Discipline and Appeals Review

I attended the fall workshops for the Lower Mainland and Interior and brought up discussion regarding an appeals model. Not all sessions were well attended by associations but from those who attended some suggestion on completely external model or at least a hybrid solution.

I attended the Ad Hoc meeting regarding coach/umpire relations organized by Baseball BC on September 23. It was attended by representatives from Baseball BC, PBL, BCBUA, and BC and chaired by Terry McKaig of UBC. It was clear there is a problem in our sport with the treatment of umpires and leading to a reduced number of qualified umpires, as many leave the sport after only umpiring for a few years.

Committee Scope and Mandate: "Examine and make recommendations on umpire-coach relationships, discipline, deportment, role of leagues, BCBUA and Baseball BC". Could be an opportunity for the PSO to take a leadership stance on this issue on a more official capacity without stepping on organizational lines with members at the table.

It was a lengthy discussion and many brain storming ideas were brought to the table. Also a review of other sports and their practices, as well as the experience of the NAIA (UBC is part of NAIA) and the non-tolerance stance taken at that level. The committee will be working on some best practices policies that can be brought back to the various organizations for their memberships. Action items are still being formulated. I believe there can be some short term things that we as BC Minor can recommend to associations to start putting into practice, and the longer term goal will be to change the mindset of participants in the game to provide a safe, respectful environment for umpires, which will lead to more qualified umpires staying in the sport. Umpires must be seen as a part of the game just as much as the players and the coaches. Next meeting is scheduled for November 13, 2019

Girls Baseball – Prepared for BCMBA 1 Oct 2019 BoD's Meeting

As I end my tenure as Chairman of the Girls program, I would like to thank the Board of Baseball BC, its directors, David Laing, Scott Mackenzie and the Board of BC Minor and its directors for your continued support for the program and myself. Special thanks to Al Forman who came to the ID camps, Selects camps and attended many of the 16U games. His knowledge and wisdom has won the respect of the players, coaches and parents. Thanks must also go the Head Coach Mary van der Loos and his coaching staff, Rob Ross and Andres Losin, without the dedication of these three (3) gentlemen the team(s) would not exist. Also, many thanks to the parents for their belief and support of the program. In Nova Scotia all but three (3) players had a least one (1) parent in attendance, even had grandparents travel from home to support the team. I look forward to my new role in the Grass Roots program (Baseball BC).

The 2019 season saw a large increase in players in both the 14U and 16U age groups.

The instructional league run on Saturdays has been a huge success and the program was started on the Island this year and was also successful.

At the selects camp in July the 14 U's had 40 players out and 18 for the 16U's. All the players worked hard during the camp. Coaches Stacy Fournier and Emily Fournier had their hands full at the tournament trying to get all the players in the games. Choosing the team for Westerns was not easy. Congratulations to Coach Stacy and Emily for their work in the 14U group and on their Bronze medal finish at the Western Canada Championships. With forty (40) players to choose from, the selections were not easy. Lots of up-coming talent in this group.

The 16U team under head coach Marty van der Loos once again entered the summer league with high hopes. At every game there was never fewer than fourteen (14) players and a high of 20 at all games. They finished ninth (9th) in the league. There is much value in playing in the summer league. In the couple of weeks heading up to the Nationals Marty and his coaching staff consisting of Rob Ross and Andres Losin had the girls out to two (2) practices a week plus exhibition games and a three (3) day camp the weekend before we left for Nova Scotia. Once at the Nationals no team was taken lightly and each game had a plan laid out by the coaches. Other than the first game against Quebec 2 where the team allowed 11 runs against while scoring 21 the team dominated all other teams. As the games went on the confidence grew as did their attitudes, they allowed only one (1) more run for the entire tournament with four (4) shut outs, going a perfect 6 – 0 to win the gold medal, the first in nine (9) years.

2020 looks to be a very promising year. More and more girls are hearing about the program and are coming out to play and continue playing past 11U. Looking forward we are hoping to res-erect the 19U level. Having this team will help with the growth of the program.

