ABOUT THE WILDCATS ...

Wildcats Storylines ...

UNFAMILIAR OPPONENT: The Saint Ignatius Wildcats will square off against the Mount St. Joseph Gaels (MD) for the first time in program history. The Gaels hale from Baltimore and play in the Maryland Interscholastic Athletic Association. In the 2020 season, the Gaels were only able to play one game due to the pandemic. The Gaels were victorious in that single game with a 22-19 win over Palloti. Mount St. Joseph comes off a season-opening victory last week against St. Mary's Ryken with a score of 14-10. Saint Ignatius comes into the match-up 0-2, dropping two close games to Springfield and Mentor. The Wildcats look to turn their season around with a win against a formidable opponent in Mount St. Joseph.

CLOCK CONTROL: The Saint Ignatius offense has significantly controlled the time of possession in the first two weeks of the 2021 season. In week one, the Wildcats held the ball for over 39 minutes against Springfield. In Mentor, the Wildcats owned the time of possession game, controlling the ball for over 24 minutes. The Wildcats have shown to put themselves in the best position with controlling the clock; they do that with a steady dose of running and short passing.

LENEHAN ON THE LOOSE: It is hard to script the type of season Marty Lenehan is having in the first two weeks. Lenehan has carried the pigskin 40 times for a total of 209 yards and four touchdowns to open the season. Lenehan has shown terrific downhill running ability and is the anchor to the Wildcat offense. Lenehan put on an excellent performance last week vs. Mentor, willing the Wildcats to be within shooting distance against the Cardinals. During the crunch time of the fourth quarter, Lenehan broke away with a 52-yard touchdown run to cut the Mentor lead to two. If the Wildcats want to get into the win column this week, they'll need to rely on a heavy dose of Lenehan.

MEN UP FRONT: Last week the Wildcats offensive line allowed zero sacks on their senior quarterback Joey Pfaff. In week one, Pfaff was sacked three times by Springfield. In week two, the offensive front of Ashton Montgomery, Joe Ryland, Patrick Lavelle, Dominic Ference and Brian Keane was remarkable, keeping Pfaff's jersey clean and time in the pocket. It went even further than the passing game, as the offensive line paved the way for 157 rushing yards against the Cardinals. The O-Line focuses on every small detail to become the best unit on the field and made a massive jump after week one; they'll look to continue that effort into week three.

FEROCIOUS FRONT: The Wildcats defensive line showed remarkable resilience in week two. The Cardinals jumped ahead after one half to a score of 21-7 and would receive the ball to begin the second half. The defensive line made a significant adjustment in the second half, making life miserable for the Cardinal offense. The night was highlighted by the return of Thomas Wasinski, who seemed to be giving Jacob Snow pressure all night in the backfield, forcing an interception in the third quarter. Peter Chalhoub and Will Robinson locked down the end positions, containing the run. The Wildcats defense only allowed 70 rushing yards and has shown to be a team that makes their opponent one-dimensional.

PALINSKI'S PALS: Behind the defensive line's spectacular performance was a masterful showing by the line-backer core. In the second half, the Wildcats backers bunkered down and limited the offensive production from the Cardinals. Max Palinski has shown versatility on the field as he can blitz the offense or drop back into coverage and play man-to-man against a tight end. The linebacking group continues to play hard-nosed football with Christopher Aerni, Gavin Berger and Blase Mastrianni's stand-up performances.

MAN-TO-MAN MANGAN: Jack Mangan has been a terrific coverage back for the Wildcats defense. In just two weeks, the senior has collected two interceptions. Last week in the fourth quarter, while Mentor was driving, Mangan picked off a Cardinal pass on a trick play to keep it a one score game.

IN ELDRIDGE WE TRUST: Zeb Eldridge shows why he is a top 50 specialist in the nation as he has become ole reliable. Eldridge hit two field goals last week in the third quarter, one from 37 yards and the other from 33 yards, to put the Wildcats in a one-score ball game heading to the fourth. Eldridge won the field position game for the Wildcats, punting three times for an average of 39.7 yards.

