CODE OF ETHICS

Preamble

One of the distinguishing characteristics of a profession in education may be that its members are cognizant of, and perhaps dedicated to, rendering a service to humanity. As educators who choose to coach football, we must understand that the justification for football is that it provides educational and physical values for those who play the game, and the game essentially belongs to the players who choose to play it. The welfare of the game depends on how coaches live up to the spirit and letter of ethical conduct, and how coaches, as educators, model ethical conduct, and remain mindful of the trust and confidence placed in them by colleagues, players, and the public.

Purpose

This code of ethics has been developed to protect, promote, and preserve the best interests of the game and the coaching profession. Its primary purpose is to clarify and distinguish ethical and professional practices from those which are detrimental. Its secondary purpose is to emphasize the value of football as an experience that contributes to the overall education of the student-athlete and to stress proper functions in relation to schools, players, and the public.

Article One – Responsibility to Players

1. Coaches shall be aware of the tremendous influence they have on the education of the student-athlete; therefore, they shall never place the value of winning above the value of instilling the highest ideals of character and integrity.
2. Coaches shall follow or create and enforce a set of training rules for players that reflect the positive values of abstaining from drugs, alcohol, and tobacco.
3. Coaches shall never place the value of winning over the safety and welfare of players.
4. Coaches shall not exert pressure on faculty members to give players special consideration.
5. Coaches shall show respect to all players by treating them with integrity and honesty in both verbal and nonverbal behavior, regardless of their role or contribution to the team.
6. Coaches are responsible for their players' actions on the field and must not permit them to perform with the intent of causing injury to opposing players.
7. Coaches shall not seek unfair advantage by teaching deliberate unsportsmanlike behavior to players; they shall instruct players to play within the written rules and within the spirit of the game at all times.

Article Two – Professional Behavior

1. Coaches shall exemplify the highest moral character, behavior, and leadership.
2. Coaches shall display modesty in victory and be gracious in defeat.
3. Coaches shall promote ethical relationships among fellow coaches.
4. Prior to, and following contests, coaches for the competing teams should meet and exchange cordial greetings to set the correct tone for the event.

Article Three – Sportsmanship

1. Coaches shall exhibit, model, and teach good sportsmanship.
2. Coaches shall exert their influence to enhance sportsmanship by spectators, both directly and by working closely with cheerleaders, pep clubs, booster groups, parents, and administrators.

Article Four – Scouting

It is considered ethical to scout opponents only during games and agreed upon scrimmages, and within the designated rules of the conference or section by-laws. The head coach is responsible for the actions of his scouts.

Article Five – Relationships with Game Officials

Coaches shall respect the integrity and judgment of the game official. Coaches shall not indulge in conduct which would incite players or spectators against officials. Public criticism of officials is considered unethical.

The MFCA salutes the 2024 Man of the Year – John Millea. John has been a journalist for more than 50 years, beginning when he was a high school sophomore writing for his hometown weekly newspaper in Graettinger, Iowa. His duties included writing about football games in which he played. As a lineman, his name was never in the story ... but every story began with “By John Millea.”

After earning a journalism degree at Drake University in Des Moines, he worked at three newspapers in Iowa and one in Arizona, followed by nearly 20 years at the Minnesota Star Tribune. He was hired on the sports desk, where his duties included editing Sid Hartman columns. That was heavy lifting. After moving to the writing side, his time at the Star Tribune included covering all the

professional teams in the Twin Cities before being assigned to the high school sports beat, which was the best thing that ever happened to him. He joined the Minnesota State High School League in 2010, authoring John’s Journal stories for the MSHSL website and staying busy on social media while visiting high schools all over Minnesota.

Often asked about his favorite high school events, John’s reply centers on football games. The games themselves are wonderful, but the scope of a football game extends much farther, including the fans, the bands, the cheerleaders, the little kids playing football behind the bleachers and much more. He believes high school football is the essence of America.

John and his wife Beth were high school sweethearts and they remain sweethearts after more than 42 years of marriage. They have three children and two grandchildren. Their sons, John Jr. and Joe, live in northern California and their daughter Allison teaches English at Burnsville High School. All are graduates of Rosemount High School.

