
shines at Pro-Day

BLIZZARD PRO-DAY RECAP

ON SATURDAY, March 4th several of the top young arms, as well as a few hitters showed up at Blizzard Facility in Vadnais Heights for Pro Scout Day. In addition to Blizzard players, MASH, Lumberjacks, NorthStar, free agents and others were represented at the event. Juniors, Hunter Carlson (Hudson -Uncommitted) and Drew Rogers (Mounds View - Georgia Tech Commit) both hit for the scouts and assumed catching duties for the remainder of the session. Blizzard coach and former Golden Gopher Ryan Duffy (free agent) kicked off the pitching portion of the day. Duffy consistently sat 88-89 from the left side with nasty movement, not to mention electric off-speed. Blizzard Junior Tyler Guerin (Mounds View – Iowa) and senior's Ian Regal (Rochester Mayo - Nebraska), AJ Rasmussen (Delano -Washington State), Ben Berkhof (Hudson - NDSU), Brayden Olson (St. Croix Falls - Purdue) and Isaac Morton (Spring Lake Park-Texas A&M) all threw for the scouts. Guerin was impressive as he was one of five hitters to take swings and had arguably the best rounds with consistent barrels in every round. The pressure of performing in such an event was no match for Guerin as he carried the momentum from hitting right into his bullpen where he reached 92.2 mph on the mound throwing to his Mounds -

tview teammate Rogers. As he walked out of the cage all his buddies ran up to him and you could feel the excitement as they let him know what he hit. The boys were all genuinely cheering for each other throughout the event.

AJ looked like he just came from making snow angels in the parking lot as he was dressed in all white (shirt/leggings) with light gray shorts. He worked pin-point control while hitting 88-89. Lefties, Berkhof (coming off a 19 point basketball performance for Hudson the night before)



had a solid outing on the mound as well as Regal. The final two arms to throw were Morton and Olson. Morton wasted little time in lighting up the gun as the first pitch he threw registered 96 mph on several of the scout's guns. Isaac worked his tail off throughout the off-season to prepare for his final season in Minnesota. As coach Sanchez indicated he was consistently at the facility getting his work in and "did things the right way".

Following Morton was high energy Olson as he was the last arm to throw. He was rocking a fresh mullet haircut for the upcoming season in St. Croix Falls where his team is ranked no. 1 in Wisconsin Division 3. Brayden was consistently 92-93 and touched 93.7. He had good movement on his pitches and commanded the fastball. I was able to sit with Brayden following the session as he cooled down. We were discussing one of the four free agents that threw 95. I made the comment, "can you believe that guy doesn't have a home". For a visual reference the second free agent that three had the build of Nolan Syndergaard. What Brayden said really hit hard as it shows you how in-tune these kids are, "that's how hard it is". Think about that, instead of being complacent with his showing he has the frame of mind to want more. The pressure players experience at the highest levels is unlike anything you can imagine. As fans we all watch MLB and these larger-than-life figures but the grinders trying to make it to that stage or simply remain a part of the game is what can truly get the emotions going. These young men want it so bad but at the same time realize how hard the game truly is. Hopefully they all have long careers and only time will tell but as a true fan of the game I will be there following the action and their respective journeys! Thank you to all the scouts that came out!