OH CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN: The captains for the 2021 season are #22 Marty Lenehan, #34 Christopher Aerni, #95 Peter Chalhoub and #99 Thomas Wasinski.

What we know about the Gaels ...

WATKINS FILE: Winston Watkins will be the signal-caller for the Gaels in the 2021 season. Last week the sophomore quarterback threw two touchdown passes, including the game-winner in the closing minutes to senior Dominic Kibby against St. Mary's Ryken, as the Gaels won 14-10 in week one. The Gaels won the Brother Lambert Cup against their Xavian Brothers of St. Mary's Ryken. Watkins was 12-of-26, passing the ball for 211 yards.

KIBBY'S CATCH: Watkins mentioned after the week one win his trust in Dominic Kibby and will take chances deep downfield to the senior target. With 2:30 left to play in regulation, Watkins lobbed a pass to Kibby, who hauled in what would be the gamewinner against St. Mary's Ryken. Kibby finished with four receptions for 74 yards. Watkins favorite target from week one was junior Ronald Goodridge, who caught three passes for 115 yards. Goodridge opened the scoring last week with a 32-yard touchdown reception from Watkins.

RETURN TO NORMALCY: For the Gaels, this is a return to normalcy. Last season, the Gaels could only play one game until the season was called due to COVID-19. In 2019 the MIAA schools played at their discretion, but league standings were not kept. Dominic Damico took over as head coach in 2020 and looks for an entire season in 2021.

EDGE RUSHER: Stephen Schulze is the leader on the defense. Schulze stands at 6'3" 245 lbs and racked up two sacks in the win vs. St. Mary's Ryken. Schulze is an edge rusher that doesn't give up on the play and is an example of how the Gaels defense plays. Mount St. Joseph fell behind early in week one and the defense found its second wind to allow the Gaels to get a week one victory.

CRUNCH TIME PLAY: The game-sealing play was made by defensive back Charles Wilson. As St. Mary's Ryken was driving on the Gaels, Wilson intercepted a pass to seal Mount St. Joseph's 14-10 victory in the Lambert Cup. The Gaels have now won six straight games dating back to the 2019 season. The Gaels can win tight ball games, which is demonstrated with the senior leader-ship of the program.

RB MARTY LENEHAN '22



The workhorse of the offense is senior Marty Lenehan. Lenehan has opened the season on a tear for the Wildcats. In two games, Lenehan has reached the endzone four times.

Last week Lenehan toted the rock 20 times for 125 yards. Lenehan highlighted the comeback effort with a 52-yard touchdown run to keep the Wildcats close.

Lenehan will be a critical piece for Coach Kyle's Wildcats as they face a stand-up defense in the Mount St. Joseph Gaels.

The Wildcats run offense has been superb to open the 2021 campaign and will look to continue that on Saturday for their first win of the season.

DB JACK MANGAN '22

2021 marks the 94th season that football has been played on this location, now known as Byers Field at Robert M. Boulton Stadium.

The press box, which has been upgraded in the past five seasons with a new working media area and new windows, seats 30 journalists and broadcasters.

New field turf was installed for the 2012 season. The stadium has also had handicap seating added to both sets of grandstands, including 46 wheelchair and companion seats on the home side of the stadium.

Parma City Schools invested nearly \$1.2 million into the facility during the summer of 2014, including a new parking lot on the south end of the stadium and the full replacement of the parking lot on the east side of the stadium under the press box.

On August 26, 2009, Byers Field was re-dedicated and renamed in honor of Robert M. Boulton, the retired Superintendent of Athletics for the Parma City Schools and a Parma Senior High grad.

The new name – Byers Field at Robert M. Boulton Stadium – was revealed, during a 50-yard line ceremony, to Mr. Boulton for his many years of service to the community.

