This fall allowed Jeff and I to attend SHSAA Championships, district meetings, sportsmanship presentations, and the occasional drop in at an event being hosted by one of our 350+ schools. We continue to appreciate the welcoming nature of our schools and the incredible volunteer spirit that exists around our province. Educational athletics remains a healthy entity and a valuable component in developing citizenship skills in students.

The efforts of many volunteers have allowed thousands of student-athletes the opportunity to participate in school sport events this past fall. Tournament hosts, coaches, and officials continue to dedicate countless hours ensuring that learning and growth for students extends beyond the classroom into the extracurricular arenas where citizenship skills, sportsmanship, and athletic accomplishments are enjoyed by all participants.

- Numerous volunteers acted as forecaddies at the provincial golf championships at Kenosee Lake.
- The provincial host committee in Yorkton organized a fantastic cross-country championship during the Thanksgiving long weekend. The inclusion of chip timing was well received by all involved in the Provincial event. Music combined with warm weather, provided a fun environment for the student-athletes to compete at the best of their abilities.
- The good weather continued for the Provincial Soccer Championships where the new 7v7 format made for an exciting atmosphere.
- The November weather rolled in for the Provincial Football Finals and highlighted the efforts of those individuals (referees and host volunteers) that worked in the elements ensuring that the student-athletes were afforded the best possible opportunity to enjoy the celebration of sport.
- The board of directors and office staff that attended two fantastic weekends of provincial volleyball came back with stories of remarkable parity, tremendous competition, and outstanding work by the host sites.

Hosting these championships are a major undertaking and we thank our host sites, secondary sites, and officials.

Looking ahead, curling rinks around the province will be a buzz at the end of February and beginning of March as district, regional, and provincial championships lead to the crowning of champions in boys, girls, open mixed, and open doubles categories. Saskatoon (SSSAD) takes on the task of hosting provincial wrestling and Moose Jaw (South Central) anxiously awaits the return of HOOPLA to their city and schools. Walter Murray (Saskatoon) will be on display during the provincial badminton championships in May. Then in June, Central Valley will be hosting the provincial track & field championship out of Gordie Howe Sports Complex in Saskatoon for their first time.

To our coaches and officials, we continue to marvel at your dedication and commitment; however, one of the areas that needs constant mindfulness is respectful communication. The coach-official relationship during competition is the key to having a positive high school sport environment and models appropriate behaviour for our spectators and young student-athletes.

Accept this is a reminder that E-5s need to be filled out completely, including the Head Coach and all Assistant Coaches being listed with their coaching certification. Required coaching information can be found later in this newsletter and on [the SHSAA website](#).

News & Reminders

Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion

SHSAA strives for equity, diversity, and inclusion. The SHSAA worked with the Multicultural Council of Saskatchewan (MCoS) to create videos, prepared for Districts, to reiterate “Why” the Association is moving toward Transformation Inclusion and providing suggestions for “How” to implement change in a positive manner.

Safe Sport Policy

SHSAA is committed to protecting the health, safety, and physical/mental well-being of every individual involved in high school sport. SHSAA believes in being proactive, ensuring high school sport in our province is welcoming to all participants. As such, the SHSAA office staff and Board of Directors created and implemented a Safe Sport Policy Manual that can be found on the SHSAA website. The policies are intended to promote a safe sport environment in a manner that allows for consistent, immediate, appropriate, and meaningful action should any issues arise, but also to prevent issues from arising by communicating expected standards of behaviour to all participants.

Green Whistle Initiative

Beginning in 2025, new basketball officials will be wearing green whistles as part of the “Green Whistle Initiative”. By wearing a green whistle, it should be widely understood that the official is new and developing, just like the players on the teams. Basketball is an action-packed, fast-paced sport that can be difficult for a new official to process everything that is happening on the court.

There has been a longstanding misconception that when an official takes a clinic and puts on the uniform, they are ready to become a referee. Just like the teams learning their systems and in-bound plays, officials need time to learn their positioning, mechanics, and application of the rules. This comes with practice which occurs during games.

Presentations to U of S and U of R Education Students

SHSAA office staff have been invited into U of S and U of R Education classes to promote the benefits of offering extra-curricular opportunities to their students once they have qualified and are hired as teachers. The pre-service teachers have been responding positively to the presentations and seem excited to contribute to their future schools.

New AD Webinar

SHSAA office staff hosted the fifth annual New AD Webinar in September. The turn-out of both new and experienced athletic directors was encouraging and the webinar was filled with sharing and information. School Sport Week

School Sport week was proclaimed by the Minister of Education from October 6 – 11, 2025. The week was filled with activities across the province that culminated in a celebration of school sport during the Provincial Cross Country Championship hosted at the at Deer Park in Yorkton. Over 30,000 students participate in school sport each year and this week recognizes the many students, coaches, and volunteers who make it possible.

