## U7 \& U8 ECDSL FESTIVAL INFORMATION

> Under 7 \& Under 8 players will play in a $5 \mathrm{v5}$ (including keeper) environment.
$>$ No scores or standings are maintained.
$>$ District Festivals involve Club teams from within the district.
$>$ No inter-district play is allowed unless neighboring districts are unable to offer their own Festivals.
$>$ Any team traveling from another district is required to have their district's playing out permission and/ or an approved ATF for each festival they wish to enter.
> Game Leaders or Referees will supervise games.
> No more than 3 games can be played on a festival day, Saturday, or Sunday for a total of 60 minutes playing time.
$>$ Boys and girls can play on the same team. Girls' teams may play against boys' teams only if necessary for scheduling purposes.

## Age U7 / U8 Game Format

5 vs 5 incl' GK's
Maximum Game Day Roster size 10 - players are encouraged to play fair time in all positions.
A Digital Ontario Soccer Roster with photos is required and only registered players who appear on the roster may participate.
Ball Size 3
Maximum Duration for weekly games is 40 minutes total $-2 \times 20$ minute halves
Maximum Duration for weekend festival games $3 \times 20$ - minute games with rest time between matches.
Field size $25-30 \mathrm{~m}$ wide $\times 30-36 \mathrm{~m}$ long
Goal Size $5 \mathrm{ft} / 1.52 \mathrm{~m} \times 8 \mathrm{ft} / 2.44 \mathrm{~m}$
Coach Minimum Qualifications: Fundamentals or Learn to Train, Making Headway, MED \& Respect in Soccer

Ontario Soccer Development Outdoor Matrix (Revision Date: Feb 6 2018)

## *Mini Soccer 5v5 Festival Rules*

> Retreat Line - Halfway
$>$ All free kicks are indirect.
$>$ After the scoring of a goal the game is restarted at the center.
> When the Goalkeeper has the ball, in his/her hands, or at a goal kick, the opposition players are to retreat to approximately the $1 / 2$ way line until the ball is touched by another player other than the goalkeeper. See retreat line document.
$>$ To encourage play from the back, the goalkeeper can either throw the ball or pass the ball from the ground. No drop kicks/punts.
> Players, including goalkeepers, can be substituted at any stoppage in the game on the fly.
> When the ball leaves the field of play, along the sideline, the game is restarted by passing or dribbling the ball into play. A goal cannot be scored directly from the ball being passed in.
> When the ball leaves the field of play, along the end line, the game is restarted by a goal kick (no corner kicks).
> For more information, please refer to the Retreat line and Game Leader Presentations
> If one team is short of players please move players from opposing team- game not to be cancelled.
> Completed and signed Game sheets are to be handed to the game Leader/Referee by the Coach/Manager before the start of the game.
$>$ Teams on one side of the field spectators on the other side of the field please.
