On the result at Charleston Battery...

“It’s a disappointing loss for us. We dominated most of the game and we hardly gave up any chances and we ended up losing 1-nil. It’s a little disappointing to not take more out of the game. The big thing is that we feel as though we should’ve taken more out of the game than that. We had quite a lot of chances and hardly gave any up. It’s not what you would expect from a game where you have that much of the ball and that much territory of the game.”

On bouncing back...

“We felt that after the first 15 [minutes] of the first half that we were in control of the game. That we were doing well on the ball and getting in behind pretty well. We were hoping to continue to do a lot of the same things in the second half. It’s obviously disappointing to lose the goal because we were never really in any danger before or after the goal. That’s unfortunately the way the game goes sometimes, you can go away from home and dominate the game.”

“This is a night where we dominated the game. We got caught on one break, which we need to do better on, and we need to be more creative around the box. We were on the ball in Charleston’s half for most of the game. There’s a couple of good chances where we need to be more focused and more clinical. There were great saves from their goalkeeper, but there were times where our creativity around the goal wasn’t where it needed to be. There needs to be more going at people one-on-one, more 1-2’s around the box, and more layoffs and shots around the box. A vast majority of possession that we played tonight was good and our effort was good, but it was one of those things that could happen in soccer. We have to bounce back from it in the next game, which is another big one.”

On Charleston’s change in play after going down to 10 men...

“We were pretty much on top anyways, but what the red card did was really made them sit back and bunker in. When a team does that, we’ve got to be a little quicker and creative in our play. That would be the one thing I think we need to take from tonight. Also, making sure that when we’re being that dominant, that we’re decisive around the box, more creative in our movement and more confident in taking people on. When we do that, more chances will come.”