SCHOLARSHIP REPORT - OCTOBER 2019

The scholarship application closed yesterday, September 30, 2019.

A total of 13 applications were received. This number surpassess previous years' submission. The applicants are from the following associations/Teams: Cloverdale, Chilliwack, BC Girls, North Island Cubs (Cowichan Valley), North Shore, Richmond, North Fraser Nationals, Vancouver Minor and Poco Minor.

The review process will begin shortly. The committee comprises of 3 BCMBA Board Members. The intention is to bring two independent reviewers to eliminate bias since some of the applicants are known to the committee members. We aim to complete the review process and have our decisions before the BCMBA AGM in November 2019.

There will be 4 - \$500 given away this coming February at the coaches convention.

Due to the number of applications received, the committee would like to request the board's approval to grant an additional \$1000.00 to this year's scholarship. The committee would like to award a total of 6 - \$500 scholarships for this year.

 - o 18 associations participated

> 2019 Season in Review – Les Szabo

- o There was a clear divide in the competitiveness of the 11 teams in the division:
 - 5 teams played over .500 baseball and there was a significant drop in winning percentage between the 5th place team and the 6th place team:
 - 2 teams had 5 or fewer wins in the entire season;
 - The 2 last-placed teams allowed more runs against than the top 5 teams allowed combined over the course of the 40 game season;
 - The 2 last-placed teams scored 30 fewer runs for combined then the 5th place team (last team over .500) scored on its own record.
- o There were several ejections and suspensions through the season but none resulting in a carry over into 2020.
- o Delta Tigers has chosen to pursue play n the PBL.
- The decision made to forgo a Qualifier Tournament and have teams 1 8 play a best of 3 game series to determine the Final Four was well received.
- The decision made to conduct a Final Four (Double Knockout format)
 Tournament was well received.
- Season play determined all home teams straight through to the last game of the Final Four (Only time there was to be a coin flip was if a "Game 7" was required in the finals)
- At this point, the facts show that the overall caliber of play is sub-par for what is considered to be the top tier of the Division.
- o If AAA is to be the top tier then a Regional model with stringent, documented, the review-able process must be put in place. For this to be a reality then the rule book will need to address the "right to field" aspect. Many aspects from coaching, regions, grassroots, next steps (i.e. College Prep) will have to be explored.

> 2019 Review/Feedback/Suggestions/Proposals from participating Associations

- CAMPBELL RIVER
 - Didn't have anything with AAA or AA.
 - Will be putting an AA team for the 2020 season
 - Want to see the direction to move forward
- CHILLIWACK
 - Want to make the top of the division.
 - Don't know how this will happen if there are AAA teams that aren't AAA caliber.
 - We should somehow interlock with PBL a game or two against them.
 - Playoff align with College Prep
 - Get rid of the double knock out
 - Round robin plus top 2 teams play the final. The final game should be the final game.
- CLOVERDALE
 - They took a year off.
 - Need to build the program back
 - Kids moved to PBL
 - Find some coaching and try to get players and program back in place.
- COMBA
 - They were in the situation that they were in the lowest in the division
 - They have the smallest population and competing with PBL
 - Trying to avoid parent coaching
- COQUITLAM/MOODY
- KAMLOOPS
 - Well organized
 - Having a DH in the league game.
- NORTH LANGLEY
 - Scheduling was good
 - Good not to have to travel too much
 - 40 games OK
 - Question: Change in the rules: To consider "NO import rule for 15UAAA"
- NORTH SHORE
 - The schedule was fine.
 - No comments to the tournament format
 - Bantam AAA non-parent coaching
 - Propose one rule change to allow Bantam AAA interacting with the PBL program (North Shore teams will be able to play with PBL teams)
 - North Shore wants to create a cohort with Little League and North Shore Twins – looking into developing players
- TRICITY
 - 15UAAA lost a number of players to PBL this year
 - Next year, there is an indication that players are coming back from Little League and would like to be competitive.
- o RICHMOND
 - They were low in the totem temple
 - Struggling losing kids to PBL

