

SGBA Board – Voting Process

Voting Process:

- No vote for SGBA Board Member election this year
- Matters Requiring SGBA Member Approval (1):
 - Modification of Articles of Incorporation or Constitution of Bylaws to satisfy MN Dept of Revenue requirements for Sales Tax Exempt Status
- Review of modification needed
- Vote Approve/Disapprove



Modifications for Sales Tax Exempt

Pursuant to MN Dept of Revenue Sales Tax Application:

- Modify Articles of Incorporation or Constitution and Bylaws to add the following information:
 - That no part of the net earnings shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its members, trustees, officers, or other private persons, except that the corporation is authorized to pay reasonable compensation for services provided.
 - That no substantial part of the activities of the corporation be the carrying on propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation and the corporation shall not participate in or intervene in any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate
 - A dissolution provision stating the organization will distribute its remaining assets for a section 501(c)(3) purpose.



Key Updates - Financial

- Financial
 - Current Balance \$79,381
 - Strong financial performance against 2023-2024 budget
 - Tournament Revenue up 16.5%
 - Player Registration Revenue meet budget target for year
 - Gym costs continue to increase up 102%
 - Successful Saber Jam and Shoot for the Stars Tournaments
 - New to SGBA this year
 - Uniforms / Uniform Policy significant improvement
 - Travel Program paid coaches for 6 Black, 7 Black, and 8 Black



Key Updates - Travel

- Ordered New Uniforms / Adjusted Uniform Policy
- Partnered with Hoopology for ongoing skills training
- Implemented Coaches Training led by Juan Mitchell
- Increased SGBA paid Head Coaches (6, 7, and 8 Black Teams)



Key Updates – In House



- Try Basketball Events
- Skills & Drills
- Total enrollment for Fall In-House at 88 up 10% from 80 last year
- 8 total 1st/2nd grade teams up from 6 last year
- 6 total 3rd/4th grade teams

Key Updates – Rec Travel

- Total enrollment at 113 up 18% from 96 last year
- 8 teams for 1st/2nd grade In House Winter season
- 3 teams for 3rd/4th grade in GRBL
- 2 teams for 5th/6th grade in GRBL
- 2 teams for 7th/8th grade in GRBL (up from 1 last year)
- Hosted Year End GRBL Tournament at Shakopee High School
- Sent all 7 Rec Travel teams to MYAS Rec State Tournament
 - 7-8th Grade teams took 1st and 2nd place





7th/8th Grade MYAS Rec State Champions






Key Updates – In House Year over Year Growth
