TEAM USA REVIEW

The 2024 U.S. National Junior Team won every game it played on the way to becoming just the sixth U.S. team ever to win gold in the 48-year history of the IIHF World Junior Championship. It was the 15th medal performance for the U.S. and the gold-medal victory against Sweden came on the 20th anniversary of Team USA's very first gold medal in the event 20 years ago in the 2004 IIHF World Junior Championship.

Team USA played a couple of powerhouses in pre-tournament games, earning a 5-3 win over Sweden and a 6-5 overtime victory over Canada.

The U.S. won its preliminary round group for the fourth straight year, earning wins against all four of its Group B opponents. The U.S. opened with a tough 4-1 triumph over Norway, before sailing past Switzerland by an 11-3 count. Team USA's toughest test came next against Czechia where the U.S. took a 4-3 shootout over last year's silver medalist. The U.S. finished preliminary round play with a 10-2 victory over Slovakia.

The U.S. was the top-seeded team overall heading into the quarterfinal round and faced Latvia, where it earned a 7-2 victory.

Rallying from a 2-0 deficit, Team USA earned a hard fought 3-2 victory over Finland in the semifinals, with Cutter Gauthier providing the game-winning goal on the power play with just 3:13 left in regulation.

In the gold-medal game before a capacity crowd, the U.S. got a pair of goals from Isaac Howard and an outstanding goaltending performance from Trey Augustine on the way to a 6-2 win.

The 2024 U.S. National Junior Team became just the third-ever U.S. squad to go undefeated in a single World Juniors, joining the 2017 and 2004 squads.

With the help of facilitators Tom Koulentes and Stan Bowman, the Team USA built its own respect charter which helped guide it through the tournament.

LEADERSHIP GROUP

Forward Rutger McGroarty (Lincoln, Neb.), who returned to the U.S. National Junior Team after helping the squad earn a bronze medal in 2023, was the captain of the 2024 U.S. National Junior Team. He has also represented the U.S. twice in the IIHF U18 Men's World Championship, including helping the U.S. to a silver medal in 2022. In addition, McGroarty helped Team USA earn silver at the 2020 Youth Olympic Games. Forwards Cutter Gauthier (Scottsdale, Ariz.) and Gavin Brindley (Estero, Fla.) and defensemen Lane Hutson (North Barrington, III.) and Ryan Chesley (Mahtomedi, Minn.) all served as alternate captains. All four were part of the 2023 U.S. National Junior Team.

THE JOURNEY

The U.S. began its 2023 World Juniors journey with a camp in Plymouth, Mich., at USA Hockey Arena with 29 players looking to gain a spot among the final 25-man U.S. roster for the 2024 IIHF World Junior Championship. Below is a look at some of the key moments.

TEAM USA IN WORLD JUNIORS

Through the 2024 IIHF World Junior Championship, the U.S. holds a 162-12-6-121-11 (W-OTW-OTL-L-T) all-time record in world junior championship play. The United States has medaled in seven of the last nine tournaments, the best medal stretch in the history of the country.

WORLD JUNIORS IN SWEDEN

The World Juniors have been staged in Sweden a total of seven times. The U.S. has two medals to its credit with a gold in 2024 in Gothenburg where Cutter Gauthier co-led the tourament in points and was named the Top Forward by the Directorate, and a bronze in 2007 when the tournament was held in Leksand and Mora. Team USA's roster in 2007 included two first-overall NHL Draft picks for the first time ever in Patrick Kane and Erik Johnson. Johnson was named the best defenseman in the event and both he and Kane were part of the media all-star team.

