

Program Safety Sheet



PROGRAM NAME: **Roseville Adult Recreation Bandy League**

The following safety sheet has been created to share important information to keep participants safe. If you have any additional questions, please contact the Program Supervisor:

Program has been modified:

- *Players will be divided into separate “pods” of no more than 25 players- per MDH adult Sport Guidelines*
- ***Players are REQUIRED to wear mask at ALL TIMES, including while out on the ice***
- *Skaters must come prepared and dressed to enter ice upon arrival to facility- NO BAGS ALLOWED*
- *Players will utilize the outdoor bleacher area for getting skates on/off; when temperatures drop to frigid temps, players will be able to use OVAL Lobby*
- *OVAL lobby limited to no more than 50 people- must remain socially distanced & wear masks*
- *Skaters allowed to enter facility only 10 minutes prior to skate time and expected to leave the facility 10 minutes following end of session*
- *Players should not utilize bandy team bench- but rather space out 6ft or more from others*

Arrival and Departure Information:

- *All skaters to enter/exit facility through the OVAL archway and make their way down the stairs to access ice level*

Spectator Information:

- *Spectators are prohibited from attending adult rec bandy games*
- ***Players ONLY***

Basic Cleaning Information:

- *Facility will be disinfecting common touch areas more frequently and after each session- door handles, benches, bathrooms, rental skates, etc.*

Facial Covering Information:

- *Skaters, referees, coaches REQUIRED to wear face mask at all times, even while out on ice*
- *Face coverings can temporarily be removed when eating or drinking, but must be used during all other times.*

It is important to note, that all Roseville Parks and Recreation programs have been planned, developed and conducted following the Center for Disease Control (CDC) and MDH guidelines for Social Distancing in Recreational Programs. Please be aware there is some risk of participating in any activity during the pandemic. Even though we are working to provide as safe as an environment as possible, 100% mitigation cannot be guaranteed for any activity.