After his lengthy journalism career, highlighted by decades of joy writing about high school sports in Minnesota, John will retire later this year with a full heart.

CHRIS MOSCHO is a native of Melrose, Minnesota and attended St. Cloud State University. He was named the head coach at Belgrade-Brooten-Elrosa in 2010 and he's led the Jaguars to two state tournament appearances. He coached in the 2021 MFCAs All Star Football Game and in 2023 was recognized by the MN Football Coaches Association as the Class A Coach of the Year.

Chris and his wife, Missy, have four active children – Ava (11), Addie (9), Will(7), and Max (5) – all involved in BBE Activities.

Besides his responsibilities as a 4/5 elementary school teacher, Chris also coaches both of his daughter's basketball teams and is the Junior High baseball coach for BBE.

In early 2024, Chris was diagnosed with lung cancer. In February of 2024 he underwent surgery to remove the lower lobe of his lung along with several nodules where the cancer had spread. A challenging recovery process which involved the difficult and exhausting process of chemotherapy put Coach Moscho on the road to recovery. With an uncertain road ahead, Chris learned to rest and take time with his family.

Chris writes: "This experience has been life-changing in many ways. I've learned a lot about myself, my faith, and the importance of leaning on my support system. Now, life has mostly returned to normal, and at times, I even forget about everything—until my scheduled checkups remind me."

BROYLES AWARD

It was a great honor for me to attend the Broyles Award event in Hot Springs, Arkansas, in February, 2024 as the 2023 High School Assistant Coach of the Year representing Minnesota. With the number of excellent coaches in Minnesota, it was humbling to have been chosen and given such an opportunity. The weekend was an incredibly memorable, positive, and affirming experience. I'm thankful.

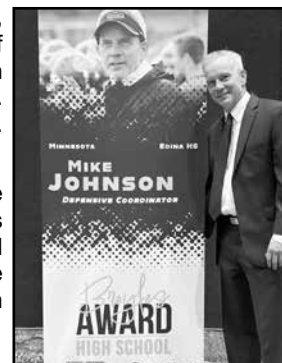
The event took place at Oaklawn Resort in Hot Springs, Arkansas, a large venue that includes a race track, casino, and hotel. Thursday night was a luxurious banquet, 700 people attending, to recognize the college finalists. Football greats Mark May and Desmond Howard spoke, along with all five finalists, the award going to Notre Dame's DC Al Golden. The presence of the 40 or so High School winners was specifically called out and affirmed.

Friday morning we had a high school coaches' breakfast, all of us wearing our school's colors. Throughout the day, strangers would approach high school coaches to strike up conversations, ask questions about where we were from, and congratulate us. The event was well publicized locally, and because Frank Broyles is an Arkansas football coaching legend, people were interested.

Friday night was a high school coaches' banquet and ring presentation, about 200 in attendance, again a luxurious meal, this time with Nebraska HC Matt Rhule speaking. It was incredibly affirming of the role of high school coaches in general and assistant coaches in particular, and it was fascinating to meet high school coaches from all over the United States.

The Broyles Award was created in 1996 recognizing Coach Frank Broyles' legacy of selecting and developing assistants during his almost two decades as head coach at Arkansas. Since 2018 it has included recognition of top high school assistant coaches from participating states. Broyles' legacy also includes the establishment of the Frank and Barbara Broyles Legacy Foundation, a non-profit that provides support to caregivers of individuals with Alzheimer's at no cost.

The weekend was an experience of a lifetime. I'm thankful for so many coaches and players who have impacted me, and I'm thankful to the MFCA for sending me. Again, thanks.



State Winners Announced for Inaugural NFF National High School Academic Excellence Award



IRVING, Texas (January 29, 2025) – The National Football Foundation (NFF) & College Hall of Fame today announced the 65 state winners of the 2024-25 NFF National High School Academic Excellence Awards, Presented by the Rose Bowl Legacy Foundation. The initiative honors the top academic football teams from each level of play within each state and is designed to inspire and foster a culture of academic excellence in high school football teams throughout the nation.

