

In-House Program FAQ

- How did MBA select the league we participated in this past season?
 - In many past years, MBA has participated in the Maplewood Parks & Rec league; that was shut down due to financial constraints.
 - For 2020-2021, MBA participated with nearby communities in a league administered by MYAS.
 - We learned in fall 2021 that some communities would not be participating in the MYAS league such that there would not have been enough teams to have a league.
 - MBA does not have enough of our own teams to have our own in-house league and requested to join the Woodbury league to ensure our teams would have a place to play.
- Why didn't we get many home games this past season?
 - The Woodbury league was willing to take our teams, but had already planned their game locations and we were not given many weeks/ages to host games.
 - We have already requested more home games for next season and hope that will be granted.

- Why did our 7-8th grade boys teams have to compete against teams of 7-9th graders?
 - The in-house leagues we have participated in have only ever gone through 8th grade. The Woodbury league's inclusion of 9th grade boys was not anticipated.
 - If Woodbury intends to include 9th grade boys on teams again next year, we will consider offering our 9th grade boys rec players the opportunity to choose between in-house and our high school rec program.
- Why did my child's in-house team struggle in games (win/loss) compared to other teams?
 - MBA attempts to make our own in-house teams balanced when there is more than one MBA team in an age group.
 Sometimes we are more successful than others.
 - MBA has no control over the skill level of in-house teams from other communities.
