FEE STRUCTURE

Each Centennial family pays an athletic fee to ISD #12 through the Campus Portal system for the girls high school hockey program. The SLP families pays an athletic fee to ISD #16 through the FeePay system. Those fees cover the following items:

- Salaries for head coach and two assistants
- Practice and game ice time
- Bus transportation to and from games

There are many expenses not covered by the school's Athletic Fee. Therefore, the BLC steps in to raise funds to pay for those additional expenses. Below are examples of fees not paid by the school but covered by the BLC:

- Salaries for JV coaching staff & any additional varsity assistant coaches, trainers
- Duluth scrimmage weekend (transportation, hotel, partial meals, team bonding event)
- Team equipment, game socks, practice jerseys
- Team photographer
- Game day videographer
- Accounting fees
- Fundraiser expenses (Hocktoberfest, Calendar Raffle, Cash Raffle)
- Printing, copying, postage, mailing fees
- Banking charges & fees
- Locker room upkeep, upgrades, food, and beverages
- Coach apparel
- End-of-Year banquet
- Game day food
- In-season dryland workouts
- Special event nights (Girls High School Skate, Teacher Appreciation Night, Senior Night)
- Player outings
- Playoff pasta feeds
- Other team events/supplies
- Senior Night
- State tournament expenses (transportation, hotel, meals, banquet)

Budget Notes:

Each year the BLC plans to carry-over \$10,000 - \$15,000 for the following season to cover early season expenses, such as captains practice ice time, dryland facilities, Duluth trip etc.

The remainder of the carry over balance is reserved for "Legacy" expenses that will serve more than just one season, such as uniform replacement, facility upgrades, unbudgeted expenses, and contingency funds for the unknown.

Fundraising is the responsibility of everyone who participates in the program. The BLC has worked very hard to set up the fundraising events and opportunities that will meet the needs of the program. But we need all families to participate to reach our fundraising goal. The BLC will track fundraising results for each family throughout the season and may ask families that come up short of their goal to make up the difference near the end of the season.

^{*}Does not include captains practice fee income and CYHA donation. This gets us to a balanced budget for the season.

FUNDRAISING & EVENTS

All families in the program are responsible for fundraising. The BLC determines the budget each season and plans all fundraising events to cover expenses. We have different fundraising activities in two categories. The first is considered "expected". The "expected" fundraisers require all families to participate and generate as many dollars as possible to help us reach our expense budget target.

The second fundraising category is considered "supplemental". These are additional fundraising activities that are not required but are available to all families to help raise additional dollars for the program.

VOLUNTEERING & COMMUNITY SERVICE

The team would like to participate in two community outreach/volunteering events. DULUTH SCRIMMAGE WEEKEND – Friday & Saturday (Nov 3-4)

At the start of each season, the girls high school hockey team travels to Duluth to play in a series of Varsity and JV scrimmages vs other high schools attending the event. This is the first and arguably one of the best team bonding events for the season. This also gives parents time to meet and greet before, during, and after games. Below is a rough outline or example of how past weekends have proceeded over the years:

Friday, November 3

7:00 AM – Full team meets at Centennial Sports Arena for individual and team pictures.

9:00 AM – Players and coaches board a coach bus for travel to Duluth. Player vehicles cannot be left in the school parking lot overnight. Make arrangement for vehicles to be moved off school grounds.

10:00 AM – Team usually stops briefly in Hinckley for a small meal before proceeding.

Midday – Team arrives in Duluth. Depending upon game schedule, the team may go straight to the rink or check-in to the team hotel first.

Day and early Evening – One or possibly two hour-long scrimmages (two 25 min running time halves).

Evening – Team will eat dinner together with the coaches.

11:00 PM – Typically lights out in player hotel rooms. The coaching staff will outline all final rules for the team. There are typically 4 players to each room.

Saturday, November 4

TBD – Remaining game schedule. This will also dictate if/when an additional team bonding event can occur.

Evening – Return to Centennial Sports Arena, with another potential stop in Hinckley for a quick meal.

Coaches, players, chaperones, and the bus driver will stay at The Inn on Lake Superior Hotel. DO NOT make reservations for your player – the BLC has already booked their rooms.