- Over the years, the caliber of play is getting worse.
- Losing kids from the 13U and up going to PBL
- They are currently struggling to put a team together

o SOMBA

SURREY

- 15UAAA should have no import rules
- AA big discrepancy. Some teams should have not been in the AA division
- AAA in discussion for their next season's programming
- Set something tangible to attract (as soon as possible) and offer players to stay and play and not go PBL way

NEWTON

VANCOUVER COMMUNITY

- They took 2018 off and came back for 2019 and finished 4th from the regular season.
- Equal balance between 1st and 2nd-year players
- Games were fairly competitive.
- A roster of 11 or 12 players is tough
- Tieing: not sure how it will work
- Consider having a blackout in mid-season and have 2 tournaments top teams and bottom teams
- Playoff format like the final 4.
- Liked the idea of the season concluded end of July.

WHITE ROCK

- 4 games weekend
- Concern: enough pitching to get through
- Consider having an exemption to rule
- AAA to have open catchment
- To allow call up players from PBL teams to play BC Minor teams
- Maximum of 15 players in a team

ABBOTSFORD

- Don't have the strongest AAA program
- PBL in Abbotsford running 2 PBL teams
- "Right to Field" issue as some teams struggled
- Baseball BC to run the entire 15U program

> Division Chair Comments and 2021 Proposal

- o Comments:
 - Don't see the AAA program changing in 2020
 - It will be "Right to Field"
 - Will be more hands-on with the associations in regards to placing teams per division
 - Cannot see an "ideal" format that would work for the 2020 season
 - It will be a weaker division in the AAA this coming year, with the loss of team's and players through aging out.
- o Proposal:
 - "Bantam Select" to take place in 2021
 - It will be by application like the College Prep format
 - Application process: every year, early in the season
 - 4+ teams will be playing with each other
 - Games would also include top 6 teams from 15U AAA partial way into the season
 - 50% of the games will be playing with PBL teams
 - Rules will be proposed to all Associations for the 2019 AGM approval
 - Unfortunately, this can't happen this year because of timing.
 - Limit on import players to be introduced to the Association's at the AGM

13U A Report

Nothing new to report.

Appeals Report

I did not chair any appeals since our last board meeting and am not aware of any pending appeals.

Challenger Baseball

Nothing new to report. I will be reaching out to Challenger to see how relations and awareness can be improved between Challenger and BC Minor and ultimately to the associations directly.

Discipline and Appeals Review

I attended the fall workshops for the Lower Mainland and Interior and brought up discussion regarding an appeals model. Not all sessions were well attended by associations but from those who attended some suggestion on completely external model or at least a hybrid solution.

I attended the Ad Hoc meeting regarding coach/umpire relations organized by Baseball BC on September 23. It was attended by representatives from Baseball BC, PBL, BCBUA, and BC and chaired by Terry McKaig of UBC. It was clear there is a problem in our sport with the treatment of umpires and leading to a reduced number of qualified umpires, as many leave the sport after only umpiring for a few years.

Committee Scope and Mandate: "Examine and make recommendations on umpire-coach relationships, discipline, deportment, role of leagues, BCBUA and Baseball BC". Could be an opportunity for the PSO to take a leadership stance on this issue on a more official capacity without stepping on organizational lines with members at the table.

It was a lengthy discussion and many brain storming ideas were brought to the table. Also a review of other sports and their practices, as well as the experience of the NAIA (UBC is part of NAIA) and the non-tolerance stance taken at that level. The committee will be working on some best practices policies that can be brought back to the various organizations for their memberships. Action items are still being formulated. I believe there can be some short term things that we as BC Minor can recommend to associations to start putting into practice, and the longer term goal will be to change the mindset of participants in the game to provide a safe, respectful environment for umpires, which will lead to more qualified umpires staying in the sport. Umpires must be seen as a part of the game just as much as the players and the coaches. Next meeting is scheduled for November 13, 2019
