TODAY'S GAME

The U.S. Paralympic Sled Hockey Team will take on Canada in the gold-medal game of the 2026 Paralympic Winter Games here today (March 15) at Milano Santagiulia Ice Hockey Arena. Puck drop is set for 4:05 p.m. local time/11:05 a.m. ET, and the game will be broadcast on NBC and is live streaming on Peacock.

Team USA enters this matchup with a perfect 4-0-0-0 (W-OTW-OTL-L) record after sweeping the Group A round-robin in the preliminary round and then skating to a 6-1 victory in the semifinals over Czechia on Friday (March 13).

Canada also carries a 4-0-0-0 (W-OTW-OTL-L) record into the game after earning the top seed in Group B during preliminary-round play, then defeating China, 4-2, in the semifinals on Friday (March 13).

The U.S. and Canada have faced off six times previously in the Paralympics, with the U.S. holding a 4-1-0-0-1 (W-OTW-OTL-L-T) record, including five-consecutive wins.

These two sides have also faced off in the last two Paralympic gold-medal games, with Team USA skating to a come-from-behind, overtime victory over Canada in the gold-medal match in 2018, and a 5-0 victory in 2022.

The U.S. holds an all-time Paralympic record of 30-2-0-6-1 (W-OTW-OTL-L-T), and an unbeaten 3-2-0-0 (W-OTW-OTL-L) record in gold-medal games.

TALKING POINTS

STUFFING THE STAT SHEET

The U.S. Paralympic Sled Hockey Team leads the tournament with 40 goals through four preliminary-round contests in Milan, a mark that ties the 2018 U.S. Paralympic Sled Hockey Team for most-ever by Team USA at a single Paralympics.

After tallying his fourth-consecutive hat trick in as many games, and contributing on all six of Team USA's goals with six points (3g, 3a) in a 6-1 victory over Czechia on Friday (March 13) in the semifinals, **Declan Farmer** (Tampa, Fla.) now has 64 (35g, 29a) career Paralympic points, a new all-time record.

Farmer has recorded a tournament-best 14 goals, 24 points, and +24 rating through the preliminary round, breaking his own single-tournament goals and points record in just four games.

Many of Farmer's U.S. teammates are also near the top of the tournament leaderboards. **Noah Grove** (Frederick, Md.) leads all defensemen with nine assists and 11 total points through four games, while **Brody Roybal's** (Northlake, Ill.) 12 points (2g, 10a) rank third amongst all skaters.

Additionally, **David Eustace** (Stoneham, Mass.) ranks fourth amongst all skaters with six goals, and **Jack Wallace** (Franklin Lakes, N.J.) ranks ninth overall, and second amongst defensemen behind only Grove with 10 points (3g, 7a).

SHOWTIME

Team USA's 14-1 preliminary-round win over host Italy on March 7 was historic for both the sport of sled hockey and Team USA. A whopping **8,992** fans attended the game, a new all-time record for attendance at a sled hockey game in a major tournament.

Overall, U.S. games have averaged an attendance of nearly 4,000, and over 300 friends and family of Team USA athletes are in Milan supporting the team

LEADING TEAM USA

David Hoff (Bottineau, N.D.) is in his eighth season as head coach of the U.S. National Sled Hockey Team, and the 2026 Paralympic Winter Games mark his second as head coach of the U.S. Paralympic Sled Hockey Team, and third since joining the staff as an assistant coach in 2016. In March of 2023, Hoff was named the 2022 Paralympic Coach of the Year by the USOPC. USA Hockey's Northern Plains District Coach-In-Chief, Hoff led the U.S. to an unprecedented fourth-straight Paralympic gold medal at the 2022 Paralympic Winter Games. In his debut season as bench boss, Hoff coached Team USA to a 10-1-0-1 (W-OTW-OTL-L) record, including an undefeated 4-1-0-0 (W-OTW-OTL-L) mark at the 2019 Para Ice Hockey World Championship in Ostrava, Czech Republic. He added a second world championship gold medal to his resume after guiding Team USA to a top-of-the-podium finish at the 2021 IPC Para Ice Hockey World Championship in Ostrava, its record fifth gold medal in world championship history. In his Paralympic debut in 2022, Hoff led Team USA to a perfect 4-0-0-0 (W-OTW-OTL-L) record and the gold medal. In 2023, Hoff guided the U.S. to an unbeaten 16-2-0-0 (W-OTW-OTL-L) record, capped off by winning his third world championship. He then led the U.S. to a 19-0-0-1 (W-OTW-OTL-L) record in 2023-24, earning a silver medal at the 2024 World Para Ice Hockey Championship in Calgary, Alberta, and most recently, helped lift the U.S. to a World para Ice Hockey Championship gold medal in 2025 in Buffalo, N.Y.

