Game Day Guidelines

- ❖ Parents are asked to take their children's temperature before games, and must keep their child(ren) at home should they have an above-average temperature (100.4% or higher) or feel unwell.
- ❖ Coaches/staff/family members/spectators should also take their temperatures, and not attend any games if they have an above-average temperature (100.4% or higher) or feel unwell.
- ❖ Players and spectators are asked to remain at home should they have a known exposure to COVID-19 or have traveled to a "hot spot" in the last 14 days.
- ❖ All coaches/staff/refs will be encouraged to wear masks, and practice as much social distance as feasible during the game.
- ❖ Players are required to bring their own hand sanitizer, and to wear masks if desired and recommended by their pediatrician.
- ❖ Spectators are encouraged to wait in their cars until 15 minutes before kick-off
- ❖ Spectators will not be allowed on the field of play or in the team area (by the benches). Should they elect to watch the games from the sidelines, each familial group must practice social distance and remain at least 6 feet apart.
- ❖ Only coach, staff, and players for the scheduled game should be in the team area. Each team must wait until the prior team clears the team area before setting up -- do not mix teams.
- ❖ There will be no sharing of balls, shin guards, pinnies, towels, or waters.
- ❖ No group celebrations (ex. high-fives, hugs, handshakes, fist-bumps, etc.) will be allowed.
- ❖ No handshakes/high-fives with the refs/opposing team will be allowed.
- ❖ Player passes & game rosters/cards will be handled by staff only. Each staff will have their own sanitizer to use after handling.
- ❖ Referees will remain 6 feet from players during check-in, and will complete visual checks only for jewelry, shin guards, etc.
