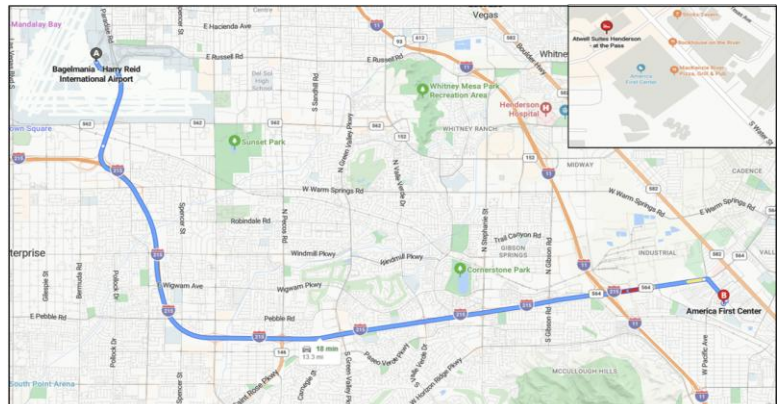
Onsite player registration will take place at America First Center at 4:00-6:00pm PDT on Thursday June 25, 2026. At that time, players will receive team information, jerseys, socks, and a goodies bag.

At A Glance

America First Center is the practice facility and team headquarters of the [Henderson Silver Knights](#) of the [American Hockey League](#). It contains team headquarters, a team store, MacKenzie River Pizza, and Grill & Pub restaurant among other features. The facility is also the home arena for the Junior Golden Knights. The Vegas Golden Knights of the National Hockey League are based out of the City National Arena in Las Vegas, Nevada.

Camp Fee

In order to cover cost of coaches, hospitality, ice, jerseys/socks, medical, speakers, travel, etc., USA Hockey provides this non-profit, development opportunity at a reasonable cost of \$525/player. **Player fees are required to be paid in full by May 1, 2026, in order to secure your spot.** *If you are not registered and paid in full, the Districts reserve the right to select qualified participants from our alternate list of candidates.*

Daily Routine

Players can expect to be at the arena for many hours each day. This Camp will include games, goalie session, SAGs, skills & drills, and information sessions (i.e. future opportunities, mental performance, nutrition, training, etc.) The future opportunities session will allow players (and parents) to hear from current and former collegiate athletes and coaches about their paths and what athletes might see during their individual journeys.

The camp staff recommends players plan accordingly with their families for meals, sleep, and logistics to/from America First Center. The camp staff also asks players to not bring valuable items into the rink during the camp. Players are responsible for their valuable items, so please keep them in a secure location.

What to Bring

- * Required USA Hockey Equipment (including mouthguard & neck laceration protector)
- * Extra Hockey Sticks – skate sharpening available at pro shop at ice arena
- * Dry Land Gear – including running shoes and water bottle
- * Toiletries – including sunscreen and towel to keep for America First Center
- * Extra Cash – for snacks, energy drinks, or food delivery

Officials

Camp also serves as development for officials with the [Jamie Huntley-Park Women's Officiating Camp](#) sponsored by the Pacific District and named after a renowned officials camp director who died in a 2021 car accident.

Camp Conclusion

Camp concludes by 12:00pm PDT on Sunday June 28. Please allow time for travel to the airport to catch flights.
