A significant change in the RTP guidelines regarding Local Sport Organization (LSO) in house play was announced this past Friday, July 24th by Baseball BC and sent out to all Member Association Presidents

Since most associations have returned to play again, I had to actively communicate with representatives in regard to submitting player affiliation information, posting RTP guidelines/protocols and payments for the past few weeks.

- Here is the information I (Dave) received regarding umpires and their return to play plan for the minutes. This is just a rough guideline / Cole's notes and they are hopeful to have something completed by the weekend that they will share with me once completed.
- Umpires must show up to the ballpark in full uniform (minus plate gear)
- Pre-game conferences must take place accounting for social distancing requirements.
- In-game conferences must take place accounting for social distancing requirements. This may require the umpires to find a location on the field other than where these conferences have traditionally been held in order to avoid conflict.
- Umpires should carry hand sanitizer, to be used after each inning.
- Umpires must keep a physical distance of 2M between them and other umpires, parents, players, and coaches at all times outside of game action from arrival to the park, to leaving after the game
- Umpires must check in with the home team volunteer in charge of Event Attendees Tracking.
- The umpires must enter the field and head straight to their starting positions 5 minutes before game time, keeping 2M of physical distancing between them at all times.
- Balls and Strikes will be called by an Umpire located behind the mound.
- The second Umpire will be positioned in accordance with modified positioning protocols as put in place by BCBUA from time to time. Any such protocol will account for physical distancing requirements.
- Umpires will not handle baseballs. The home and visiting teams must each supply game balls for their team to use while on defense, and a different, sanitized baseball will be required after each ball is put in play.
- In Phase 4 of Baseball BC's Return to Play Document, Plate umpires will be allowed behind the plate, and may choose to wear a non-medical mask under their plate mask. Should Provincial social distancing recommendations remain active, umpires will continue to officiate games in accordance with modified protocols as put in place by BCBUA from time to time.
- Change rooms will not be used unless absolutely necessary and will be limited to the Plate Umpire putting on gear during Phase 4 of Baseball BC's Return to Play Document, if Provincial social distancing requirements are still active.
- Prior to each game, any league provided umpire equipment that is to be used must be sanitized by the home team coaches as part of their pre-game sanitization routine of dugouts, equipment, and high touch surfaces.
- In Phase 3, this includes any league provided indicators that the umpires will use to track balls and strikes
- Umpires are responsible for cleaning and sanitizing their own personal gear between each game.
- In Phase 4 of Baseball BC's Return to Play Guidelines, enhanced cleaning measures will remain in place. This includes all equipment including masks, chest protectors, shin guards, plate brushes, and indicators. Keep in mind that umpires may need to pick and choose from different sets for fitting purposes, so all needs to be done.
- Sanitization protocols in Phase 4 will be determined in conjunction with recommended health & safety
 guidelines in place at this time and may or may not be required. Further clarification should be sought
 when the sport officially enters Phase 4 to determine proper sanitization requirements."

- COVID-19 Specific Rules including a reminder that umpires will not enforce any of Baseball BC's COVID
 related safety rules, and are there in their usual capacity to umpire the baseball game;
- Remind coaches that baseballs are the responsibility of the team on defense;

- Coaches shall post lineup cards on the fence beside their dugouts, in case umpires need to reference them during the game;
- Inform coaches that umpires will have the ability to call a brief timeout if they feel the need to sanitize their hands during a half-inning;

- Baseball BC RTP "In Phase 2" Movement Alert July 24, 2020
- Effective Immediately, In Club Game Play is now permitted per Baseball BC Return to Play Guidelines.
- REMINDER: Clubs are to continue to abide by governing body and local government rules regarding any
- current COVID restrictions in place.
- Modified In-Club Play must follow the protocols laid out for game play Phase 3 of the Baseball BC RTP
- Guidelines. In addition,
- Only game play between teams from the same club (within a LSO) are permitted right now. No exceptions.
- Players and coaches may not approach any official to discuss or argue any call. They may ask for a count from their appropriate bench or on-field location.
- Selected reminders about modification in RTP Phase 3
- Physical distancing must always still be maintained outside of the regular course of game play (ie. batters or plays in the field).
- No plate meetings pre-game for lineup exchanges unless physical distancing requirements are adhered to.
- No mound visits by catcher or coach unless physical distancing requirements are adhered to.
- No post game handshakes.
- Clubs and/or teams should assign a safety and sanitation champion for each event to track attendance,
- assist in reminders about physical distancing and implement the ongoing sanitation needs and requirements.

- Baseballs need to be new or disinfected every time they are entered into play. Hand sanitizing should take place at the end of every half inning.
- Umpires must comply with physical distancing requirements and may need to use alternate positioning to comply
- Practices and training are still expected to follow all Phase 2 requirements and Guidelines as listed.
- Baseball BC does not have any additional information on viaSport and governments plans to permit movement
- to Phase 3 of our RTP guidelines at this point in time. Baseball BC's proposal has been forwarded from viaSport to the PHO on this topic. Baseball BC will continue to advocate for a safe return to continued programming for our members and their affiliates where it is deemed appropriate and will report to the group as soon as we know anything more on this possibility.
- As a side note, many associations are offering skills training only sessions or not currently offering team programming until the Fall of 2020 or waiting until 2021 Spring Season. It is Risk Management's Committee recommendation with the support of Baseball BC that any BCMBA association that currently does not offer traditional team programming 18U and lower start at Phase 2 RTP step one regardless of where Baseball BC is at in regards to RTP phases. These associations once back up and running 18U and lower start at the beginning of this in order to properly follow safety protocols and guidelines that have been set out. Safety of all is paramount and guidelines as set out may be in effect for some time and all players, coaches, volunteers and parents. All must understand the RTP guidelines, protocols and steps as laid out by Baseball BC and each LSO.
