Annual Pancake Breakfast April 14

The annual Pancake Breakfast is Sunday, April 14, from 8 am to 12 noon. The breakfast consists of all-you-can-eat pancakes and syrup, plus scrambled eggs, sausages, orange juice, and a beverage. The price is great: Only \$7 for adults and \$5 for children 10 and under.

Our guests always tell us that while it's the delicious breakfast that brings them in, it's the drawings which keep them playing long after the food is gone. Besides the breakfast and raffles, there is entertainment by some of our arts students and on-the-hour school tours provided by students.

It's time to think about GOLF!!!

When we think "golf" at the Foundation, we think of several people. **Coach Bob Anderson** had tried to start a golf tournament for years, but was stymied by not finding any support or help. Then one day he ran into one of his former athletes, **Tim Martin** with his wife **Alanna**, and they joined with Bob to make his dreams a reality.

Fortunately some really fantastic alums also joined the plan: **Jeff Norblom**, who has become the biggest supporter of the tournament and **Tom Draper**, who has become the biggest "seller" of the tourney. Thanks to them and the rest of the 20+ members of the committee, it has become the second biggest money-raiser for the Foundation. Last year the maximum

number of golfers was reached; this suggests you should register early—especially since this year plans to be the best yet! The seventh annual tourney is scheduled for Sept. 20, and it's not too soon to get in your registration.

Once again Crystal Lake Golf Course in Lakeville is the site. There is a 12 pm shotgun start. The cost has remained the same, \$125 for golf, a cart, a prize, and dinner, where you'll be entertained by hilarious speaker Dick Janckowski. You can come in a foursome, threesome, twosome or as a single. If you cannot attend, you can still support RHS by just eating dinner or by sponsoring a hole, a wonderful chance to advertise for as little as \$150 or up to \$1,000. See p. 3 for more details.

Your money: 28 Grants awarded for projects in 18-19

This year the Foundation awarded \$36,524 in grants to staff for supplies, equipment, and experiences for Roosevelt students. Money is awarded based on applications received from staff, which are reviewed and evaluated by the Board before an award is made. Over \$70,000 was requested, and in most cases, the requests were difficult to deny. The Board considers the need, how many students are affected, how well conceived the proposed project is, and how many grants have been awarded to this area in the past. A recipient of a large grant last year might receive none this year. Also, money designated by a donor for a specific area is **ALWAYS** used as designated, so that also is considered when decisions are made.

When the Class of 1947 had some money remaining from their budget, they generously donated it to the Foundation, designating it for Field Trips. Thanks to their thoughtfulness, astronomy students were able to visit the brand new Bell Museum, seeing what teacher Dan Berliner called the amazing new planetarium and astronomy galleries (\$725). English students also attended plays (\$1,308), with the grant reducing the price each student paid.

Another science grant was for a field trip for Jennifer Halvorson's science students (\$568). RHS History Day participants have made the Nationals for several years, including this year, and will be awarded a small percentage of the trip cost (\$500), as the district no longer covers travel expenses for these academic competitive winners. Other field trips were to the Alliance Francais for French students and another to the Festival of Nations (\$3,015).

A grant was awarded to talented science teacher Colin Kilbane, who enjoys refurbishing computers as a hobby. Fortunately for the Foundation, he does not charge for his time, as he takes donated computers and refurbishes them for Roosevelt, using parts the Foundation has purchased (\$2,500). A bonus for all.

Arts are our most frequently designated donation. Grants were awarded for guitar strings for the music teacher (\$300), costumes and a resident artist for the dance class (\$1,450), and \$3,000 for the school plays, just an indication of how expensive plays are to produce, with costs for script rights, costumes, and materials for sets.

The second most popular designated donation is athletics. This year grants were awarded to football, gymnastics, volleyball and the weight room (\$6,125). Note: When you come to the Pancake Breakfast, note how all the football players and coach Adam Flanders are

supporting this Foundation activity. Additionally, the math department received \$3,287 for graphing calculators, now required for students taking ACT, PSAT and other mandatory tests.

Some years ago, the Minneapolis Public Schools eliminated Home Ec, removing and selling the equipment from the buildings. Fortunately, teachers, especially those of students of special needs, seeing the need for family living, cooking, and sewing experiences for their students, have stepped up, earned money, and, in many cases, sought donations, for equipment and supplies for their in- and after-school activities.

This year, thanks to a generous class donation from the Class of 1978, money was awarded ESL teacher Ben Rengstorf's Culinary Skills class. Grants for his and other home-ec-type activities, including those which went to Lifeskills., the French Club, and the Arab Club, totaled \$3,250. Sewing equipment was donated for a jobs skills group extracurricular project (\$144).

Construction teacher Catherine Ludowese and auto teacher Jacob Dayneko purchased equipment and supplies for their students (\$3,002). Remaining grants went to a film production, special projects, and a theater residency.

The staff and students thank all of you for your generous donations. When you make your donation this year, note that you may give where it's needed most, or designate your donation for an area of your own interest.

Students in the Culinary Skills Class give a "thumbs up" to the pico de gallo they learned how to make, using equipment provided by the Foundation grant. The teacher had also set up a funding page on the internet.
