TODAY'S GAME

The U.S. Men's National Team faces Latvia today in its first preliminary round game of the 2022 IIHF Men's World Championship in Tampere, Finland. All U.S. games will air live on NHL Network in the U.S.

THE SERIES VS. LATVIA

The U.S. and Latvia have met on 15 previous occasions in the world championship with the U.S. holding a 10-1-0-3-1 (W-OTW-OTL-L-T) series advantage. The last meeting between the two teams came a year ago with Team USA earning a 4-2 victory on May 27 behind goals from four different players.

OPENING GAMES

The U.S. is 6-4-0 in its last 10 opening games of an IIHF Men's World Championship. Team USA has faced Latvia four times all-time in its first game of the men's worlds (2009, 2008, 1997, 1938) and is 4-0 in those contests.

SUPERSTITIOUS -- FRIDAY THE 13TH

Today's game is being played on Friday the 13th, marking just the third time Team USA has played a Friday the 13th game in the IIHF Men's World Championship. The U.S. in 2-0-0 in its previous two games played on Friday the 13th.

ILS. ROSTER

Team USA has what is now a 23-player roster, which includes 13 forwards, seven defensemen and three goaltenders. Caleb Jones, who was initially part of the Team USA roster, sustained an injury and is heading back to Chicago today. Nine members of Team USA are making their debut in an IIHF championship at any level, including Nick Blankenburg, Luke Hughes, Jaycob Megna, Nate Schmidt, Thomas Bordeleau, Adam Gaudette, Karson Kuhlman, Sam Lafferty and Vinni Litteiri. Hughes technically was part of the 2022 U.S. National Junior Team that played one game in Edmonton, Alberta, in December, however, that tournament, which was canceled mid-stream, has been washed out of the IIHF record books. Only three players on the team have previously competed in a men's world championship, including Sasha Chmelevski, who helped Team USA to a bronze medal in this event a year ago; Seth Jones (2015-bronze; 2014-6th) and Alex Galchenyuk (2013-bronze). The roster features three players who competed on the 2022 U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team in goaltender Straus Mann and forwards Ben Meyers and Sean Farrell. Team USA's roster includes eight first or second round NHL Draft picks, including first-rounders Kieffer Bellows, Alex Galchenyuk, Luke Hughes, Seth Jones, and Austin Watson and second-rounders Thomas Bordeleau, Alex Nedeljkovic and Andrew Peeke.

LEADERSHIP TEAM

Seth Jones (Frisco, Tex.) is the captain of the 2022 U.S. Men's National Team with Nate Schmidt (St. Cloud, Minn.) and Austin Watson (Ann Arbor, Mich.) serving as alternate captains. Jones, who has played nine seasons in the NHL, is competing in his sixth international tournament for the U.S., including two previous men's world championships. He served as captain of the gold medal-winning 2012 Under-18 Men's National Team and as an alternate captain of the gold medal-winning 2013 U.S. National Junior Team. Schmidt, who has played nine years in the NHL, is making his international debut, while Watson, who has represented Team USA at both the IIHF U18 Men's World Championship and IIHF World Junior Championship previously, has played eight seasons in the NHL.

THINGS

The U.S. arrived in Helsinki on Sunday morning at 10:30 a.m. after an eight-and-a-half-hour flight from Chicago, and practiced at the Malmi Arena daily through Tuesday. Malmi is one of 60 neighborhoods in Helsinki. Team USA played one exhibition game, that coming on Wednesday against Canada at Helsinki Ice Hall Adam Gaudette won the 2018 Hobey Baker Memorial Award as the top player in NCAA DIvision I men's ice hockey while playing at Northeastern University ... The U.S. has medaled in four of the last eight IIHF Men's World Championships, its best stretch since 1931-47 ... Team USA is the home team today, will wear its blue jerseys and occupy the left bench (looking from the ice) ... Alex Galchenyuk regularly arrives at team meals with a bottle of extra virgin olive oil under his arm. Galchenyuk, who has played 10 years in the NHL, enjoys adding EVOO to virtually anything on his plate ... Thomas Bordeleau is making his long-awaited IIHF debut today. He was selected to both the 2020 and 2021 U.S. National Junior Team, but had COVID issues both years that prevented him from playing in the IIHF World Junior Championship.