GAME PREVIEW

WILDCATS READY FOR SOME HOME COOKING

Saint Ignatius is looking for their first win heading into week three against Baltimore Mount St. Joseph. The Wildcats play their first home game of the 2021 season at Byers Field, their first game at Byers since the Regional Semifinal against Medina. In the shortened 2020 season for the Wildcats, they only played one home game which was the season opener against Bishop Sycamore.

"Well, it's nice to have a home game because we didn't have many last season," says Head Football Coach Chuck Kyle '69. "It's nice to have a crowd and that makes it exciting; we're eager to be back at Byers Field.

SAINT IGNATIUS OFFENSE VS. MOUNT ST. JOSEPH DEFENSE

The Wildcats have won multiple areas of the stats game in the first two weeks of the season; unfortunately for Saint Ignatius, that has not translated to a win. Time of possession has been the most dominating factor for the Wildcat offense in the 2021 season; last week, the Cats offense possessed the ball for nearly 25 minutes. Saint Ignatius outgained Mentor in week two, 365 to 315.

Marty Lenehan went over the century mark a week ago, rushing for 125 yards and two touchdowns. The Wildcats rely heavily on the groundwork of Lenehan. "Those who saw our games last season saw Marty Lenehan get better and better," explains Kyle. "He does some things after the first hit that Nick Chubb would be impressed."

For the first time in coach Kyle's 39 years of coaching, he witnessed a hurdling penalty on his running back in Lenehan. "I've coached for a long time and that was the first time we've got a penalty for hurdling," Kyle says. "He runs through people; he is absolutely relentless when gaining yardage."

The Wildcats offensive front will have their hands full this week, taking on edge rusher Stephen Schulze. Schulze is a formidable foe that will be attracting many double teams out of the Wildcats offense line. Schulze, in the season opener last week, tallied two sacks in the 14-10 victory.

"Defensively, they are aggressive and have no hesitation to blitz," Kyle explains. "They want to force the action at the line of scrimmage and we're expecting an aggressive approach from their defense."

In the secondary, the Gaels received a clutch play from Charles Wilson, who picked off the St. Mary's Ryken quarterback to seal a victory in week one.

The Wildcats offense looks to piece 48 minutes of football together to win as they play a Maryland powerhouse in Mount St. Joseph.

SAINT IGNATIUS DEFENSE VS. MOUNT ST. JOSEPH OFFENSE

The Wildcat defense was resilient in week two against the Mentor Cardinals. In the second quarter, big pass plays from Jacob Snow gave Mentor a 21-7 lead at the break. However, in the second half, the Saint Ignatius defense did not allow another Mentor offensive score, showing the toughness of the defense for the Wildcats.

"Our defense really took a step last week," says Kyle. "The defense took command of the game in the second half; I think they are ready to get back on the field and step up again."

In the first two weeks, the defense has shown to limit the ground attack and force oppositions to become one-dimensional. In last week's match-up, the Wildcats held the Cardinals to just 70 yards on the ground. They have received tremendous effort from the front seven and will need to continue to play that hard nose style of defense in week three against the number eight ranked team in Maryland.

The Gaels offense is led by sophomore quarterback Winston Watkins, who started last Saturday in his first varsity game against St. Mary's Ryken. Watkins was 12-of-26, passing the ball for 211 yards and two touchdowns. Watkins threw the game-winning pass to Dominic Kibby with under three minutes to play.

"Offensively, they will spread you out and they have a quarterback that throws the ball well," Kyle explains. "Their running game is what we've seen; they pull the guard and move bodies around and have the big-play ability."

The secondary for the Wildcats will look to continue to generate turnovers in week three as so far this season have forced four interceptions. Senior Jack Mangan is responsible for two of the four, picking off Jacob Snow a week ago in the fourth quarter.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Zeb Eldridge has been a reliable piece for coach Kyle's team early in the season. Last Friday, the senior kicker was 2-2 in kicks, both coming in the third quarter. Eldridge also has been terrific in the punt game, winning the field position battle. Against Mentor, he punted the ball three times for an average of 39.7 yards, backing up an explosive Mentor offense.