The 65 teams will now vie as finalists for the NFF Hatchell Cup, Presented by Bob's Steak & Chop House. The Hatchell Cup winner will be announced Feb. 4, recognizing the top individual high school football team in the nation for excellence in the classroom, on the field and in the community. The Hatchell Cup, named in honor of NFF President & CEO Steve Hatchell, comes with a \$10,000 donation.

Eligibility requirements for the awards include: a minimum cumulative team GPA of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale; superior academic application and performance; and a successful football season. Each state's high school coaches association selects their respective state's winners from a pool of nominees submitted by each school's head coaches. A national selection committee is responsible for choosing one school as the recipient of the Hatchell Cup as the best team in the nation.

“Success in athletics and academics isn't a matter of choosing one over the other—it's about the discipline, dedication, and determination to excel in both,” said NFF Chairman Archie Manning. “We are proud to recognize these football teams as the top academic performers in their respective states. The administrators, communities, and families should all be incredibly proud of the accomplishments of these players and coaches. By inspiring teams to compete in the classroom with the same competitive spirit that it takes to win on the field, we are helping to prepare high school football players for lifelong success.”

“We are extremely proud to partner with the National Football Foundation in awarding the Academic Excellence Award in the state of Minnesota and we truly appreciate the NFF's efforts in helping recognize high school student-athletes that are excelling both on the gridiron and in the classroom. The life-lessons our student-athletes continue to gain by balancing both football and the classroom will provide a solid foundation for them to build off of as they move on in their lives. We are excited to continue this initiative with the National Football Foundation in the future and look forward to celebrating our coaches and players,” stated Minnesota Football Coaches Association President Nick David.

2025 Distinguished Service Award

The recipient of the 2025 MFCA Distinguished Service Award goes to the Community of Randolph.

Remarkably, this community raised \$70,834 this past fall for Tackle Cancer! Randolph's three-year total comes to \$182,000 raised for Tackle Cancer. The 2024 campaign saw a record \$635,017 raised through Tackle Cancer. This brings the 13-year total to 4.1 million dollars! All proceeds from Tackle Cancer go to the Randy Shaver Cancer Research and Community Fund. This past year, The Shaver Cancer Research and Community Fund funded 28 research projects and 11 and patient aid grants which totaled 1.3 million dollars.

How does a community with a population less than 500 people raise \$70,834 for Tackle Cancer? It comes down to a simple acronym: F.A.M.I.L.Y. **F**orget **A**bout **M**e, **I** **L**ove **Y**ou. Randolph Minnesota is a community whose people have a history of putting others before themselves. A community who, time and time again, comes together for a single cause. The efforts displayed for Tackle Cancer this past season is no exception.