Remembrance Day

The 2025 fall championship season did not coincide with Remembrance Day falling on a weekend this year; however, through the cooperation of the Royal Canadian Legion, Saskatchewan Command, and our coaches, schools, and school divisions, we continued to reflect and pay respect to those who have served, and continue to serve our country, during times of war, conflict, and peace by wearing poppy stickers and providing free entry to veterans at our Championships this fall.

Board of Directors Ad Hoc Committees

Earlier this fall, Ad Hoc committees were formed by the Board of Directors regarding Classification, Sports Specific School Programs/Courses or Academies, and Female Flag Football. Board Members are committed to analyzing current topics to remain relevant and ensure Association values are met. The Ad Hoc Committees will continue their analyses throughout the school year.

Strategic Planning

The Board of Directors completed Strategic Planning during the 2022-23 school year. With the guidance of an external facilitator, the Board Members analyzed the Mission, Vision, Values, and Strategic Priorities of the Association. The [Strategic Plan](#) was released to the Membership in the fall of 2023 and SHSAA is utilizing the Strat Plan during decision-making and to implement action to reach objectives.

CARD EXPIRY

The Coaches' Card is valid for a period of TWO years. The 2025-2027 latest version (Black Card) is now available and is valid until August 31, 2027.

722C: Building a Positive School Culture through Sport

January 21, 2026, 4:15 PM (CST)

Building or changing your current school culture into a dynamic force within the school is not an easy task. This course will highlight processes for using sport to build and enrich a positive and exciting school culture. Specific steps and ideas will be outlined to use your athletic program and other school-based athletic initiatives as a springboard to create a healthy and positive environment within your school. The course will focus on engaging the entire school population through sport and activity.

502C: Athletic Administration in Canadian Schools

January 29, 2026, 4:15 PM (CST)

This crucial introductory course addresses many of the day-to-day operational responsibilities for Canadian Athletic Directors. The course addresses school athletic/academic philosophy, administrative organization, coach appointment, budgeting, scheduling, publicity and promotion, management of athletes, parents and others, transportation policies and issues, parent conflict, legal foundations, monthly checklists and more. One of the key resources available to course attendees is a resource package with over 700 pages of useful information, forms, detailed letter templates, sample policies, and more.

506C: Legal Issues II – Enhanced Legal Topics

This course introduces the important legal issues of discrimination, sexual harassment, bullying, hazing, and violence in sport. Participants will learn the legal definitions of the terms and how they are applied to the sport and scholastic context. Case law examples, discussions and other activities will help participants navigate these complex issues. Athletic administrators are also more frequently dealing with legal issues in an "online" context. This course looks at these new issues (cyber-bullying, online privacy, defamation, and coach-athlete relationship closeness on Facebook) through a legal lens and participants will learn tips for how best to manage online issues. Finally, the course touches on employment law and participants will learn best practices for beginning and ending relationships with teacher coaches and volunteer coaches.

PRESENTED BY: 

Each provincial championship will consist of 8 teams competing in a double knock-out with a page playoff. The eight teams participating at the provincial championship will include the host school and seven other teams that have qualified through the regional championships.

Regional championships will be held February 27 - 28, 2026. The Regional championships will consist of a six or eight team double knock-out format leading to an 'A' event and 'B' event qualifier to the provincial championship. The only region that may require an A-B playoff to complete the double knock-out competition is the provincial host region. The A-B playoff will only be contested if the provincial host has not won either the 'A' or 'B' event. In the regions without an A-B playoff the 'A' event winner will be considered the Regional champion.

Districts should declare their representatives to the Regional Championships by Saturday, February 14, 2026.

DATE: Saturday, March 7, 2026

LOCATION: A.E. Peacock Collegiate - Moose Jaw

COMMISSIONER: Sophie Rosso

ENTRY:

1. All wrestlers from registered schools outside Regina and Saskatoon **MUST** attend this meet in order to qualify for the Provincial Tournament.
2. Registered schools may enter more than one wrestler per division.
3. Every participating school **MUST** contact the SHSAA, with their intent to enter, and indicate the number of competitors by the Monday preceding the regional tournament. Competitors who have not been pre-registered by their coaches will not be allowed to participate in the tournament.
4. The Saskatchewan District team that advances to the Provincial Tournament will consist of up to four qualifiers from this meet per weight division.

