- F. All proposals received after the December 15 deadline must receive approval of three-fourths of the Board members voting at the Winter or Summer meeting to be placed on the agenda.
- G. Proposals to change these Bylaws and/or the Rules and Regulations may be incorporated in a special committee report. If the committee report includes rule or bylaw changes then the Board shall vote separately from the report on the proposed changes and shall pass the rule or bylaw change by a two-thirds majority at the Summer meeting.
- H. Any amendments to these Bylaws and/or the Rules and Regulations necessitated by amendments to USA Hockey Bylaws and/or Rules and Regulations shall be automatically effected by the rules committee and reported to the board members at the Winter or Summer meeting following the adoption of such amendments by USA Hockey.

Revise As Follows:

BYLAW 11: AMENDMENTS

A. Proposed changes to these Bylaws and/or the Rules and Regulations shall be submitted by members to the Rules Committee Chairperson, and must be received by December 15 May 15 of odd-numbered years. All proposals must be submitted on the MAHA rules change proposal form and must include all of the required information to be accepted by the Rules Committee Chairperson. All proposals are to be submitted in electronic format. All such proposals shall be read at the Winter-Summer Meeting with a recommendation offered by the Rules Committee. An advisory vote of the Board shall be taken at this time. All Proposals which do not receive support from a majority of the Board Members voting at the Winter-Summer Meeting shall be rejected.

In an exceptional circumstance, a rule proposal can be submitted in an even-numbered year. To be placed on the agenda, the proposal must receive a two-thirds affirmative vote by both the Rules Committee and by the Executive Committee. Once placed on the agenda, the proposal shall follow the approval process as specified in Bylaw 11.

- I. Amendments (not new proposals) may be made to said proposals by Board Members at the Winter Summer meeting by a majority vote, or by a three-fourths vote at the Summer Winter meeting.
- J. Between the Winter and Summer and Winter meetings, Board Members shall discuss the merits of the various proposals carried forward in their home Districts.
- K. For Bylaw and Rules and Regulations amendments, adoption shall require a two-thirds majority vote of the Board Members voting at the Summer Winter meeting.
- L. Any Bylaw or Rule change proposal determined by the Executive Committee to be the same, or substantially the same as one rejected at the previous Summer or Winter meeting cannot be placed on the agenda unless it receives a two-thirds majority vote by the Board members voting at the Winter Summer meeting.
- M. All proposals received after the December 15 May 15 deadline must receive approval of three-fourths of the Board members voting at the Winter or Summer or Winter meeting to be placed on the agenda.
- N. Proposals to change these Bylaws and/or the Rules and Regulations may be incorporated in a special committee report. If the committee report includes rule or bylaw changes then the Board shall vote separately from the report on the proposed changes and shall pass the rule or bylaw change by a two-thirds majority at the Summer Winter meeting.
- O. Any amendments to these Bylaws and/or the Rules and Regulations necessitated by amendments to USA Hockey Bylaws and/or Rules and Regulations shall be automatically effected by the rules committee and reported to the board members at the Winter or Summer meeting following the adoption of such amendments by USA Hockey.

Current Rule Reads:

IV. Youth Age & Division Classifications

A. Tier I Category and AAA Division Teams.

- 5. To qualify as a Tier I Organization the following criteria must be followed:
- c. Tier I organizations are limited to ten (10) non-Michigan players per organization at the 12U (Pee Wee) age level through 16U Midget Minor age level (age 11–16) with no more than six (6) non-Michigan players on any one team. 18U (Midget Major) (age 17-18) teams shall be allowed no more than 6 (six) non-Michigan players on any one team

Revise As Follows:

- c. Tier I organizations are limited in the number of non-Michigan players per organization.
 - a. Tier I teams will be allowed the following number of out of state players that live outside 100 miles of either the Taylor Sportsplex or Wings West in Kalamazoo, based on Google maps point to point distance.
 - i. Non-US Citizens and US Citizens living in Canada will also fall into this category.
 - ii. Tier I organizations are restricted to only two players that are non-US citizens. These players are considered in your out of state count.
 - iii. Tier 1 Organizations are limited to the following:
 - 1. 10U Tier I No Out of State Players
 - 2. 11U Tier I No Out of State Players
 - 3. 12U Tier I No Out of State Players
 - 4. 13U Tier I No Out of State Players
 - 5. 14U Tier I One Out of State Players
 - 6. 150 Tier I Two Out of State Players
 - 7. 16O Tier I Three Out of State Players
 - 8. 18U Tier I Nine Out of State Players Combination totaling 9 players, including out of state, Ohio/Indiana, commuter US Citizens and non-US citizens
 - b. Beginning at the 14U age category, players who are 14 years old or older as defined by USAH age classifications.
 - Must live within 100 miles of either the Taylor Sportsplex or Wings West in Kalamazoo (point to point as determined by the same MAHA system used to calculate Tier II closest rink).
 - ii. Teams will be allowed the following number of Ohio, and Indiana players providing they meet the requirements above. These players will not count

against the number of players allocated to out-of-state players, but shall be limited as follows.

- 1. 14U Tier I One Players
- 2. 150 Tier I Two Players
- 3. 160 Tier I Three Players
- 4. 18U Tier I-Combination totaling 9 players, including out of state, Ohio/Indiana, commuter US Citizens and non-US citizens
- iii. At the 16O level a team may increase either their out of state player number or their Ohio/Indiana player's number to four. If they increase one of these categories to four, then the corresponding category must be reduced to two. Under no circumstance may the total between the two categories be more than six.
- c. The head coach of a team that is found in violation of the Tier I out of state rule will be suspended for the remainder of the current season and the following season.
- d. All players that stay with a billet family are required to register with USA with their actual home address. No billet parent addresses.

Effective Date of Rule: 7/10/22

<u>Reason For Change:</u> Put into effect the Pilot Program that has been operating for 3 years that increased the number of Out of State Players for Tier 1 Organizations.
