2020 State Chair Report

In March of 2020, wrestling across the country came to a screeching halt due to the COVID-19 virus.

However, we are extremely grateful for the 98 sanctioned tournaments we were able to hold! In addition, we increased the number of teams for the ISWA Elementary State Duals to 34. Congratulations to the 1st Place Winners: Rochester WC (Small Group) and Avon WC (Large Group)! This is always an exciting day of tough competition!

One of the ISWA goals for 2020 was to increase the number of middle school wrestlers. To meet that goal, we hosted the first Middle School State Duals, which will now be an annual event. For the first year, 16 teams participated and it was a huge success! Congratulations to Center Grove WC for taking 1st Place! We will be expanding the number of teams included for 2021.

Another goal we set was to increase the number of girls in wrestling. We actually had 537 females wrestling in Indiana. That is an increase of 89 wrestlers over 2019. Fantastic to watch these numbers climb!

While we may not have been able to continue our season with wrestling tournaments, the Indiana coaches came together and developed a daily workout plan for our wrestlers. A big "Thank You" to all the coaches, parents, former ISWA wrestlers and current members. It was always exciting to see who would provide the daily video. Our objective was to keep wrestling on the forefront of everyone's minds.

USA Wrestling provided an opportunity for coaches, parents and wrestlers to get their Bronze and Copper coaching education and certifications—for free! The ISWA thought it would be fun to hold a competition among our Clubs to see who could get the most certifications. This type of education proves to be invaluable! Indiana then took it a step further and challenged everyone to take the education courses, with a goal to surpass ALL States. Indiana is now No. 1 for the most new certified coaches!

The ISWA board members have continued to work hard for you. Last fall, we held Club meetings in all of the Sections. We want to keep communication open and see how the ISWA can continue to serve our members. Out of those meetings, we found that education emerged as an eminent topic. Therefore, we are revamping our 2020 Annual Meeting to bring you several education sessions. In addition, USA Wrestling is providing a clinician to present a free clinic!

Last year, we saw many of Indiana's finest wrestlers on the National and International stages. We are looking forward to getting back into action. Our wrestlers have made all of Indiana proud!

Thank you to all of our Clubs, parents, coaches, volunteers and wrestlers! Together, we will get through this and be ready for a great 2020-2021 season!

2020 Sports Medicine Report

I just completed my 11th year as the ISWA Sports Medicine Director and my 10th year as a board member. My duties normally include ordering medical supplies, coordinating athletic trainer coverage for both skin checks and competition at all of the individual state events, as well as High School Team State Duals, Elementary Team State Duals, Middle School Duals, National High School Folkstyle Duals, Schoolboy Duals, and Central Regionals (when hosted in Indiana). I am also available as a resource to coordinate athletic trainer coverage for local tournaments and as an educational resource for the wrestling community.

The 2020 wrestling season didn't go as expected. Therefore, my overall budgetary needs decreased for the 2020 season. I am hopeful the 2021 season will be held in its entirety.

As of late August, Indiana remains in Phase 4.5 of reopening. This means contact community recreational sports games, leagues and tournaments were allowed to resume June 19. ISWA must adhere to Executive Order 20–32:

- ii.) Contact sports, meaning sports where players typically come into contact with other players during play such as football, basketball, rugby or wrestling, are not permitted until Friday, June 19, 2020, however, conditioning and non-contact drills for such sports may take place before then.
- iii.) Contact sports may engage in games, meets or tournaments on or after Friday, June 19, 2020, provided the host or sponsoring venue has in place, and at least 72 hours in advance of any game, meet or tournament, submits to the local health department, and posts publicly, a COVID response plan outlining the steps being taken, and to be taken, to ensure social distancing, increased sanitation and overall protection of competitors, coaches, staff and spectators; and
- iv.) The social gathering limits for all individuals present as set forth are followed.

I helped craft the Indiana "Return to the Mat" Guidelines earlier this summer. Please check **www.ISWA.com/IndianaReturnToMatGuidelines** for any updates made to those state guidelines as we prepare for the upcoming season.

I would like to thank the executive committee for giving me the opportunity to serve the wrestling community. It is my desire to remain in the Sports Medicine Director position for the upcoming wrestling season.

The number of registered wrestlers decreased in **2020 by 164 (- 9%)**. As you can see from the breakdown above, we experienced gains in the 6U, 8U, 10U, 14U, and Senior/Veteran divisions. There were losses in the 12U, 16U, Junior and University divisions, which could be related to the COVID-19 pandemic. A total of 537 female wrestlers competed—**an increase of 17%**.

Coaches/Mat Officials/Pairing Officials are all now called **Wrestling Leaders**. The number of registered USAW Wrestling Leaders **decreased by 39 (– 3%)**. The number of ISWA Member Clubs decreased in **2020 by 5 (– 2%)** and the number of Sanctioned Events **increased by 4 (+3%)**.

