Roles & Responsibilities

- Obtain playing roster for both teams
- Record goals, assists, saves and penalties on official scoresheet
- Ensure scoresheet is signed and distributed following the game

DO:

- Pay attention to the game
- Remain impartial
- Respect all game participants
- Ask the referee when uncertain about penalty or time expiration

DON'T:

- Question a judgment call by an official
- Use profanity or abusive language
- Guess
- Openly cheer for one team

Remember, the Official Scorer is an Off-Ice Official

Minor/Bench Minor Penalty

- 2-minute penalty; offending team (Team B) short-handed
- Bench minor: a player of the offending team (Team B) who was on the ice at the time of the infraction shall serve the penalty

- If the opposing team (Team A) scores a goal while the offending team (Team B) is short-handed, the offending team's (Team B) penalty will end

Coincidental minors: one player of each team is penalized at the same time

- Both players go to the penalty box and cannot leave until the first stoppage of play after the penalties expire
- Neither team plays short-handed
- Penalties are NOT posted on the scoreboard
- Examples: Unsportsmanlike conduct, Holding, Roughing, Slashing, Tripping, Interference



Penalties

Double Minor

4-minute maximum; offending team short-handed

Count as 2 separate penalties

Example: Unnecessary roughness

Major Penalty

5-minute penalty

Offending team (Team B) plays short-handed

The opposing team (Team A) can score as many goals as possible, but the penalty doesn't end until after 5 minutes has elapsed

Example: Boarding, Roughing

Misconduct Penalty

10-minute penalty

Offending team (Team B) is NOT short-handed

Offending player (Team B) cannot return to play until the first stoppage after the penalty expires

Example: Disrespect to a Referee

Minor + Misconduct (aka 2-and-10)

2 penalties:

2-minute minor penalty; offending team (Team B) is shorthanded while alternate player serves 2-minute penalty

10-minute misconduct penalty; offending player (Team B) penalized for 2 minutes + 10 minutes and a whistle. Offending player may exit the penalty box on the first whistle after serving 10 minutes after the minor penalty expires, either by time or goal scored.



Penalties

Game Misconduct

- Offending player (Team B) is prohibited from further play in the game
- Automatically suspended for the next game
- Offending team (Team B) is NOT short-handed
- If a Team Official (Coach/Manager) receives a Game Misconduct they must leave the Player's Bench immediately, may not direct play and is suspended for the next game
 - Example: Checking from behind

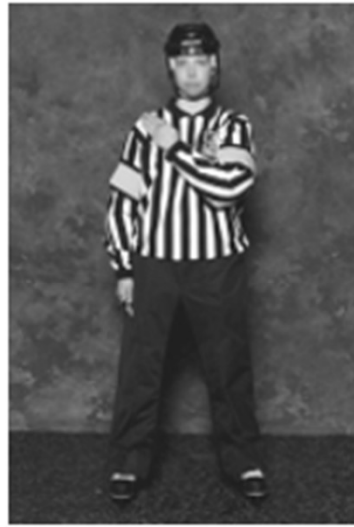


Referee Signals



Boarding

Striking the closed fist of the hand once into the open palm of the other hand.



Body Checking

The palm of the non-whistle hand is brought across the body and placed on the opposite shoulder.



Butt-Ending

Moving the forearm, fist closed, under the forearm of the other hand, held palm down



Charging

Rotating clenched fists around one another in front of the chest.



Checking from Behind

Arm placed behind the back, elbow bent, forearm parallel to the ice surface.



Referee Signals



Cross Checking

A forward motion with both fists clenched, extending from the chest.



Delaying the Game

The non-whistle hand, palm open, is placed across the chest and then fully extended directly in front of the body.



Elbowing

Tapping the elbow with the opposite hand.



Roughing

One punching motion to the side with the arm extending from the shoulder.



Head Contact

Non-Whistle hand placed palm inward on the back of the helmet.



Referee Signals



High-Sticking

Holding both fists clenched, one immediately above the other, at the side of the head.



Holding the Face Mask

Closed fist held in front of the face, palm in and pulled down in one straight motion.



Holding

Clasping the wrist of the whistle hand well in front of the chest.



Hooking

A tugging motion with both arms, as if pulling something towards the stomach.



Interference

Crossed arms stationary in front of the chest with fists closed.



Referee Signals



Kneeing

A single tap to the right knee with the right hand, keeping both skates on the ice.



Match Penalty

Tap open palm of the hand on top of the head.



Misconduct

Placing of both the hands on the hips one time.



Penalty Shot

Arms crossed (fists clenched) above the head.



Slashing

One chop of the hand across the straightened forearm of the other hand.



Referee Signals



Spearing

A single jabbing motion with both hands together, thrust forward in front of the chest, then dropping hands to the side.



Time-Out or Unsportsmanlike Conduct

Using both hands to form a "T".



Tripping

Strike the side of the knee and follow through once, keeping the head up and both skates on the ice.

- Certain penalties are recorded as two entries
- Example: (double minor & minor-misconduct [2-and-10])

- Tally up saves for each goalie for each period
 - Note: It is recommended to keep the tally on a separate sheet of paper and then transcribed at the end of the period
- Watch for goalie changes during the game, or when a goalie is pulled for an additional skater

 - (White) Team Manager for submittal to league office
 - (Yellow) Home Team
 - (Pink) Visiting Team
 - (Gold) Referee in the instance of a game misconduct/match penalty
