



Kyle Shellberg '96 Scholarship Award

Background: Kyle Shellberg was a valued member of both the 1994-95 and 1995-96 Loyola Gold state championship hockey teams. A model of sportsmanship, he was the sort of individual who always seemed to play the game with a smile on his face. Kyle treated hockey as he lived his life, with a keen eye for what was truly important: building enduring friendships, generosity on and off the ice, and commitment to team over self.

Purpose: The Kyle Shellberg Scholarship Award is meant to honor one Loyola Hockey Club player per year who best embodies Kyle's spirit as a hockey player, a teammate, and a leader in service. The financial award (approximately \$1500) will provide a measure of tuition assistance toward post-secondary education.

Eligibility: All Loyola Hockey Club juniors and seniors – including Gold, Maroon, Girls, and JV teams –are eligible for the scholarship.

Scholarship Criteria: The Selection Committee will look for applicants who demonstrate a combination of Kyle's "on the ice" and "off the ice" characteristics. The Committee will also consider financial need in making its selection.

Application Process: The scholarship application consists of two essay questions (total 500 words). The **application deadline** is **Wednesday February 20th**, and the scholarship will be awarded at the annual Loyola Hockey Club banquet. ***Please make sure to print name and ID # on the top of your essay responses.
