Goalie Development Program - Larry Grace Optimal Goalie

Larry Grace, Optimal Goalie, joined the meeting to present options for improvements on Goalie training. Larry believes that you need to look at athletic and development perspectives. From an outside perspective, he is hearing that there isn't enough communication on why a goalie is placed at a level over/under another. Parents are putting extra time and money into additional training and are frustrated their player isn't making a higher team. Larry focuses on off-ice training, parent training, creating better overall athletes. He believes in development over training.

- 1. Coaches need to be willing to look at goalies differently than they traditionally have. Specific development and adjusted communications to handle goalie development is extremely important. An early comment can make or break an entire season by setting the tone.
- 2. Goal Tending throughout the season should be about game development. Goalie work before practice. Spring, Summer and Fall are the best times to work on goalie development.
- 3. Goalie parents feel they don't get support from their head coach and/or association. Associations should have a game plan that shows what they should be doing, what they can do above and beyond if they want, and a list of quality resources to reach out to.
- 4. Recruit goalies "Try Goalie for a Day"

Edgetek - Eli Golder

Eli Golder – EdgeTek Hockey. He's hearing a lot of pleased parents this year. His goal is to make sure our association is taken care of and happy. Looking toward apparel for next year, Eli has some ideas to improve the process:

- NUMBERS The only way to get the numbers done with kids picking is to heat press the names and numbers after the fact. Most big associations assign numbers to avoid this problem. Upper level \$120 for 2 sets, \$132 this year to heat press after the fact. Next year looking at \$142 but jerseys ready much faster. Put a timetable on when numbers have to be submitted in order to have jerseys in from the teams.
 - o Have lower teams pre-assigned numbers to speed up the process of getting their jerseys
 - Recommend that registration close sooner for lower level to facilitate more lead time
 - Reversible jerseys are heavier lower mite could go back to single color jerseys. Keep upper mite and 8U reversible set numbers 2-35.
- SPONSORS- The sponsorship team can send the sponsor list sooner, and communicate more frequently between apparel provider and sponsorship team to ensure that all are accounted for
- APPAREL- positive feedback all around on apparel. Eli willing to purchase some of the most popular items up front to stock in store. Do expect supply issues from key suppliers to continue into next year.
