## Principal's Message By P. Di Yim



Dear Panther Alumni,

Burlingame High School has much to celebrate as we start this new school year. Our school mission of preparing academically and socially responsible students continues to guide our support for students. We are proud to see our students rank among the highest in the Bay Area and California in their academic performance. A brief overview of our most recent student data can be found under *BHS Fact Sheet* on the front page of our school website under *BHS Data & Reports*.

The highlights from this fact sheet show that increasing number of students at BHS are taking Advanced Placement exams, which are based on college-level courses offered at the high school level. In May of each year, students can take AP exams that might allow them to receive college credit with a qualifying score. With the Class of 2015, 97% of the graduates were headed off to college with 58% of the students planning to attend a 4-year college. Our students continue to score above the state and national mean in the SAT and ACT, which are assessments that colleges and universities use as one measure of college readiness. Another gauge of college readiness is the Early Assessment Program (EAP) through the California State University system. This past year, our juniors took the EAP as part of the new state assessment, CAASPP (California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress). On the EAP, our students performed at 86% ready & conditionally ready in English and 64% ready & conditionally ready in math. These results exceed our district, county, and state averages. Burlingame High School placed in the 2015 notable national and state rankings. Although BHS did not contribute to Newsweek ranking process, which is based on a self-reported survey by participating schools, two other independent organizations ranked BHS above the other San Mateo Union High School District schools.

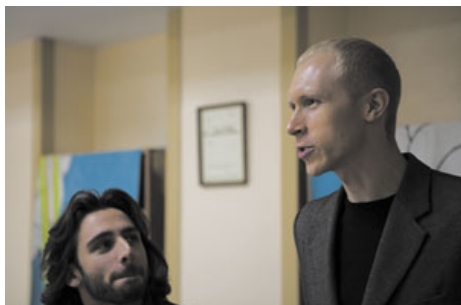


The 1965 team won their games decisively. Going 9-0 overall and 6-0 in League play. In fact the #2 team (Mills), went 5-1 that year losing to BHS 48-13. The Panthers scored 255pts while only giving up 71, this while playing the backups much of the time. This team avg score per game was (28 to 7). Burlingame had not won the Little Big game for the previous 6 years until the 1965 team beat the Bearcats 20-0 in a mud bowl at home on Thanksgiving Day.



## Mann on a Mission:

*Burlingame filmmaker is focus of TV series on HBO*

A Burlingame native, ushered into Hollywood through the endorsement of Ben Affleck and Matt Damon, is the star of a national television show documenting the creation of his first major film.

HBO's weekly reality-based series "Project Greenlight" is focusing this season on film director Jason Mann, who grew up locally and attended public schools in Hillsborough and Burlingame.

Mann, 30, said he is thrilled with the opportunities that have been presented to him since being selected for the show after a nationwide talent search.

"I've spent so many years trying to make feature films," he said. "It's really exciting for it to be coming to fruition, and for it to really be possible."

And as he ascends toward success in film industry, Mann credits his time growing up in San Mateo County for nurturing his passion for creativity.

"It's just a very fertile place for making art in a way that isn't focused on commerce," he said. "It's a great place to begin and experiment with things."

Music was Mann's initial outlet for expression, as he played in bands that toured throughout the region and into San Francisco.

Around the time he began attending Crocker Middle School in Hillsborough, before moving onto Burlingame High School, Mann turned his focus to film.

He said he found the transition from music to film natural, as he could easily identify parallels between recording his band and producing his movies.

From there, Mann went to attend Loyola Marymount University, where he studied film and began working as a writer, cinematographer and editor after graduation. Eventually, he was accepted into a master's degree program at Columbia University, where he began writing the script, which ultimately became the foundation for "The Leisure Class."

As "Project Greenlight" has been on the air for roughly a month, most of the reviews he's heard, including those from his parents who still live in Burlingame, are favorable, he said.

"From the outside perspective, it seems to be positive," he said. "It's fascinating the way to see the show causes so many reactions."

I didn't want to play the same stuff 6 days a week plus matinees, so I went to grad school and started teaching at the Minneapolis College of art. Twenty years latter i started getting phone calls about the band, doing interviews and having the album re-released. The interest and interviews have continued and become more focused and the discussion is about opening up the popular music scene to electronic music. Currently there is a documentary film being made about the band and the music we made and still make. While preparing for the film I read several of the interviews that I had done. The one thing that was constant in each of them was the first time I heard "Poeme Electronique" I realized how much I owed Jeannie and I would like to thank her 53 years latter (she was also the smartest person I had met to date.)" He told us he played a show on May 2nd and his 16



year-old daughter sang with the band. It was a thrill for him!