2022 U.S. Men's National Team Game Notes

USA vs. Latvia • Friday, May 13, 2022

VETERAN COACHING STAFF

Team USA has the good fortunes of having a veteran coaching staff with head coach **David Quinn** and assistant coaches **Jeff Blashill**, **Don Granato** and **Mike Hastings**. Quinn, the former New York Rangers head coach, was the bench boss for the 2022 U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team. Hastings, who the last two seasons has been tabbed the Spencer Penrose Trophy recipient as the NCAA Coach of the Year, is the head men's ice hockey coach at Minnesota State University and was an assistant coach for the 2022 U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team. Blashill just finished a seven-year run as head coach of the NHL's Detroit Red Wings and Granato is the current bench boss of the NHL's Buffalo Sabres. In addition, **Mike King** returns for the second straight year as Team USA's video coach for the IIHF Men's World Championship.

WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP IN FINLAND

Team USA is 21-3-0-26-4 (W-OTW-OTL-L-T) all-time in the men's world championship in games played in Finland. The last time Team USA played in Finland was in 2013 when it went 5-1-0-2 (W-OTW-OTL-L) before moving over to Stockholm for the tournament semifinals and medal games where it ultimately earned a bronze medal.

EXHIBITION VS. CANADA

Team USA played Canada on Wednesday at the Helinski Ice Hall in its Ione exhibition game in advance of the 2022 IIHF Men's Wolrd Championship, with Canada coming out on top in a shootout, 4-3. The U.S. got goals from **Riley Barber**, **Kieffer Bellows** and **Karson Kuhlman** in what was a back-and-forth affair. Both teams had power plays in the five-minute three-on-three overtime, but couldn't convert. Canada won the shootout, 2-1. **Strauss Mann** and **Jon Gillies** split time in the U.S. net. Mann stopped all 11 shots he faced in the first 30 minutes of the game, while Gillies had 13 saves on 16 shots in 35 minutes of action.

HOSTING THE U18 WOMEN'S WORLDS

USA Hockey stepped up to fill the void and ensure the IIHF U18 Women's World Championship would be staged in 2022. The event, which was originally slated for Sweden in January was canceled initially by the IIHF due to COVID concerns, but will now be played June 6-13 in Madison and Middleton, Wisconsin. LaBahn Arena, home of the University of Wisconsin's highly successful women's ice hockey program, will serve as one venue, including for the medal games, and Bob Suter's Capitol Ice Arena will also host games. The venue is owned by NHL player Ryan Suter.

WHAT YOU MIGHT NOT KNOW

U.S. netminder **Strauss Mann** says the three words the best describe him are dialed, curious and purposeful ... **Risto Talvio**, who works full-time as a security officer at a nuclear power plant in Eurajoki, Finland, is Team USA's host here in Tampere. Talvio has served as team host for U.S. teams in all international tournaments in Finland since 1984 ... Team USA general manager **Ryan Martin** is expected to arrive in Tampere on Tuesday. Martin is the assistant general manager of the New York Rangers and also GM of the AHL Hartford Wolfpack ... Team USA massage therapist **Peewee Willman** and his girlfriend Hannah are expecting the couple's first child in two months ... **Stan Wong** is one of Team USA's two athletic trainers. He is in his 20th season supporting U.S. teams on the international stage with this his 15th IIHF Men's World Championship. Wong, who retired as athletic trainer for the Florida Panthers in 2002, was inducted into the PHATS/SPHEM Hall of Fame in 2015.

Bronze Medal Game Record: 6-4 **Total Bronze Medals:** 8 W, 6-1 vs. Germany (2021) Last BMG: The U.S. is 6-4 in 10 previous bronze-medal games in the IIHF Men's World Championship. The IIHF has used various formats over its history, including round robin, double round robin and round-robin medal play among the most common. The eight bronze medals the U.S. has won incude those determined by standings and also by a single bronze medal game.
