

Carolina Courts Parent Code of Conduct

- **1.** Always act as a leader as your behavior and conduct inspires others and you directly and indirectly represent our organization.
- **2.** Do not draw attention from the players or cause distraction by becoming too emotionally involved in what's happening in the competition.
- **3.** Value the commitment of the coaches and your child by getting them to practice, games, and team events on time in the proper attire.
- **4.** Act in a respectful manner as nothing can be more embarrassing as a child seeing or hearing their parent using foul language or engaging in behavior that is unbecoming.
- **5.** Never disrespect an official or overly express your feelings regarding a call vocally or in any form of disrespect, being an official is not an easy task.
- **6.** Never demoralize any player on any team, whether it's your child, a teammate, or opponent; always uplift and encourage to help build confidence.
- **7.** If a situation arises in which you must speak with the coach, please do so at the appropriate time which is usually not directly before, during, or after a game unless it is an emergency situation.
- **8.** Never interfere with the duties and responsibilities of the coach or staff.
- **9.** Never act in any manner that is detrimental to the organization or your association.
- **10.** Always remember that games have winners and losers and learn to put that into perspective and remind your child of that as well. We may not win them all but as long as each individual involved is directing their full potential into what we are doing, we are winning.