TIDBITS FROM THE 2024 WORLD JUNIORS

Team USA scored 29 games in its four preliminary round games, the most it has scored since the current 10-team, two-group format started in 1996. The previous high was 28 (2009), followed by 26 (2010) and 25 (2021) ... Defenseman Eric Pohlkamp, his parents Joe and Mary, and five siblings -- including brothers Matt and Chris and sisters Sarah, Abby and Molly -- are all here in Gothenburg. It is the first time everyone has been together for two-and-a-half years. Eric's brothers Matt and Chris played college hockey at Bowling Green and then professionally in Europe ... They Said It -- from U.S. assistant coach Steve Miller, who is enjoying the cuisine in Sweden ... "Bread has not had a bad day here." ... Ryan Leonard had eights shots on goal to lead all players in Team USA's win 4-1 win over Norway on Tuesday (Dec. 26). Gavin Brindley, Jimmy Snuggerud and Isaac Howard each had six shots on net ... The U.S. won 73% of its faceoffs vs. Norway, led by Will Smith (14/17) and Cutter Gauthier (13/17) ... Jacob Fowler says Gabe Perreault has the best style of the line trio of Perreault-Smith-Leonard, who he plays with at Boston College ... Defenseman Seamus Casey likes to cook and shared his go-to dinner recipe in the U.S. World Juniors Insider yesterday (Dec. 27) . . . Assistant coach Steve Miller, who is part of his sixth World Juniors staff for the U.S., is in charge of the penalty kill, while assistant coach Brett Larson is handling the power play ... Zeev Buium, who is the top point-getting defenseman in NCAA hockey (5-20--25), says playing roller hockey as a kid brought creativity to his game ... The U.S. roster includes seven players from Boston College, the most ever representatives from one team on a U.S. National Junior Team roster. The group includes the top four scorers on the team in Gabe Perreault, Cutter Gauthier, Will Smith and Ryan Leonard ... Gabe Perreault, Isaac Howard, Seamus Casey, Gavin Hayes, and Carey Terrance are all the top point-getters on their respective teams ... Stan Wong, who is an athletic trainer for the 22nd straight year with the U.S. National Junior Team, filled in for Santa Claus on Dec. 24 as "Stanta Claus" and distributed gifts to Team USA players. His commentary throughout the night was entertaining as always ... Check out the World Juniors Insider each day for insights into Team USA's journey at TeamUSA.USAHockey. com/worldjuniors2024 ... Both Cutter Gauthier and Lane Hutson played in the IIHF Men's World Championship for the U.S. last May where Team USA won its first eight games in the tournament for the first-time ever, before dropping its final two games in overtime (semifinal, bronze-medal game). Gauthier played in all 10 games and recorded 7-2--9, while Hutson had 2-4--6. Gauthier's seven goals were second in the tournament, just one off the lead

FIRST GOLD IN WJC WAS 20 YEARS AGO

This year's World Juniors marks the 20th anniversary of the firstever gold medal for the U.S. in the World Juniors. That 2004 tournament culminated with a 4-3 U.S. win over Canada in the gold-medal game and included a perfect 6-0 mark for Team USA overall. Zach Parise was named the tournament MVP.

ABOUT VANBIESBROUCK

John Vanbiesbrouck is the general manager of the 2024 U.S. National Junior Team, marking his sixth straight season serving in the capacity. The 2007 U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame inductee has previously represented the United States as a player on nine occasions, including one Olympic Winter Games (1998), two Canada Cups (1987, 1991), four men's world championships (1985, 1987, 1989, 1991) and two world junior championships (1982, 1983). A full-time employee of USA Hockey, Vanbiesbrouck began his duties as assistant executive director of hockey operations for USA Hockey on June 4, 2018. His responsibilities include oversight of all of USA Hockey's international efforts, including its men's, women's and sled programs as well as the National Junior Development Program.

ABOUT CARLE

David Carle is serving as head coach of the U.S. National Junior Team for the first time. In his sixth season as head coach of the University of Denver's men's ice hockey team in 2023-24, Carle has led the Pioneers to three NCAA tournament appearances overall in his tenure as head coach at DU, including the 2022 NCAA title. He had a 116-53-13 overall record in his first five campaigns with the Pioneers, which included a COVIDshortened season in 2019-20. Prior to being named head coach, Carle served four-anda-half seasons as an assistant coach with Denver (2014-18), joining the program in 2014 following a season-and-a- half as an assistant coach (2012-14) with the Green Bay Gamblers of the United States Hockey League. As a player, Carle was recruited to play at Denver and spent four seasons (2008-12) as a graduate assistant coach after a medical diagnosis forced him to retire from his playing career. A 2008 NHL Draft-eligible prospect, Carle was drafted in the fourth round, 203rd overall, by the Tampa Bay Lightning.