Again this year, all USAW Athlete and Wrestling Leader cards must be purchased online for \$40 and paid for via credit card. The ISWA website includes a link to the USAW Membership website to make it easy to purchase cards online. This allows athletes and leaders to print cards immediately, and provides instant access if needing to reprint a card that gets lost or damaged. If an athlete needs their User ID or password to access the USAW Membership website, they can call the ISWA Office at 317–780–1885.

I continue to be amazed by the sheer amount of information that travels through the ISWA Office. Working with my co-worker, Tina Tonte, I'm always learning about the many functions of this great organization.

2020 Pairing Officials Developmental Director Report

2020 looks to be a year of growth and development for the pairings area. I became the Pairing Officials Developmental Director in May 2020, after serving many years as an ISWA Pairing Official. I've used the unprecedented downtime this year to work on revamping several items in the pairing world.

Updating both the **ISWA Rules and Regulations** and the **Club Organizing & Event Guide** is our most immediate focus. For the first time this year, we will explain the Rules and Regulations in video format, which allows us to better explain areas of confusion. Additionally, we are offering a couple of TrackWrestling training sessions at this year's annual meeting—one session will be focused on the basics of running an open tournament and one for more advanced event management.

Like the rest of our culture, most wrestling tournaments have progressed to operating on digital platforms in response to the pandemic. The popularity of electronic tournament management necessitates a change in the exams we currently use for pairing official licensure. One of this year's goals is to rewrite the pairing licensure exams with more relevant information that better aligns with the techniques used in today's tournament operations. This will especially benefit those new to pairing.

Our pairers are well experienced in tournament operations and the TrackWrestling platform. They're in high demand throughout the tournament season, traveling across the state to lend their expertise. Pairers put in countless hours behind the scenes to ensure events run smoothly.

2020 State Coach Director & RTC Director Reports

STATE COACH: In 2019, we sent another three Indiana coaches to the Olympic Training Center's "Fall Coaches Summit" to work on their Silver certifications. Five more coaches followed on their own accord to gain that valuable experience. Indiana has the most coaches in the entire country working on the third level of USAW's certifications, "Silver Level Coaches Certification." We are very proud of that and should have a few more finishes this year!

During the 2020 COVID-19 pandemic, USAW made Bronze and Copper certification courses free! This was an amazing resource and very generous of USAW, as normally these courses cost parents and clubs between \$50 and \$85 per certification. I am very pleased and proud to announce Indiana has completed more of these certifications than any other state! That makes a bold statement about our devoted parents and coaches who want to constantly improve for the kids! As of July 1, 2020, Indiana completed 311 courses—with the next closest state completing only 180. As of July 1, 2020, Contenders Wrestling Club completed the most of any Indiana club. Congratulations to the Contenders and their leader, Ryan Parrish!

We did not get to host our traditional North, South, and Central "Olympic Style" clinics due to COVID-19. However, we plan to do them again in the future. We did get to host a "Greco Roman Coaches Summit" last Fall. This summer, 15 coaches spent Friday evening and Saturday morning with OTC Greco Roman Coach Gary Mayabb. This marked a huge leap in the right direction, not only with education but with promoting Greco Roman to our Indiana coaches. We called it the "Greco Roman Influencer" clinic. The education resulted in more coaches getting involved in our Olympic styles of wrestling along with Folkstyle. Our number of coaches continues to grow in both membership and certifications each year.

We will see a few more coaches become Silver certified, leading the country in coaches' education, as this year progresses. My current challenge to all coaches who attended a Silver Clinic—Finish the certification! Education is something we value as an organization as it gives our coaches a way to better help our kids succeed.

RTC: During 2020, I (Danny Struck) took on the role of RTC Director for the season. We revamped the rules, goals, and direction of RTC to make it more prestigious to host, and better aligned with what the ISWA and our Olympic-style movement aims to accomplish. In 2020, Indiana hosted 17 all-inclusive RTCs and 5 women-specific RTCs.

INT-RTCs unify the Indiana wrestling community under the goal of advancing the sport across the state. INT-RTC 2020 primarily focuses on Olympic styles of wrestling. It is NOT the intention of an INT-RTC practice to be a Club practice, rather a site for potential ISWA National Team members, coaches and hopefuls to come together and train in Olympic styles.

The purpose of ISWA INT-RTCs is to allow individuals to achieve their full human and athletic potential. The INT-RTCs provide ISWA National Team hopefuls access to National- and Silver-level coaches. INT-RTCs should mirror ISWA and USA Wrestling's mission, vision and values.

Carrol, Perry Meridian, Columbus East, Jeffersonville, Mishawaka, Franklin, and Warren Central all went above and beyond in doing the things we asked in this revamp. Thumbs Up and Hi-Five! They exemplified what we want from our new RTC model.
