## Saskatchewan Rush (2-5) vs. Colorado Mammoth (5-2)

Sunday, February 20, 2022

Ball Arena - Denver, CO

A Sunday matinee in the Mile High City begins a home-and-home series between NLL West Division arch-rivals the Saskatchewan Rush and Colorado Mammoth.

The return clash between the long-time foes will take place on Saturday night in Saskatoon. The two teams will meet for a third and final time this season on April 16th in Saskatchewan.

Both the Rush and Mammoth came up short on the road in divisional rivalry matchups last weekend. Saskatchewan dropped a 13-7 decision at Vancouver, while Colorado fell 9-7 in Calgary.

The Rush have won 12 of the last 15 regular-season meetings between the two teams and closed the overall record between them and Mammoth to 26-19 in Colorado's favor. The Rush and Mammoth faced each other three times in the pandemic-shortened 2019-20 season with the Rush coming out on top in two of the games.

Robert Church's eight-point night (3 goals, 5 assists) paced the Rush to a 9-7 victory in Denver in the first game. Ryan Keenan (2 goals, 4 assists) and Mark Matthews (1 goal, 4 assists) also pushed the Rush offence.

After the Mammoth returned the favor with a win in Saskatoon, the Rush regained home-turf dominance with a 9-7 victory just two weeks later behind two-goal outings from Jeff Shattler, Ryan Keenan, and Ben McIntosh. Matt Hossack, Chris Corbeil and Jeff Cornwall added a goal each with Adam Shute totaling 32 saves.

In the 2019-20 season, the Rush won a pair of 9-7 games against the Mammoth beginning with a victory in Saskatoon behind three goals from Jeff Shattler, two from Mark Matthews and singles from Ben McIntosh, Marty Dinsdale, Chris Corbeil, and Brett Mydske. Two months later, the Rush won by the same score in Colorado as Ryan Keenan, Mark Matthews and Robert Church each scored a pair with singles going to Jeff Shattler, Scott Campbell, and Ben McIntosh. The Rush wrapped up the regular season with a 13-8 win over Colorado as they stormed out to an 8-0 lead and a halftime cushion of 11-1. Ryan Keenan (1 goal, 5 assists) and Marty Dinsdale (4 goals, 2 assists) each had six-point nights for the Rush. Mark Matthews posted a hat trick, Curtis Knight and Jeff Shattler both scored twice and Robert Church had one goal.

**LAST GAME:** A tight game against the Warriors went against the Rush in the second quarter as Vancouver scored eight times. Dan Lintner was the lone bright spot for the Rush as he netted a hat trick, while Mark Matthews, Ryan Keenan, Jeff Shattler and Robert Church scored singles. Meanwhile, the Mammoth went 3-for-4 on the power play against Calgary, but Colorado scored only one goal in the second half after leading by one at halftime. Eli McLaughlin led the Mammoth with a hat trick.

**RUSH CRUISING COLORADO:** The Rush have certainly been on a roll against the Mammoth in recent seasons. In fact, the Rush have won every regular-season series against the Mammoth since the 2012 campaign, including sweeps in 2015, 2018 and 2019. The Rush ousted the Mammoth from the playoffs in 2017, taking the West Division semifinal series handily, highlighted by a 18-9 win in Denver. The Mammoth did gain a measure of revenge, however, in eliminating the Rush in the one-game West Division semifinal in 2019.

**STATISTICALLY SPEAKING:** The Rush's **Dan Lintner**, who had a hat trick last game out against Vancouver, is tied for fourth in the NLL with five power-play goals. Teammate **Mark Matthews**, who was a two-time All-American while playing at Denver University, is tied for third in the league with 10 power-play assists ... **Robert Church** of the Rush is tied for 15th in the league with 15 goals, while **Ryan Keenan** sits 16th in assists with 23 ... Colorado's **Ryan Lee** is tied for fourth in league scoring with 47 points and he is fifth in assists with 31 ... Former Rush **Connor Robinson** has 17 goals for the Mammoth ... The Rush are ranked eighth on the power play at 40.6% (13-for-32) but sit 12th on the penalty kill at 51.9% (13 goals allowed in 27 shorthanded situations). The Mammoth hold the NLL's top-rated penalty kill at 78.6% (6 goals allowed in 28 shorthanded situations) but are 11th on the power play at 37.5% (9-for-24) ... The Rush and Mammoth are two of the least-penalized teams in the league, averaging 12.29 and 11.14 PIM per game, respectively ... Colorado's **Eli McLaughlin** is tied for the league-lead with three game-winning goals.

**BY THE NUMBERS:** Rush defenceman **Ryan Dilks** is tied for third in the league with 16 caused turnovers. Teammates **Holden Garlent** and **Kyle Rubisch** aren't far behind with 11 each ... **Kyle Rubisch** leads the Rush and is tied for ninth in the league with 62 loose balls ... Mammoth goalie **Dillon Ward** is second in the NLL with a .819 save-percentage and he's third in goals-against average at 9.51 ... Rush defenceman **Mike Messenger** is eighth in scoring amongst defence/transition players with 11 points ... The Rush are 13th in the NLL in goals scored per game at 10.00 but sit seventh in goals allowed at 10.57. The Mammoth are seventh in goals for at 10.86 and rank third in goals allowed at 9.86 ... The Mammoth obviously use their coach's halftime speech wisely. They have outscored their opponents 24-14 in third-quarter action this season and are 5-0 on the year when leading after three ... The Rush hold the NLL's current season-high for power-play goals in a game with five and **Mark Matthews** holds the league's season-high for power-play assists in game also at five. Both highs were registered in the December 4th game against Halifax ... The Rush also hold the league's current season-high for caused turnovers in a game with 23 coming in the December 11th game against Calgary.
