## 2023 BIOSTEEL ALL-AMERICAN GAME

The 2023 BioSteel All-American Game features the top U.S.-born players eligible for the NHL Draft. More than 190 NHL scouts are expected to be in attendance at USA Hockey Arena for tonight's game. The 45 players participating in tonight's game hail from 14 different states. Minnesota leads the way with 12 representatives, followed by New York, Michigan, Illinois, Massachusetts and California. In total, 20 different NCAA Division I colleges are represented, as 43 of the players are currently committed to play college hockey as part of their hockey development. Twelve different USHL member clubs are represented in the game, including 22 players from USA Hockey's National Team Development Program. This year's game will be the eleventh BioSteel All-American Game, and fourth consecutive game in Plymouth, Mich. The game's format includes mixed rosters with players from multiple teams comprising Team Blue and Team White.

## INTERNATIONAL PREPARATIONS

### IIHF UNDER-18 MEN'S WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP

USA Hockey will soon be preparing for the IIHF Under-18 Men's World Championship, set to be held in Basel and Porrentruy, Switzerland, from April 20-30, 2023. The U.S. has won gold 10 times at the IIHF Men's Under-18 World Championship and had previously medaled in a record 16 consecutive tournaments prior to 2021. Many players have moved on to success at the NHL and international levels from this premiere event. The U.S. Under-18 Men's National Team most recently finished second at the 2022 IIHF Under-18 Men's World Championship, which was held in Kaufbeuren and Landshut, Germany. 15 BAAG alumni played for the U.S. at the 2022 IIHF U18 Men's World Championship. At Many players from tonight's BioSteel All-American Game will represent the U.S. internationally for the first time in IIHF competition at the Under-18 Men's World Championship.

### IIHF WORLD JUNIOR CHAMPIONSHIP

Many participants from BioSteel All-American Game go on to participate in the World Junior Summer Showcase, and eventually the IIHF World Junior Championship on the U.S. National Junior Team. USA Hockey staff in attendance will be watching players throughout the week in preparations for the 2024 IIHF World Junior Championship, set to be held in Gothenburg, Sweden. The U.S. most recently won bronze at the 2023 IIHF World Junior Championship, after defeating Sweden 8-7 in overtime in the bronze medal game. **Logan Cooley**, **Jimmy Snuggerud** and captain **Luke Hughes** were named the three best players of the tournament for Team USA. Cooley played in both the 2021 and 2022 BioSteel All-American Games, while Snuggerud participated in 2022. **Rutger McGroarty**, who was 2022 BioSteel All-American Game MVP, finished the tournament with one goal and six assists in seven games played.

## ADDITIONAL NOTES

### USA HOCKEY OFFICIALS

The BioSteel All-American Game is a feature event for linesmen and officials, highlighting some of the brightest young talent in USA Hockey's Officiating Development Program:

#### REFEREE - LOGAN GRUHL

The Richmond, Virginia, native has been an official since age 14, and in 2017 he joined the USA Hockey Officiating Development Program. He has previously officiated the 2018 Robertson Cup (NAHL), the 2019 Clark Cup Final (USHL), and most recently the 2022 Kelly Cup Conference Finals (ECHL). Gruhl is in his third full-time season as an ECHL referee.

#### REFEREE - JACK YOUNG

The Chicago native is a graduate of the USA Hockey Officiating Development Program, and began as a linesman during the 2018-19 season before transitioning to a referee for the 2019-20 campaign. He has previously officiated the 2021 NA3HL and NAHL Top Prospect Tournaments, the 2019 and 2021 Fraser Cup Championships (NA3HL), the 2019 and 2021 Robertson Cup Finals (NAHL), the 2022 Under-17 Five Nations Tournament, and the 2023 IIHF Under-20 Men's World Championship Division 1 Group A. Young is in his third season as an AHL referee, and his second as an ECHL referee.

#### LINESMAN - MICHAEL IFKOVITS

Ifkovits, 27, was born and raised in Bartlett, Illinois. He is currently officiating his fourth season as a linesman in the United States Hockey League and fifth season in USA Hockey's Officiating Development Program. Ifkovits was previously selected for the 2020 and 2021 NAHL Top-Prospects Tournaments, the 2021 and 2022 NA3HL Fraser Cup Finals, the 2021 NAHL Robertson Cup Final, and the 2022 Conference Final in the USHL. In September of 2022, Ifkovits officiated the Tom Kurvers Prospect Showcase between the Minnesota Wild and Chicago Blackhawks. Ifkovits played four seasons at Robert Morris University Illinois for the ACHA club hockey team, serving as captain in his senior season. He has been involved with officiating at various levels since he was 13.

#### LINESMAN - DAVIDS ROZĪTIS

Rozītis currently resides in Elka Park, NY. A dual citizen of Latvia and the United States, Rozītis graduated from Southern New Hampshire University with a bachelor's degree in criminal justice and is currently at Bellevue University studying a master's degree in crime management and justice administration. A four-year member of USA Hockey's Officiating Development Program, Rozītis worked as a linesman for the NAHL and USHL before being hired by the ECHL, where he is currently in his third year overall and second full-time. Rozītis also has experience on the international stage, having worked the 2022 IIHF U18 World Championships in Landshut and Kaufbeuren, Germany, and the 2023 IIHF Men's Under-20 Division 1 Group A Championships in Asker, Norway.

#### AMERICANS AT THE 2022 NHL DRAFT

A total of 49 Americans were selected in the 2022 NHL Draft, and for the fifth straight year, an American was taken among the top five picks when **Logan Cooley** (Pittsburgh, Pa.) and **Cutter Gauthier** (Scottsdale, Ariz.) were selected third overall and fifth overall, respectively. Cooley was selected by the Arizona Coyotes, while Gauthier was drafted by the Philadelphia Flyers. Both Cooley and Gauthier played in the 2022 BioSteel All-American Game, where Cooley tallied one assist, and Gauthier recorded two assists. Overall, seven Americans were selected in the first round in 2022, all of whom played in the 2022 BioSteel All-American Game.

### NHL DRAFT HISTORY

A total of 266 players from the BioSteel All-American Game have gone on to be selected in the NHL Draft, including 58 first round selections. Since 2012, more than 23 players have been selected each season. Many alumni, drafted and undrafted, have gone on to play in the NHL and internationally for USA Hockey. ### CHRIS CLARK SPECIAL GUEST

Chris Clark will be speaking with game participants later tonight at dinner, following the BioSteel All-American Game. The former Washington Capitals captain played junior hockey with the NEJHL's Springfield Olympics, and went on to play four years at Clarkson University, where he was named captain for the 1996-97 season. Clark played in more than 600 NHL games across 11 seasons, and represented the U.S. internationally with USA Hockey as captain of the 2007 U.S. Men's National Team. In addition to the Capitals, Clark also played with the Flames and the Blue Jackets. Since retiring from his playing career in 2012, Clark has served in multiple front office positions with the Columbus Blue Jackets organization, most recently as Director of Player Personnel for the NHL team, and general manager of the AHL affiliate Cleveland Monsters.

The American Development Model, now in its 14th season, is USA Hockey's nationwide player development program for youth hockey associations. It's based on age-appropriate, age-specific competition and training for boys and girls, beginning with their first steps onto the ice and carrying them through age 18 and beyond. The ADM places a heightened emphasis on skill development and long-term athlete development principles, providing a blueprint for the best possible youth hockey experience.
