# <u>Tier IV House Director (VP), U14 (Bantam) T4 Manager - Scott</u> <u>Rousseau</u>

- Season has progressed with only 1 or 2 minor disciplinary matters. Nothing noteworthy to report.
- Otherwise, business as usual. Scheduling has been mostly issue free as well.
- Teams are generally all successful, save one or two teams that struggled early but seem to be gaining their footing since the New Year.
- Bantams particularly are very strong with a chance to place 4 or 5 teams to the state tourney. Issues with Gladiators Bantams (less so) and Nordiques Bantams, which is not surprising since the Nordiques current coach was the coach of the Western ME team that all conference opponents stopped playing 2 years ago. Also ironic is that I've been told Gladiators will not play Nordiques any more. Art imitating life??
- We are hosting the U12 and U14 Conference tourneys Feb 23-26. Rachel and I are working on this schedule, but are waiting on confirmation from MEAHA / Mike Keaney that the South is again sending 5 teams to the states.

# **CBHA Board Meeting Minutes**

#### **February 3, 2020**

- 1. Vote was taken to approve January meeting minutes
- 2. MEAHA Report (Matt L.)
  - Tier 1 Teams: if you are an Association member of MEAHA (this doesn't apply to Affiliate members such as the Wild) starting at Bantam level can have T1.
     MEAHA can determine that a team is not T1.
  - MEAHA travel teams' numbers rules: First year 50/50 in House, next year 66 2/3 of players in House. Central ME brought forward that they want to get rid of this rule. New plan need to have LTP/BTI, Mites House and T4 program if you meet all 3 of them you can have a Travel team at each of the 3 levels, but they have the chance to parity you down to T3, T4. As long as an organization has 70% playing House, it can have more than 1 team at each age group.
  - Process for proposing/voting on MEAHA rule changes (CBHA proposal): CBHA
    will propose a rule that there is a formal process for proposing rule changes so
    that there could be discussion among club membership/directors ahead of time.
    Currently a rule change that is proposed at a meeting means that only those
    there can vote and they haven't had a chance to talk with their own Board about
    it.
  - Annual Meeting is 5/3/2020
- 3. 18U Tier 3 midgets Proposal (Eric)

Mike Ward, NYA Coach, wants to coach a CBHA U18T2 team and bring 8-10 NYA players to the team. Discussion centered around reality that he would not be in the room to evaluate players and CBHA would make it clear up front that selection would not include him and that NYA students were not guaranteed a spot on team as no other players are guaranteed a spot. Issue of conflict of interest for him to coach; only way an MPA high school coach can coach a team is if none of the HS players are on that Club team.

- 4. Leprechaun Tournament: (Matt L)
  - 35 teams registered. Want to get 3 Huskies teams. \$600/team but 14 of teams are CBHA
  - Sponsors recruited by Rebecca Spear including bags for every player

- Working on shirts with Scott...will use graphic artist from PIAS. Can show options for 1 color, 3 color and Matt can pick design
- Request for Rachel to give Tom heads-up on dates and ref needs and let Alex know times.
- Caitlin coordinating with food trucks and getting approval from town
- Medals have been picked out and Mike will order
- Hope to purchase a banner that will print winners that lives at CBA
- CBA will get accessory entrance that they use for tree lighting ceremony since lobby will be busy and full
- Score boards will be used at one end and flip charts at the other
- Player of the game each game
- No out of state teams this year. Hope that success this year will build interest going forward
- New nets will come by end of Feb and will need to be strung

#### 5. CBA Issues (John)

- Taking ice out 3/22...can schedule mid-week ice leading up to Leprechaun
- Signed contract with Summit Gas to serve as lead sponsor
- New glass delivered...will be replaced before the Mite tournament
- Cash flow is in good shape
- New board ads are being added. Have 10 more that can be sold \$1k/yr/ad, pure revenue at this point
- Zamboni need to get the new conditioner installed. The back-up Zamboni of FIC is also broken. Rinks get together and manage how the Zambonis work.
- Locker room doors need hinge guard to prevent injuries. They have been ordered and will be funded as a donation by family whose daughter was hurt
- Current worker shortage and Josh is having a hard time finding enough workers for the two rinks

#### 6. TIA manager complaint (Eric)

Recent problem at TIA when rink manager asked for games to go running time. Parent in score booth filed a complaint after words were shared. Apparently the rink manager swore at parents and players. A CBHA Parent sent a complaint to TIA copying Eric. We should put a call in to Alex  $-3^{rd}$  week in a row this has happened. Leave extra 10 min before the public skating; rink manager ensures that there is plenty of time before the public ice but if we have the ice immediately before this we are losing time in this last hour.

#### 7. Calendar Raffle (Meg)

Online sales were closed on February 1st at the same time that paper tickets were collected at the Pond House. Early calculations indicate brought in \$15,800 and we will have some expenses. This compares to approximately \$17K raised last year. Though we had a longer sales time and better organization of the process, competing calendar raffles in S Portland, Cape and Yarmouth may have hurt our sales

  - For Leprechaun, will put a media release
- 9. Other general topics:
  - Goal Tending: last session held Sat 2/1 with 37 goaltenders. Great turnout and terrific programming over the course of the season. Looking forward to doing more next year.
  - Financial: Mike to create a form for anyone to submit expenses and also to manage payment of tournaments in cases where registration fee also includes hotel cost and families owe CBHA so that entire payment can be made in one lump sum (example of the Quebec City Tournament this winter)

#### OPTION FOR NON-EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEMBERS TO LEAVE

Executive Committee focused discussion on time sensitive issues:

- 1. Mike presented analysis of the number of players and teams predicted for 2020-2021 season. Adjustments made during the course of the conversation, still being updated.
  - This past year had policy that any new House players to CBHA got an email after registration saying they were on the WL, might not be able to find room for them

 Issue of who stays in the system. If a player is cut from T2, they tend to leave CBHA. If kid is cut from T3, tend to go to T4

#### 2. Plans for Co-ed Travel Teams:

- a. Spartans created in order to get our T2 teams into a league since there are no options currently in MEAHA. We don't want to recruit from all over the state. We can do this with current CBHA skaters and they will get a full schedule whether it's E9 or BHL.
  - Teams will be by birth year starting with 2nd year Squirt ('10), '09, '08, '07 and '06 Split Season.
- b. Mariners Will keep 1 MEAHA team at each level these will include 2 birth years per age group. PW will have 3 teams 1 MEAHA and Spartans '08 and Spartans '09

Biggest challenge with change is ice availability. One theory is that the hours given back each month would allow us to add new teams, but others are concerned that these hours are few and far between. Long conversation about equity of adding the Spartans teams and who loses on the ice time. One argument was that in recent years Mites teams and Girls teams have been added, but Travel Teams have not and are competitiveness here is decreasing as a result; players moving to for-profit programs to play more competitive hockey. Spartans team is added to provide a solution to keep more kids in our organization. Decision made to lock down the total travel teams to 7, but need to think about how we clamp down other sides of the program so this won't be a problem going forward.

Possible options for ice limitations:

- 1. Can we get ice hours from USM?
- 2. Can we move first evening ice back an hour during the week so they start at 4:30?
- 3. Can we practice once a week in the morning?
- 4. Can we make our T4 programs LTP and BTI especially limited to players who live within a certain radius of our rinks or live in specific towns
- 5. Do we scale our Mites teams back to 8 (from 14 this year)
