- Vancouver Island hosted their Spring meeting in Nanaimo on Sunday March 3rd. We had 14 participants from our 13 Island Associations. Grant, Anne and James represented BC Minor at the table with Marty, Dave and Mark wearing both their association and director hats.
- Most are reporting slower registration, likely due to the extended winter weather but expect to be at similar numbers as last year.
- Some interest in adding some NCCP to their coach training this season in the absence of any further progress on the BC Minor Training Program. Additionally we have BCBUA clinics in Victoria, Nanaimo, Oceanside, Comox scheduled with some additional to come.
- Caravan dates and locations were confirmed and discussed.
- A two day 4 city 11U, 9U and 7U Girls camp was discussed and will be organized for Mid-May.
- 11U and 13 U Prospects interest again. Shannon Gaboury from Comox to provide scheduling. For the Island this extra baseball is not created to promote tiering or gain a summer season advantage so much as its designed to give kids interested additional baseball on top of local programming.

- SUMMARY High-Performance committee will forward to a select number of coaches for feedback and input. Anticipate reaching a consensus and distributing the schedule to all teams by March 6th. Last year's schedule was distributed March 12th, 2018.

- RECOMMENDATION We request board authorization to send out the official invitation to the above parties to participate on the advisory panel for 15U AAA. The term set for these positions to be no longer than one year.

#### 15U Post season

- WC tourney conflict.
- BC Baseball 15U AAA wildcard event is listed as "if necessary" and is in direct conflict with the BC Minor 15U AAA Provincial Weekend. Removing this wildcard event will allow BC Minor 15U AAA teams who qualify to participate in both provincial tournaments if they wish. Last year there were 10 teams competing in the BC Baseball Provincial Championship, 4 of which were BC Minor teams, six of which were PBL.
- As of Friday AM there were six BC Minor teams registered for Baseball BC 15U AAA Provincials.
- Vancouver Community Mounties North Shore Baseball Association Delta Tigers Ridge Meadows Royals Chilliwack Cougars Kamloops Riverdogs
- In order to provide a genuine pathway to the Baseball BC Provincial Championship, the two organisations will need to work cohesively. The BC Minor teams participating in the Baseball Provincial Championship weekend should travel through the BC Minor Provincial Pathway in order to arrive at the Baseball BC Championship.
- RECOMMENDATION It is the recommendation of the HP Committee that Baseball BC allocates a number of berths, reflecting proportional representation between PBL and BC Minor, to BC Minor. In doing so, BC Minor teams will qualify via the BC Minor Provincial Championship. BC Minor representative teams would be awarded based on results of the BC Minor event. We are asking for the support of the board to approach Baseball BC with this mandate.

# COLLEGE PREP

- o CP postseason New Jersey conflict. Status.
- Baseball BC Provincials will be comprised of BC Minor and PBL teams only. Last year, they had three teams in Tier 1 and six teams in Tier 2. All were from the PBL. As of today, they have 2 PBL and 1 CP in Tier 1 and 1 PBL and 3 18U AAA (BC Minor). The 18U AAA teams are a non-issue as we have no conflicting tourney. CP, however, is a challenge as the Westerns and Nationals conflict directly with the Jersey trip. The same Jersey trip that the teams requested by a majority at the Feb. 2nd meeting.
- We feel that having one association board member attend, along with their team coach (es), the CP/15U AAA/15U AA seasonal meetings be required so that they can bear witness to the information, feedback, and requests made by the team coaches. This will allow them to go back to their President and other board members and communicate the will of the coaches and players and remove the perception that BC Minor is simply dictating "the way".
- RECOMMENDATION The HP Committee recommends that we allow the winner of the BC Minor Provincial Championship determine which path they wish to follow. As it may include Nationals, all four

teams entering the Final Four must be prepared to continue on to New Jersey for the Diamond Nation College Elite tournament mid-August 2019 Team BC High-Performance Programming and Pathway

Approved Ruling: A baseball team/program attached to a public or private educational institution (school) is not interpreted as a baseball program for the purpose of this rule. Exception: 15U (Bantam) AAA players may practice with PBL programs at the discretion of their home association when that association chooses to establish a relationship with one (or more) PBL programs for the purpose of player development. Approved ruling: Playing in any exhibition, tournament or league games is not permitted.
- RECOMMENDATION This is not in the scope of responsibilities covered by the High-Performance committee. The HP committee will defer this issue back to the Board as a whole, as well as the Rules Chair and the Eligibility Chair.