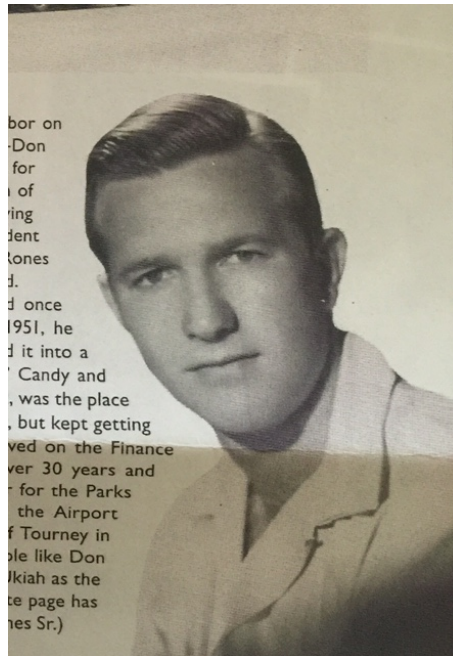

**Donald Elmer Rones, class of '34** tells us, he was born on October 22, 1916 in Centralia, Washington. In 1932, his parents opened Rones County Store on Burlingame Avenue. At the time, he was attending San Mateo High and transferred to BHS in his junior year where he played 20's basketball in his junior year and 30's basketball in senior year. He made all PAL forward. Lee Lancaster was his coach and feels he helped Donald mature and develop a very strong game.

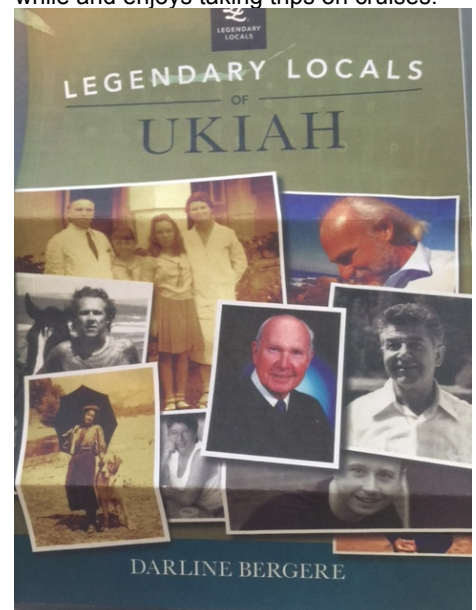
He says he was a fair student and the teacher that helped him the most was Drama Teacher, Mrs. Robinson. She told him not to worry and that he would be "successful in life." He said, this confidence did help him at times!

Donald didn't go to college; and says that he was a "hard knock" person that was lucky to have a successful career. He married in Honolulu in 1943. He and his wife were avid golfers and enjoyed going on cruises. He lost his wife in 2008 after 65 years of marriage. He has a retired son and a daughter who is a CPA with her

own business.

He was not in the service, but he was in Honolulu when Pearl Harbor attacks took place. He says, it so happened he and his friends were on their way to see his friend's brother when the attack happened. Donald says, they saw from the road the Japanese drop the bombs, The Arizona sinking, along with other major damage to ships etc. He says the declared "Marshal Law" stopped drafting and volunteering - "work defense or go to jail" He worked as an assistant personal manager at Pearl Harbor. He was laid off in 1944 when "SeaBEC" took over work. He worked for Manpower Commission to the end of the war. After the war, he joined the family business in Burlingame 1945-1952. Due to business conditions being hard to meet, they moved the business to Ukiah in 1952 and turned the local candy and ice cream store into a successful business. After serving four years on the city council, he took the position of mayor of Ukiah from 1957-1958. They sold the business in 1958 and he went to work in the propane gas business where he worked his way up to CEO. He has since served on the Finance Committee for the Ukiah Valley Medical Center for over 30 years and been president of the Men's Golf Club, a board member for the Parks and Recreation Commission, and a board member for the Airport Commission. He helped to establish the Invitational Golf Tourney in 1960 and continued playing golf every week. Donald retired in Dec. 1999 in Ukiah, Calif.

Presently, he is a Trustee Board member at the Ukiah Adventist Hospital and a Honorary Deputy Sheriff Mendocino County. Three years ago, Donald married again; she is 90 and he is 98! He says, "great fun!" and still golfs once in a while and enjoys taking trips on cruises!

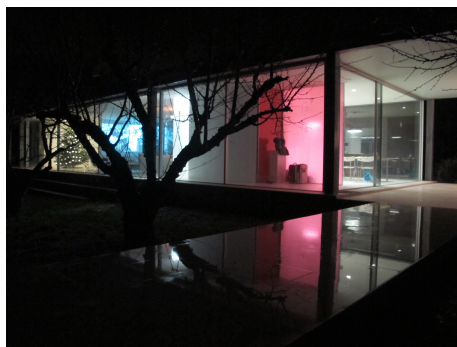

Currently I live in the south of France with my husband, Peter Muyldermans, a Belgian radiation oncologist, who I married in 2000. (During our marriage he has been bishop of the ward in Aix-en-Provence and I have been in charge of the Women's Relief Society - both voluntary.) We are super happy and live in a cherry orchard and a truffle farm where we see wild boar, foxes, badgers, partridges, red toads, incredible insects, Neolithic tools, tons of stars, and even found a meteorite that fell.
