GENERAL SESSION #1

- a) Al Wandler called the 2023 AGM to order at 9:02am. Special Guests were introduced and welcomed: Luc Lermينياux, Director of Education with Prairie Valley School Division, and Janet Kotylak, Board of Education. SHSAA Board of Directors and office staff were introduced.

- e) All candidates for executive elections were introduced. Notice was given that nominations close at 3:30pm on Thursday. The six positions for election this year are: President, Section II, Section IV, Saskatoon, Regina, and Equity Director.

f) **President's Address:**

I fully recognize that the way this AGM started in how the Board members were introduced was a little unusual and likely a one-time thing. But one only gets to celebrate a 75th anniversary once and coupled with finally having a year of high school sport that was as normal as normal can be, I make no apologies for bringing some energy to this momentous occasion. Because of the length of those introductions for the people who deserve them, I will keep my address shorter than normal.

For those that were here last year I introduced you to Sierra Jordison and how important what we do for high school sports is for student athletes dealing with hardship in their life like Sierra did.

This year I want to introduce you to Kayley Beaubien. Kayley plays on my basketball team and is a member of our track and field squad. Kayley has struggled with self confidence and is often worried about how she is perceived by others. You all have a Kayley, I am sure.

At provincial track I wanted to capture each of our athletes in attendance on video for our school Instagram page. I asked Kayley if I could watch her much less putting her on Instagram. She has traditionally been THAT kind of kid and would say no don't watch, but she said that it would be fine.

She was competing in her only event, the 800m, and I was just off the start line at the first turn. The plan was to record her start, her turn into her second lap and

crossing the finish line. Her pace was very fast at the start and even though I had not seen her race that year I was uncertain that she could keep that up, but she did - for 798m. Just short of the finish line she collapsed and collapsed hard. She got up and stumbled across the line in 8th down from 5th or 6th because of the fall. I thought oh no, she is always worried about others will think, she fell at the end in front of everybody, she will be devastated.

I was at the awards tent handing out ribbons and medals, and after about 15 minutes she came running over to me, not with tears of embarrassment in her eyes, but unbridled excitement. 'Wandler, Wandler did you see me?' I let her know I did see her and tried to stay positive and drew her attention to her great start and how she muscled up to the first group. She said, 'Yeah, yeah but did you see the end?' I told her that I did see her fall and waited for the tears that never came. She said, 'That was so cool, I never felt that before, I pushed myself so hard and I was going to break the pace I wanted to set by nearly 20 seconds and right at the end my body just hit the wall and I was done. It was awesome.' I was like who is this kid? I never heard her talk like this before after a finish like this. I asked her why this ending was so awesome. Kayley said, 'Because I literally gave all I could give, and I really did not hold anything back. And I still got up to finish. I kept fighting.'

This was a wow moment between a coach and an athlete, but you all made it happen. 75 years of the SHSAA working for student athletes culminated, for Kayley and me, in this awesome moment. At provincial track everyone works together from every District because the association that we are all a part of has been doing so for 75 years. We work for kids, and we should all be proud of that because Kayley's revelation about herself is one of thousands that student athletes have been having for ¾ of a century. Tonight, at the Merit Award Banquet there will be many people that made these first 75 years happen. Don't be shy and don't be safe by staying at your table before or after the awards are handed out. Go find one of these past Merit Award winners, introduce yourself and do something that we don't do enough of these days. Listen. These individuals laid the groundwork for the first 75 years and they can teach us so much to make sure we make the next 75 as great as the first. Enjoy the AGM, celebrate the 75 years and for all the future Kayley's, please keep doing what you are doing.

Representation on various committees, 12-aside Football Summit, Women in Sport Conference, and leading Sport Advisory Groups are all highlights of a successful year of Board of Directors initiatives that have supplemented the school sport seasons of play and championships. A significant milestone for the Board was the development of a renewed strategic plan that will guide the direction and decision-making process of the Association over the next several years. "While providing educational opportunities through school sport, the Association will be respected as an integral partner in the development of students within the education sector." One of the areas of focus of the Strat Plan will be to continue to build on partnerships with important groups such as the U of S and U of R

The Sport Advisory Groups also need to be commended for their passion and volunteer efforts that help to continually evaluate the programs that are offered. These individuals analyze thoughts and ideas from our membership, refine them, and provide communication between the membership and Board of Directors. This year, they also assisted the Ministry of Education by providing recommendations regarding Safety Guidelines for extra-curricular activities in Saskatchewan.