ICE GOLD: A JOURNEY FROM WORST TO FIRST

In advance of today's (March 13) semifinals, NBC Sports released *Ice Gold: A Journey From Worst to First*, a documentary on the legendary 2002 U.S. Paralympic Sled Hockey Team that won the first-ever Paralympic gold medal for the U.S. in sled hockey at the 2002 Paralympic Winter Games in Salt Lake.

The team, which didn't medal at the 1998 Nagano Paralympics and only qualified for the tournament as the host country, went 6-0 in Salt Lake, and outscored its opponents 26-6, culminating in a thrilling 4-3 shootout victory over Norway in the gold-medal game. The team was inducted into the U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame as part of the Class of 2024.

The documentary is live streaming now on Peacock, and features interviews from former players such as Manny Guerra, as well as head coach Rick Middleton.

CAPTAIN AMERICA

Team USA captain **Josh Pauls** (Green Brook, N.J.), already the most decorated Paralympic sled hockey player in history with four gold medals, could become the first five-time Paralympic gold medalist in sled hockey today with a victory.

Pauls, the U.S. all-time leader in career Paralympic games played, has eight points (2g, 6a) through four contests, tied for third amongst defensemen behind only teammates **Jack Wallace** (Franklin Lakes, N.J.) and **Noah Grove** (Frederick, Md.), and carries a rating of +19 into the gold-medal game, ranking third amongst skaters.

GOLD MEDAL GAMERS

The U.S. has played in five gold-medal games all-time at the Paralympics, and holds an unbeaten 3-2-0-0 (W-OTW-OTL-L) record in those contests, including victories over Canada in 2022 and 2018.

In Team USA's 5-0 victory over Canada in the gold medal game of the 2022 Paralympics in Beijing, Declan Farmer (Tampa, Fla.) tallied two goals and an assist, including the game-winning goal, while Jen Lee (Daly City, Calif.) posted a shutout.

In the gold-medal game of the 2018 Paralympics in PyeongChang, Farmer famously scored the game-tying goal with just 37.8 seconds left in regulation, then later tallied the overtime game-winning goal to lift the U.S. to a 2-1 victory over Canada.

THREE-PEAT?

With a victory today, the United States could become the first nation to ever win the Olympic women's hockey gold medal, the Olympic men's hockey gold medal, and the Paralympic sled hockey gold medal in the same year.

Many members of Team USA, including Hillary Knight, Jack Hughes, Taylor Heise, and Charlie McAvoy wished the Paralympic team well with video messages ahead of today's game.

LEADERSHIP GROUP

Leading the charge for Team USA is captain **Josh Pauls** (Green Brook, N.J.), who is the most decorated Paralympian in the history of sled hockey with four career gold medals.

Travis Dodson (Deming, N.M.), a two-time Paralympic gold medalist, is serving as alternate captain, alongside three-time gold medalist **Declan Farmer** (Tampa, Fla.), who entered the tournament with the U.S. Paralympic career records for goals (21), assists (19), and points (40).

Overall, **13 players are returning** from the gold-medal winning 2022 U.S. Paralympic Sled Hockey Team, and nine players from the squad that won gold at the 2018 Paralympics.

COLORADO CREW

The U.S. Paralympic Sled Hockey Team held its 2026 Residency Camp, Jan. 7-Feb. 20 in Superior, Colorado, at Blue Sports Stable. Camp included daily off-ice workouts and on-ice sessions at least four times per week.

Many members of the team permanently reside in Colorado, including native **Malik Jones** (Aurora, Colo.), along with **Declan Farmer** (Tampa, Fla.), **David Eustace** (Stoneham, Mass.), **Noah Grove** (Frederick, Md.), **Evan Nichols** (Haymarket, Va.), and **Jen Lee** (Daly City, Calif.). Additionally, **Brett Bolton** (Rockledge, Fla.) is currently attending the University of Colorado Boulder.

CHIPOTLE-USA HOCKEY NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

A total of 23 champions will be crowned in the month of March at the 2026 Chipotle-USA Hockey Girls and Youth National Championships at 11 different host sites across the country.

As part of USA Hockey Girls and Youth Nationals, some 7,000 players have competed for American hockey top honors at various host sites across the United States.

HOCKEY WEEK ACROSS AMERICA

Created by USA Hockey in 2008, Hockey Week Across America is an annual event designed to engage the hockey community in celebrating the sport of hockey at all levels and exposing the sport to new audiences.

TRY HOCKEY FOR FREE

Saturday (March 7) was the second of two annual national Try Hockey For Free days in the United States as part of Hockey Week across America. It's a day where hundreds of rinks around the United States invite the local community to try the sport of hockey for free.

Rinks around the country also host special events such as Girls Try Hockey For Free, Sled Try Hockey For Free and Adult Try Hockey For Free.

100,000 GIRLS HOCKEY PLAYERS IN THE U.S.

For the first time in history, USA Hockey eclipsed 100,000 girls hockey players nationwide in 2025-26. Since women's ice hockey was first played in the Olympic Winter Games in 1998, the number of girls and women's players in the United States has grown by 257% from some 28,000 players to more than 100,000 today.