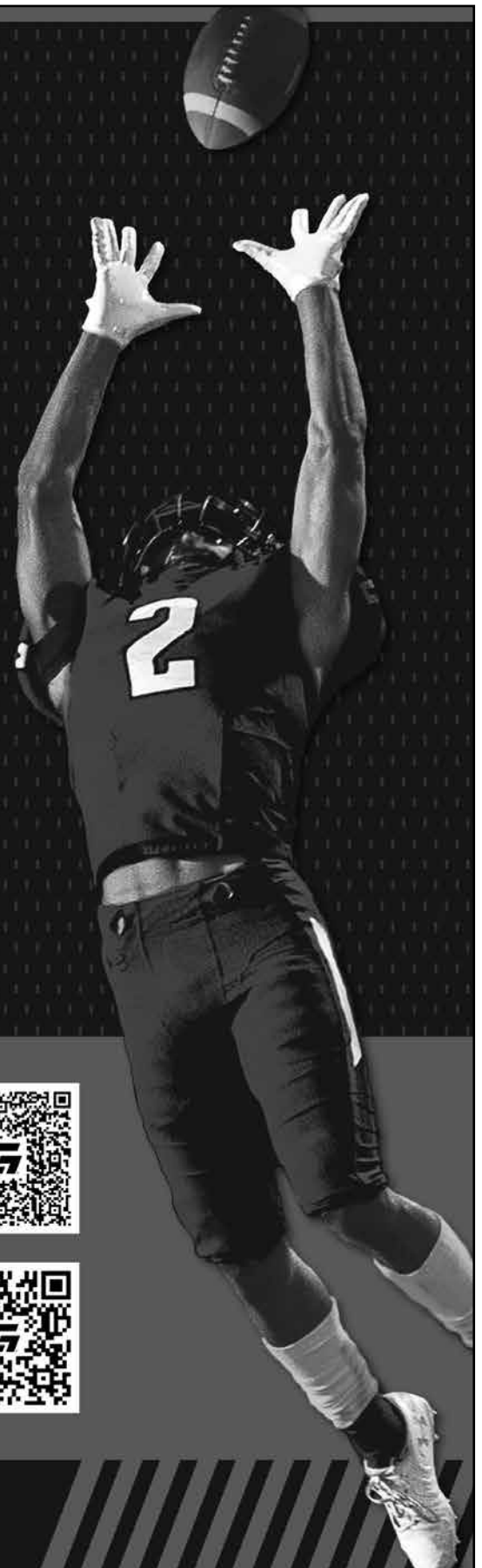

BOB NIELSON—UNIVERSITY OF SOUTH DAKOTA

Following the program's most successful season in the Division 1 FCS era, Coach Nielson is stepping down after 32 seasons as a collegiate head coach, including the final nine at the University of South Dakota. Coaching stops along the way included: Wartburg College, Ripon College, Western Illinois, UW-Eau Claire and Minnesota-Duluth where Nielson led the Bulldogs to two NCAA Division II National Championships. The Coyotes, in Nielson's final season, won their first-ever Missouri Valley title, posted an 11-3 record and earned a spot in the FCS semi-finals. He finishes his career with a 239-128-1 record, ranking 42nd all-time against college football coaches across all levels.

Joe Rush is the Youth and High School Football Manager for the Minnesota Vikings, where he has spent the past seven years supporting the growth of the game at the grassroots level. JUSTIN VOSS—NORTH BRANCH HIGH SCHOOL

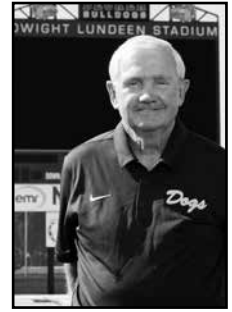

LUCAS NOWINSKY—ELK RIVER HIGH SCHOOL

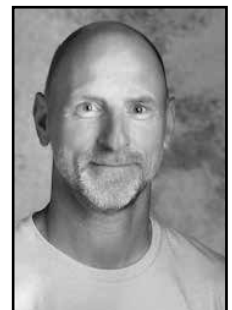

Fastbreak Football was formed in the spring of 2021 after Travis Walch (University of St. Thomas and Winona State) spoke at the MFCA youth clinic about incorporating multi-sport drills into football programming. A longtime high school and college football coach, Tom Menke (Minnetonka, Prior Lake and St. Olaf), pitched Coach Walch the idea of joining forces to create a football curriculum featuring gamified, small-sided football drills with the goal to regrow our sport and retain athletes. The formula was simple: increase football touches, reps and fun with drills that optimally challenge, score and have game-like tasks. Fastbreak Football is currently working on a format to help youth football associations train their coaches through the combination of clinics, camps and an online drill catalog organized by skill acquisition (throwing, blocking, pursuit, coverage, etc.). This mind, body and skill-based program focuses on producing football-ready body awareness, explosive agility, ball mastery and championship decision making. In less than two years, Fastbreak Football has worked with over 2,000 football participants, youth through HS, in Minnesota, Wisconsin and Iowa. This past football season, they intertwined Fastbreak Football at Saint Thomas Academy where they were part of a staff that led The Cadets to a 5A state championship game berth, losing to Chanhassen in Overtime.