The School Board trustees and LEADS representatives that are here representing the 14 districts of the SHSAA continue to support administrators, athletic directors, coaches, volunteers, and students as they engage in educational opportunities through school sport; for you to make yourself available to assist our Association says a great deal of the importance that school sport will continue to play in extending learning beyond the classroom onto the playing fields of our Association.

There are many individuals that provide service to SHSAA as officials. Our officials allow our students a chance to participate within the rules and allow our coaches the opportunity to educate our students through sport. As leaders in our Districts, it is imperative that we teach about the importance of officials and discourage behaviours of those athletes, coaches, and supporters that are negative or abusive toward officials. The past year has demonstrated that high school athletics has landed in a good place following the pandemic, showing close to pre-COVID participation. With it, came the many opportunities for Saskatchewan students to display the citizenship skills that they developed through school sport. In a year where November 11 fell on a Friday, the SHSAA, Legion Branches, schools, and coaches across the province provided student-athletes participating in championships a chance to recognize the opportunities provided to our youth through the service of our veterans. From numerous Remembrance Day Services held prior to Friday volleyball competitions to the hundreds of high school football players who donned poppy stickers on their helmets, a strong partnership continues between SHSAA and our Legion Branches. It was a special moment on Remembrance Day at the 6A 12-aside Football Championship when a group of young student-athletes took the initiative to shake a member of the Canadian Armed Forces hand and thank him for his service. With Remembrance Day falling on a Saturday this coming fall, we look forward to the continued relationship with the Canadian Legion, Saskatchewan Command, and the opportunities to recognize those that have paid the ultimate sacrifice for our freedom.

The Association carried significant resolutions at the 2022 AGM regarding equity, diversity, and inclusion and

this past school year provided an opportunity to move the Association in a positive direction. Thank you to all who created space for those who have been and continue to be under-represented in high school sport in Saskatchewan and for your efforts to make students, volunteers, coaches, and officials feel welcome and included in extra-curricular and the organization that occurs around school sport. Thank you to those that have taken on roles within our Association in order to provide a well-rounded perspective and diverse voice in decision-making. A huge thank you goes out to Gary Gott, Kirk Chief, and Keith Ryder, among others, who have offered significant cultural opportunities at this year's AGM and we really look forward to learning from Cadmus Delorme later this morning. Forward planning for the Association will continue to look at ways to reach more students to experience school sport. We have begun the journey and look forward to continued improvement for our Association in this respect.

The CIAAA looks to offer an in-province PD opportunity for Athletic Directors when the national conference will be hosted in Regina in April 2024. The National Athletic Director Conference will have many Athletic Directors from across the province and country in attendance, participating in a professional development activity tailored for the roles they serve in their schools and districts. Two days of intense learning and multiple networking opportunities with Athletic Directors from across Canada will strengthen the depth of knowledge in Athletic Directors in Saskatchewan. Mark your calendars for April 11-13, 2024, seek out support from your school and school division, and make sure you are there as it is going to be a fantastic event!

We will have the opportunity to mingle with some of the greats at this evening's Merit Award Banquet as a group of respected individuals has joined us to celebrate the 75th Anniversary of the SHSAA. Please spend some time with the 50 Past Merit Award winners, reflecting on the fact that the focus of the work of the Association has not changed for the past 75 years. It is during conversations with those who will be joining us that we will come to understand that it continues to be student access to sport in a school setting and the promotion of multi-sport participation that are the cornerstones of our Association.

I hope all of you have enjoyed being a part of school sport this past year as much as I have enjoyed serving you, the membership, and the students of our province. I wish you a successful annual meeting.