WEIGH-IN:

A weigh-in will not be held at the Regional tournament. **Each wrestler must weigh in at their home school. A school administrator or their designate must certify the weight. Certified weights must be submitted to the SHSAA office by 12:00pm (noon) on the Thursday preceding the meet (March 5, 2026).** Note this procedure is used for the regional meet only.

SKIN INSPECTIONS:

Skin inspections will begin at 8:30am. All participants must pass the on-site skin inspection before wrestling.

START TIME:

The tournament begins at 10:00am. Three wrestling mats are available for matches.

DATE: March 13 – 14, 2026

LOCATION: Evan Hardy Collegiate - Saskatoon

ENTRY:

Regina, Saskatoon, and Saskatchewan District rosters (top 6) must be declared, and entries received by the SHSAA on or before, Sunday, March 8th. Changes to original entries must be made by 9:00am on Tuesday, March 10th. Upon receiving district rosters, the SHSAA will fill weight classes one spot at a time on a rotational basis as outlined by the 'Provincial Rotation'. Before a spot is officially filled, the athlete's coach will have final discretion. Substitutions by districts for their original entries may be made up to 12:00pm noon on Thursday, March 12th.

SKIN CHECKS:

On-site skin examinations will begin Friday, March 13th at 11:30am. All wrestlers must clear skin inspection prior to reporting for weigh-in.

WEIGH-IN:

Weigh-ins will take place on-site from 12:00 noon to 1:00pm Friday, March 13th. Wrestlers must weigh in at this time and make the weight class that they qualified in for the Provincial Championship.

WEIGH-IN PROCEDURE:

Check scales for the weigh-ins will be available for wrestlers between 11:00am and 11:30am.

COMPETITION:

Wrestling will begin on Friday after 4:00pm and continue until approximately 9:00pm. Wrestling will resume Saturday at 9:00am. The Coaches meeting will take place on Saturday during the break. Individual medals will be presented on the mat, following the gold and bronze matches. Team awards will follow the individual medal presentation.

CONFERENCE

- 1 – 3A Boys and 3A Girls will participate in conference basketball.
- Play-in games may be required for 1A, 2A, 4A Girls and 4A, 5A Boys. These games will be scheduled after the withdrawal deadline and teams will be notified if they are scheduled for a play-in game.

Conference Tournaments:

- All conference tournaments will be played the weekend of March 13 – 14, 2026 and will advance two or four teams to regional weekend.
- Teams designated to each conference are available on the [basketball activity page](#) of the SHSAA website.
- The draw templates for the conference tournaments are available on the [SHSAA website](#).
- Draws for the conference tournaments will be available on the SHSAA website on March 9, 2026.

REGIONAL

1A – 4A Classifications:

- The 16 teams that advance to regional play will be seeded 1 to 16 and placed in one of four regional tournaments in their classification.
- Each regional tournament will include a championship and consolation side with the winner of the championship side advancing to HOOPLA. Regional game times templates are available on the [SHSAA website](#).
- Regional tournament hosts will be named on March 16, 2026.
- Regional tournaments will be played the weekend of March 20 – 21, 2026.
- Schools interested in hosting a regional basketball playoff are invited to notify the SHSAA.

5A Classification:

- In 5A, Regina will advance 3 and Saskatoon will advance 2 teams to the provincial tournament.
- 5A rural teams will advance three teams from a regional tournament in 2026. Play-in games will be required for 5A Boys.
- Regional tournaments will be played the weekend of March 20 - 21, 2026.
 - 5A girls regional will be determined through a bid process
 - 5A boys regional has been awarded to Swift Current

NOTE: Basketball withdrawal deadline is February 11, 2026.

- ***Seeding forms (E-16) are due to the SHSAA office two weeks prior to the team's first playoff game (March 4 or March 11).***
- The SHSAA office requires written confirmation of season results from **ALL BASKETBALL TEAMS**. Include results of all games played (tournament, league, and exhibition) including who your opponents were and the result (win or loss).
- Please include your opinion regarding the seeding of the teams in your conference as well as your opinion regarding the top 8 teams in the province in your classification.
- Classifications requiring a play-in game will be required to submit by the first seeding form deadline (March 4th).

SHSAA PROVINCIAL BASKETBALL CHAMPIONSHIPS HOOPLA 2026

Hoopla 2026 will be held in Moose Jaw from March 26 - 28, 2026. The 5A boys and 5A girls preliminary games will be held on Thursday evening. All other classifications will begin play on Friday.

- **1A – 4A classifications:** The four regional champions will play a straight elimination, four-team tournament with a consolation side to determine third place.
- **5A classification:** There will be an eight-team tournament composed of three teams from Regina, two teams from Saskatoon, and three teams from the Rural regional tournament in 2026. The tournament will have a championship and consolation side.

All **finals** will be played on Saturday.