Saint Ignatius will kick-off against Mount St. Joseph in the 2021 home opener Saturday, September 4, from Byers Field at 1 p.m. The two teams square off for the first time in program history.

The Wildcats continued their 2021 campaign by paying an east-side visit to the Mentor Cardinals. It seems as though these two Northeast Ohio powerhouses never disappoint when they meet on the gridiron, and this occasion was no exception. The Wildcats fell short of their comeback and ultimately lost to the Cardinals, who capitalized on numerous Wildcat mistakes throughout the game.

Comeback Falls Short

Mentor kicked off the rivalry game with a score after the Wildcats turned the ball over on downs. Quarterback Jacob Snow then took over on offense and led the Cardinals deep into Saint Ignatius territory through a series of quick passes. Snow then rolled out and found his #1 target Evan Harper for a 13-yard score in the left corner of the end zone to make it 7-0 Cardinals with 4:28 remaining in the 1st quarter. Both teams had multiple first-quarter possessions but failed to come away with points, causing the Cats to enter the second guarter down by seven.

The Wildcats got to work quickly in the 2nd quarter; when Wildcats senior quarterback Joey Pfaff took the field. Pfaff helped fuel a touchdown drive to answer the Cardinals. Pfaff made several completions on the possession to set up a Marty Lenehan four-yard TD run with 10:39 left in the second guarter to knot the game at seven.

Later in the second quarter, with the score still tied 7-7, the Wildcat defense had set up a third and five for the Mentor offense. What the Cats hoped to turn into a critical stop midway through the second quarter turned into a 63-yard touchdown pass out of the hands of Snow. Harper was on the receiving end, who caught his second touchdown with 7:39 to go in the first half.

Snow unloaded an 72-yard TD pass to speedy slot receiver Michael Norwood to make it 21-7 Cardinals. 21-7 remained the score as both teams headed to the locker room at halftime.

As the second half got underway, the Wildcats would force three and out on the Mentor offense. Back on offense, the Wildcats began to chip away at Mentor's lead and got within striking distance of the endzone before having to settle for a 37-yard FG with 8:43 left in the third by senior Zeb Eldridge to cut the Mentor lead to 21-10. On the next offensive possession for the Cardinals, Wildcat senior safety Joe Norris picked off Snow to give the Cats offense excellent field position. This would set up another Eldridge field goal, this time from 33-yards out. The Cats made it a one-possession game, 21-13, with 6:03 left in the third quarter.

As the clock continued to wind down into the crunch time of the fourth quarter, the Cardinals had marched down inside the Wildcat 10-yard line. Then, the Cardinals exhibited the "Mentor Special" as wide-out Nick Jares attempted to throw a pass to Snow. Senior corner Jack Mangan intercepted the pass at the goal line, his second in as many games.

Following the forced turnover, Lenehan took over. Lenehan had the play of the season so far when he broke tackles and followed a key block downfield by senior Steven Bodamer before eventually bursting into the endzone for a 52-yard touchdown run. The touchdown from Lenehan, his fourth on the season, made it 21-19 with 5:04 left in the game.

Just as the Wildcats' defense was ready to get a monumental stop, Harper took the ensuing kick-off 98-yards to the house to give his team a 28-19 lead with 4:45 to go.

Finding themselves back on offense, thanks to some help from the defense, the Wildcats scored again to make it a twopoint deficit, 28-26, with 1:17 left. This time, the sophomore, Sean Martin, caught a 17-yard TD pass from Pfaff, using his speed

to break for the pylon. It was Martin's first touchdown of his varsity career.

Even with the touchdown, Coach Kyle's Wildcats still needed a miracle. Unfortunately, the onside did not bounce the Cats way. Mentor went into victory formation and officially closed the book on a highly wild game with a chaotic fourth quarter.


